

Ava Grace Fashions and Cupcaked: New Year, New Locations for Downtown Businesses

Out with the old, in with the new - or in this case, out of the old and into the new! Ava Grace Fashions has returned to downtown Ellicottville in the former location of Cupcaked, which has also moved... next door to 24 Monroe Street! Ava Grace owner Jessica Maynard-Gilbert couldn't be happier with the change, for not only is 22 Monroe Street a great location, it's also next door to one of her best friends. On December 22, Maynard-Gilbert and Cupcaked owner Annie Coe proudly opened the doors of their new locations and began the next chapter of their businesses and their friendship.

Ava Grace Fashions began as an online shop in the attic of Maynard-Gilbert's garage. It wasn't long before her selection of women's fashion, accessories, shoes, and gifts caught on, and Ava Grace opened its first brick and mortar location at 8 Washington Street. The business outgrew another Washington Street location before Maynard-Gilbert moved to the building she bought at 23 Jefferson. "I loved having the boutique inside a house and all the cute little rooms," she said, "but I feel like some of my customers didn't like it because it didn't feel like a commercial space - it felt like someone's house. Some people loved the homey feel, and others were turned off by it.'


When Cupcaked owner Annie Coe approached Maynard-Gilbert about moving into 22 Monroe, she jumped at the chance. "Annie was in need of a bigger space for a bigger kitchen, and when she gave me the opportunity to move in 22 Monroe Street where she started in Ellicottville, I took that opportunity." During the week of December 19, Coe was moving Cupcaked out the front door and Maynard-Gilbert was moving in at the same time. Speaking of the move, Maynard-Gilbert said, "It was a whirlwind! I'm so thankful to my husband, Bill, and my parents for helping me move in. Betsy from Betsy's Consignment helped, and so did Jenn from Jennifer Powers For Hair. It was a team effort!'

Since moving into the new space, business has already picked up, and Maynard-Gilbert is thrilled to be downtown working next door to her close friend. "Annie and I became friends because we're both really active with the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce," Maynard-Gilbert explained. "Annie's original training and business are in event planning - she has so many really fresh, fun ideas. I also have a reputation for wanting to try new things! We met through working together on a few events. She's a great person - a great businesswoman. I'm a very big fan of Annie as a person and Cupcaked as a business. But we're not just business friends... we're true friends.'

The mutual support of Maynard-Gilbert and Coe is a gift in its own right but also a reflection of the Ellicottville business community as a whole. "The biggest thing I can say about Ellicottville in general is that with every single move, it doesn't matter that I move because all of the other shop owners and employees - if they hear a customer say, 'I was going to go to Ava Grace, but they must have gone out of business,' will respond, 'Oh no, they just moved!' The support of the business community in that way is amazing." According to Maynard-Gilbert, there's a recognition that there is plenty of business to go around, and the greater variety of businesses means more traffic to Ellicottville. "It's the 'rising tide raises all boats' type of attitude as a community that has been really supportive of Ava Grace and all the different moves," she said.

No matter how often you enjoy a cigar, Smoke & Savor - a cigar pairing event hosted by Susan Baryza, owner of she shed, he shed - is the perfect occasion to try something new. In the words of Baryza, "There are no bad cigars, just better ones." Find yours on Friday, January 20 at 6:00pm during Smoke & Savor at Ellicottville's Silver Fox Steakhouse.

Baryza is looking forward to the return of this event, which she introduced last March for the first time. New York state allows businesses to host a limited number of indoor smoking events per year through special licensing. Once again, the upstairs area of the Silver Fox, located at 23 Hughey Alley, will be the setting, an ideal location, according to Baryza.

"This time, things will be a bit more casual," she explained. "Rather than everything happening primarily upstairs, people can go downstairs, get some drinks, visit with people at the bar. The smoking will be upstairs in a relaxed environment."

Baryza added, "The Silver Fox is the perfect place to have dinner afterwards! I'm grateful to the owner, Michael Nickolson, for allowing us to use this space once again."

The January 20 event offers even more options this year. "There are different packages this time for people who like different kinds of drinks, and packages for people who don't drink," she explained. "Everyone is different, so why have just one package for so many people?"

