





OVER 100 ANIMALS IN NEED

Catt. County SPCA Looking for Animal Lovers to Foster or Adopt; Can You Help?

What does love look like? Walking through the door and being pounced upon by a flying furball or a wagging tail. Sitting to take your shoes off and finding a face with doleful eyes planted on your lap. A paw on your knee or a soft kitty on your shoulder. Slurpy wake-up kisses or a cat on your face.

Face it, when we adopt a pet, we do change their lives, but we have no choice but to change our lives as well. The agencies that gather up these unwanted animals do yeoman's work trying to find them purrfect forever homes. They get their medical needs taken care of, inoculations up to date and give them the love and care they need until they can be re-homed. But, being public agencies, they must comply with all state and county regulations.

It seems that agencies like the SPCA are not exempt from the long arm of the State of New York's governing body. The Cattaraugus County SPCA is under the gun to come into compliance with the new rules imposed upon them by the State of New York. As with most new rulings, they are often precipitated by need and even abuses by some agencies which operated outside of regulations. As a result, the Cattaraugus County SPCA, along with every other animal care agency in the state is required to make the necessary changes to come into compliance. That being the case, the agency has almost 150 animals that need re-homing, even in temporary foster quarters if permanent forever homes are not found for them by the end of this year.

New York State passed the Companion Animal Care Act, which goes into effect December 2025. This comprehensive legislation requires all shelters to adhere to strict guidelines on kennel and cage sizes, floor coverings, ventilation, noise/decibel levels, outdoor spaces and a host of other design, safety, and animal welfare considerations. These requirements will necessitate major remodeling or the rebuilding of shelters across New York State - and the Shelter for the SPCA in Cattaraugus County on Route 16 in Olean is no exception.

Karen Crowley, the President of the Board of the SPCA in Cattaraugus County stated, "The State legislation is great for animals but is a major challenge for shelters. The SPCA in Cattaraugus County must have vacancy to serve animals in need and to provide services to the county - while preparing for the new requirements."

Part of the program is to call for more volunteers. Dr. Shaun Smith, who is assisting in this major animal adoption/re-homing campaign says, "Volunteers are critical in two ways: (1) They provide extra love to the animals through interaction, and (2) They use their personal connections throughout the county and beyond to find forever homes for the dogs and cats. Volunteers will be the key to re-homing many of the dogs and cats when construction at the shelter commences."

The SPCA will be sponsoring several programs in various communities in the next few weeks, bringing some of their furry ambassadors to acquaint people with the SPCA and, hopefully, to be adopted. There will be the Black Friday Sale at the Shelter on Friday, November 24 from 1:00-4:00pm. The "Home for the Holidays" float in the Greater Olean Chamber of Commerce's Santa Claus Lane parade on Friday, November 24 starting at 6:30pm and the Pet Supplies Plus Adoption and Volunteer Recruitment event on Sunday, November 26 from 10:00am to 4:00pm.

Some departments have crafts like stringing necklaces that the kids can keep or creating candy cane baskets. Just a bunch of little fun things that visitors can enjoy.

Many of our staff plan to dress up like characters to take photos with instant cameras so that anyone who wants, can take a memory home with them."

Imagine the excitement when the little ones find Santa and Mrs. Claus on scene to greet them, as well as the much loved Frosty the Snowman. They'll be joined by Buddy the Elf and Tinsel the Walking Christmas Tree!

Once you've worked up an appetite between the various crafts, games and photo shoots with all the characters, you can sit down with a nice hot cup of hot cocoa and dive into some delicious cookies.

HERE COMES SANTA CLAUS!

Greater Olean Chamber Shares Road Closures and Parade Safety Tips



OLEAN - The ever-popular Santa Claus Lane Parade in Olean, NY is the official kickoff to the holiday season in the area in which Santa and Mrs. Claus light thousands of lightbulbs in the skylines, snowflakes and stars in downtown Olean. The parade is set to take place this Friday, November 24th at 6:30pm at the intersection of Delaware Avenue and North Union Street.