Guests can choose a non-alcoholic package for those cigars that pair well with coffee or cola. The wine/beer option includes cigars that pair well with light beer and oaky wines. For whiskey or bourbon drinkers, the spirits package includes a Maker's Mark, a Jim Beam, or a cocktail to pair with your cigar.


For Baryza the fun of the event is also the learning experience it provides for her guests and herself. "In the past, we've had some long-time cigar smokers who are there for the cigar experience, and we've also had guys who have less experience but are there to try something new and get together with some friends," she said.

These indoor smoking events also help Baryza learn more about the industry. "It helps me learn the process," she explained. "With every event, I'm learning more about what people are looking for, what's new, and what seems to be really popular."

About a week or two before the event, Baryza contacts her wholesaler Phillips and King out of California to order cigars specifically for Smoke & Savor, based on the package options selected by her guests. "They're great to work with and very accommodating," she noted. "They get me everything I need! I'll also have items available to purchase at the event."

Registration for Smoke & Savor is open now (must be 21 years of age or older to register). "People can stop in she shed, he shed to register or call us at 716-699-9121," said Baryza. Located at 22 Washington Street, she shed, he shed is open from 11:00am-5:00pm Sunday through Thursday (closed Tuesdays) and 11:00am-7:00pm on Fridays and Saturdays. 

## YEAR IN REVIEW

#### A LOOK BACK AT 2022, WITH AN EYE ON THE FUTURE

Let's sum up this past year in three words: Community, Adventure, Advocacy. From new business relationships to outdoor recreation to fundraising efforts of all sorts, it's safe to say that 2022 was full of activity that made quite an impact on so many living and working in our corner of western New York. As we close out the year, let us reflect on just a few of the great accomplishments, additions and positive outcomes that certainly deserve recognition...

#### WINTER RECREATION

Holiday Valley continues to be a powerhouse in capital improvements, and with an eye on the future, they began the process of replacing the 4-person Mardi Gras Express with a new 6-passenger chairlift. Phase one, completed this past summer, saw the installation of foundations for 11 new lift towers. Phase two will see the dismantling of the current lift and construction of the new lift during the summer of 2023, with completion in time for HV's November 2023-24 ski season opening.

"The new Mardi Gras 6-pack will give skiers and snowboarders an exciting new experience, with quicker access to the top of the mountain," Dennis Eshbaugh, Holiday Valle GM, stated during the announcement originally made last January. "Consistent with the other chairlifts at Holiday Valley, the new Mardi Gras lift will be manufactured by Doppelmayr USA based in Salt Lake City, Utah. The chair will have the capacity to deliver 3,000 people per hour over a length of 4,300 feet and 700 vertical feet up to the top of Mardi Gras. Once the new Mardi Gras 6-pack is in operation, Holiday Valley's total uphill capacity will be 25,650 people per hour."

Following a 2-year hiatus (thanks a lot, Covid), The Boardroom Snowboard Shop brought back the Boardroom Banked, transforming Holiday Valley's Champagne slope into a banked slalom course with 8 high-octane turns where competitors put their skills to the test in a timed format to validate the fastest riders. And while the competition aspect of the event is appealing, the Boardroom Banked really isn't about winning and losing. Instead, it's about cultivating a scene and making sure that snowboarding in Western New York continues to thrive.

Additionally, the Boardroom Banked acts as a fundraiser, with the 2022 proceeds being donated to P.U.N.T. Pediatric Collaborative, a nonprofit that provides families in Western New York facing pediatric cancer with programs that offer financial, practical and emotional support in their time of need. P.U.N.T. has been chosen as the repeat beneficiary for the 2023 event, which is scheduled for March 5. Follow @boardroomeville on IG to keep tabs on details as they are released. No doubt competition spots will sell out again.

#### **SUMMER RECREATION**

On the flip side of seasons, Holiday Valley proudly announced their new Head Golf Professional of their Double Black Diamond Golf Course. Kyle Benish took over the position in April, replacing PGA Master Golf Pro Steve Carney, who remains a PGA Ambassador for Holiday Valley. Benish started as Holiday Valley's first Assistant Professional in 2004 and has been a PGA Class A Member since 2010, culminating in 2019 when he earned his designation as a PGA Certified Professional.

Over at HoliMont, they've unleashed a whole new meaning to "hot laps". During the spring and summer months, crews continued building on the well-received downhill mountain bike park, which celebrated a successful second year in operation. The park's footprint expanded with a number of new trails, and additional bike carriers were added to the Sunset lift for quicker access to the top.

But who says mountain biking is only for the summer months? HoliMont introduced a Dual Slalom Bike Race in April - a head-to-head format complete with snowboard race gates and banked turns. The bracket style elimination saw a good crowd, and plans are already in the works for the 2023 course, along with a downhill fat bike race in February.

The Ellicottville Skatepark project, which has been in fundraising mode since 2019, saw its vision begin to take form. Working alongside the Village of Ellicottville, the SK8EVL committee raised the maximum match through The Skatepark Project/Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, totaling \$550,000 to apply towards the construction of a permanent, concrete skatepark that when completed, will be available to the public at no charge. Located in the Ellicottville Village Park, reputable skatepark contractor Grindline broke ground in June and will finish the project in Spring of 2023. Watch for details on the grand opening in this publication.

Speaking of public outdoor recreation, the Ellicottville-Great Valley Recreation Trail made some headway in their fundraising efforts. In partnership with Steelbound Brewery & Distillery, a new craft beer was launched, dubbed Trail Ale. A portion of Trail Ale sales was donated back to the EVGV Trail, a project that has been in the works since 2012. When completed, the EVGV Trail will link hikers, bicyclers and cross-country skiers on a paved trail system spanning from Ellicottville to Great Valley. Learn more at evgvtrail.org.

#### **NEW ON CAMPUS**

Before the start of this school year, Ellicottville Central School announced the addition of a School Resource Officer. Appointed by Ellicottville Police Chief Don Auge, Ellicottville Police Officer Amber Graham attended SRO training before starting her duties. Kids entering ECS on the first day of school were welcomed by Officer Graham who is providing law enforcement, education and first responder services on school grounds each day that school is in session, through 2024.

Speaking of school, a mission has been set by local restauranteur Nick Pitillo to raise the necessary funding needed to replace the stadium lights on the Ellicottville Central School football field. Pitillo, who's family is deeply rooted in the history of ECS football, launched the Frank Pitillo Memorial Lighting Fund just before Thanksgiving and is making continued progress, however, he still has a long ways to go.

"Many of you may not know this, but the lights over the Ellicottville Central School Football Field were put up in honor of my late brother, Frank Pitillo, in 1977," explained Nick. "Frank was a world class athlete that was doubling up his junior and senior year of high school so he could begin his training with the U.S. Ski Team, when he was killed in a motorcycle accident. The entire town, led by my father Mike, and my mother Joan, John Northrup, Mark Ward, Bob McRae, and so many others, rallied together to raise the funds to light the field in his honor. I vividly remember being held up by my dad, in my little league football uniform, to throw the switch on the lights for the very first time."

Fast forward many years later (44 years to be exact), and those lights are in dire need of attention. In true Pitillo fashion, fundraising efforts are underway and off to a strong start, with just over \$45,000 already raised of the \$250,000 needed to move forward. Want to learn more? #### **BEST IN SHOW**

Tri-County Arts Council Announces Winners of 'A Little Something Small'





OLEAN - The Tri-County Arts Council is pleased to announce the winners of the "A Little Something Small," the third annual juried small works show, which is taking place now in the Peg Bothner Gallery, located at 110 W. State St. in Olean.

Now in its third year, the TCAC's Small Works Show features more artists and pieces than ever before, and according to Sean Huntington, exhibition coordinator, this year's selection is incredible. "Every year, this has grown," he said. "In the first year, we had approximately 100 pieces, and in the second year, we had 130. This year, we have almost 150 pieces and the quality is amazing - these artists just keep topping themselves!"

Winners were selected by Sean P. Conklin, Assistant Curator at the Regina A. Quick Center at St. Bonaventure University, from 146 works of art created by 46 member artists. The award winners are:

- Best in Show: Melissa Locke for "Mask on Fire",
  Best Professional Artist: Barbara Fox for "Daisy Still Life" (pictured, left)
  Honorable Mention, Professional Artist: Ed Green for "Horsehair Raku"

- Best Amateur Artist: Denise Schneider for "Flow" (pictured, right)
  Honorable Mention, Amateur Artist: Beverly Amborski for "Morning Mist"
  People's Choice Award (selected by audience vote): Noah Howard for "Queen of Doom"

Each award winner will receive a cash prize and a year's Artisan Membership, which allows the artist the opportunity to sell in the TCAC's Artisan Market.