Paul Brown Motors and Toys 4 Tots will be teaming up again this year to collect as many toys as possible. Last year's Toys 4 Tots campaign helped many children in the Olean area. Look for the Paul Brown Motors and Toys 4 Tots pick-up truck on East State Street between Lincoln Park and the City building to drop off your unwrapped gift for a local child.

Chamber officials have invited area residents to judge this year's parade: Paula Snyder, Jamestown Community College; Paula Bernstein, Tri-County Arts Council; and Max Bullers, Olean resident. The judges will be located in a Close's Lumber truck on North Union Street near the Times Square intersection. Winners will be announced the night of the parade.

Eight awards will be presented in the following categories:

- The Blitzen Award, sponsored by the Times Herald, will go to the most photogenic float or unit.
- The Seasons Greetings Award, sponsored by Milestone Financial Strategies, will go to the best newcomer to the parade and one that typifies a welcoming theme. (This unit must be a first-time entrant.)
- The Rudolph Award, sponsored by National Grid Co., will go to the float with the most or best use of lights.
- The Snowflake Award, sponsored by the Street Classics Car Club, will go to the unit with the most participants in the parade.
- The Angelic Spirit Award, sponsored by Mandy's Flowers, will go to the most spiritual/religious float or unit.
- The Elves Award, sponsored by Owl Homes Group, will go to the float or unit that best typifies the holiday through the eyes of a child.
- The Jingle Bells Award, sponsored by Cayas Canopies, will go to the best theatrical (music/dance) float or unit.
- The Sleigh Award, presented by Nick Shembeda Plumbing, will go to the most decorated larger truck (fire truck, flatbed, utility vehicle, etc.)

Delaware Avenue will be closed to traffic at 5:30pm with North Union Street closing to traffic at 6:15pm. The City's downtown parking lots will be opened and free to park. The City Building's restrooms will be opened the night of the parade from 5:30-8:00pm. Extra uniformed personnel from the Olean Fire and Police Departments will be on hand. Lost children should report to the Chamber office. The parking spaces along BOTH SIDES of North Union Street from Route 417 to Delaware Avenue will be closed to any parking vehicles at 4:00pm. Cars, trucks, etc. will be allowed to park back along these spaces after 8:30pm. Also, the detour route will be First Street from Wayne to Henley as well as East/West Henley from South First Street to South Barry Streets. No parking will be allowed along the detour route as well. Olean Police Chief Ron Richardson stated, "Please parents have your family members stay up on the curbs on Union Street as well as off the medians and roundabouts - they are not to be used for viewing the parade."

The Rotary Club of Ellicottville has also supported students in the Ellicottville Central School district by providing scholarships, school supplies, lunch programs, travel, and special projects for those in need in the district. This year, they also resumed their annual youth Halloween Party.

"The goal of the Rotary Club of Ellicottville Fund is to allow the club to receive tax-deductible donations that allow it to continue and bolster its impact in the community," said John Weismantel, club president. "There are numerous groups and individuals with many and varying needs, and we [the club] are dedicated to helping these people in every way we possibly can."

The fund will help to bolster the club's impact by creating a financial reserve in support of its fundraising efforts. The goal of the fund is to continue elevating the important role of service clubs at a time when their support is most needed.

All parade units (firetrucks, trucks, trailers - any vehicle driving in the parade) have to enter the staging area by entering the Olean Center Mall entrance from North Union Street. Parents dropping off children to be in a parade unit, please enter the same route at the mall and head towards Key Bank.

The Parade is scheduled to begin at 6:30pm on Friday, November 24th near the Burger King on North Union Street in Olean. The parade will stagger and use both sides of the street. WPIG-FM will be the official emcees of the parade and will announce the parade line-up at their official emcee stage area in front of the Olean Municipal Building. All parade participants must have a waiver signed and Chamber officials ask that all waivers be handed in by Nov. 24th to the volunteers at the parade staging area.

As Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce considers the roadway, North Union Street, to 'Santa Claus Lane' during the holiday season, it's pretty neat to note the song's origin, "Here Comes Santa Claus." It is a Christmas song originally written by Gene Autry. Autry got the idea for the song after riding his horse in the 1946 Santa Claus Lane Parade (now the Hollywood Christmas Parade) in Los Angeles, during which crowds of spectators chanted, "Here comes Santa Claus". 