From now until January 14, the public is invited to view more than 140 pieces of artwork submitted by over 50 different artists from Allegany, Cattaraugus, and Chautauqua counties. Each piece is available to purchase in person or online at www.tricountyartscouncil. org, and a portion of each sale supports the arts council.


Artwork ranges from watercolor, gouache, oil painting, photography pottery, jewelry, sculpture, stained glass, and more. Each participating artist submitted one to three pieces of artwork under 12"x12", and some have already sold out. 

#### ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIPS

I have worked very hard inside and outside the academy, and learned my body is much stronger than my mind. It hasn't just strengthened me physically, but it has also built my confidence up immensely."

Since 2014, the Krieger scholarship fund has made possible over \$20,000 in scholarships for young adults pursuing careers in law enforcement.

Students from Portville Central School, Randolph Central School and Franklinville Central School joined thirteen other districts in participating in the recent Animate! Animation classes offered through CA BOCES and RIT.

As a part of the partnership, customized animation has been offered to component school districts over the past two years. CA BOCES is currently working with several regional school districts on various projects that include animated versions of administrators and mascots, character education animated story lines, and other custom pieces. MAGIC Spell Studios, LLC is the entrepreneurial and commercial heart of MAGIC at RIT. Encompassing a fully functional film sound stage, sound mix and color correction post-production studios, a 4K Dolby Atmos theater, and several working media laboratories, MAGIC Spell Studios and their student and faculty talent have been working on various custom projects in local districts.

CA BOCES District Superintendent, Scott Payne, said he continues to hear positive feed-back from school districts on the animation programming and class opportunities. "Each time we meet, more and more districts are joining in with an animation project or participation in a class," he said. "We are pleased to offer this unique programming to our component districts."

CA BOCES Information Technology Director, Michael Graf, said he has been pleased with program development and with the new course offering. "Over the past two years, our animation department and our partnership with RIT faculty and student teams has allowed us to offer animation on a broader scale to our component districts, and to see it grow and expand in this new way is quite exciting."

CA BOCES Technology Team Member and program coordinator, Jessica Golley, said that the class was developed based on feedback from regional school leaders. Core Performance Fitness was born out of frustration for the status quo of personal training in a big gym setting where other members and activities create distractions.

#### New Attraction in Ellicottville Demonstrates the Healing Power of Crystals





signage. The trail system consists of several loops of varying skill levels: Short Circuit Loop (1.5 miles - easy); Inside-Out-Loop (1.5 miles - more difficult); Ledges Loop (1.6 miles - more difficult); Boo-Boo's Delight Loop (1.1 miles - more difficult) and Thundershower Trail (4.1 miles - most difficult).

During the winter you can experience the solitude and beauty of the 10.5-mile Kinzua Valley Trail for hiking or cross-country skiing. Located along the banks of the scenic Kinzua Creek, the surface is crushed limestone. A trail head can be easily accessed from the village of Westline, or traveling south from Rt. 219, turn right onto Westline Road, watch for the signage and the red roof of the wooden covered bridge for trail access. From Kane, travel Rt. 321 north, near Red Bridge Campground, watch for the trail head signage. Difficulty level is moderate.

#### **KNOX & KANE RAIL TRAIL**

There are two sections of the Knox & Kane Rail Trail currently open for winter cross-country skiing and hiking in McKean County. Plans for late fall in 2023 include trail construction which will link these two sections of trail.

The Mount Jewett to Kinzua Bridge Trail (MJ2KB) is a 7.5-mile section of trail from the Kinzua Bridge State Park to Lantz Corners. The trail head parking is at the state park at 296 Viaduct Road in Mt. Jewett, PA. A second trailhead is located behind the Borough building in Mt. Jewett off Route 6. The MJ2KB trail is open for equestrian, snowmobiling, mountain biking, and cross-country skiing. Difficulty level is easy.

The Trail Association of the McKean/Elk Divide (TAMED) trail begins across from Kane Country Club, traverses through Kane, and then extends south to Lamont, PA. This 8-mile trail is open for mountain biking, hiking, and cross-country skiing. The surface is compacted crushed limestone. Trailhead parking is along Route 6 beside the old Knox & Kane Depot.


