APRIL'S SOLAR ECLIPSE IS COMING; LET'S GET PREPARED!

Picture this: It's Monday, April 8, 2024. You've just finished lunch and the sky goes dark. Did you fall into a food induced coma and sleep through the rest of your work shift? No, it's just the total solar eclipse, the first one visible in the U.S. since August 21, 2017. This year's phenomenon has been dubbed the Great North American Eclipse.

It's kind of a big deal, right? So we should probably look into when we can see it, how to view it without going blind... you know, just a few details that are probably pretty important for everyone to know.

For those of us here in Western New York, the timing we should be focused on per NASA is the Buffalo time slot. Totality of the eclipse is to begin at 3:18pm. To safely view the eclipse, a pair of eclipse glasses or a solar handheld viewer is needed. Please do not look directly at the sun.

especially at night - individuals in recovery can achieve a level of wellness that is crucial to sobriety and recovery. Beyond cliché notions of "feng shui," Anderson said that design includes more than furniture arrangement and paint color. It's about waking up in an environment that is comfortable and safe. "All of these factors aid in everybody's wellness, and we're going to be building with that in mind," he explained. "Even the units we build for the resorts, they're all going to be developed in the frame of mind of wellness... It's where I want to take this, and I want to be able to bring this to as many people as possible if they're sick or not. I think everybody has a right to wellness."

Anderson said that the project is still in the design and development phase, as he, Robinson, and Erie County officials are working on the size and the number of people who will occupy these units (ideally a maximum of two each). He anticipates the units will be ready by the end of this summer.

"We have our plans to use this as a pilot project and develop similar communities in other places," said Anderson. "Our objective is to develop a system where the next one is going to go in Dunkirk where we have land available, in Jamestown where we have land available, and maybe even in Olean because they're right here." Anderson is enthusiastic about the possibilities of these pocket communities and added that "if we can develop this correctly and we develop the right system, we would love to take this nationwide. There are a lot of subsidies that are necessary, obviously, but I really think we have a shot at affecting positively the lives of many people."

Anderson noted that this is a very large-scale community effort and over the next few months, "We will be very active and looking to partner up either financially or logistically and looking for more people to be involved in this campaign."

BE PREPARED

The Great North American Solar Eclipse is Coming!

Picture this: It's Monday, April 8, 2024. You've just finished lunch and the sky goes dark. Did you fall into a food induced coma and sleep through the rest of your work shift? No, it's just the total solar eclipse, the first one visible in the U.S. since August 21, 2017. This year's phenomenon has been dubbed the Great North American Eclipse. It's kind of a big deal, right? So we should probably look into when we can see it, how to view it without going blind... you know, just a few details that are probably pretty important for everyone to know.

WHAT IS A TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE?

Let's start here. A solar eclipse is a phenomena that occurs when the moon passes between the earth and the sun. In the case of a total eclipse, the moon's apparent diameter is larger than the sun's, blocking all sunlight and turning the day to darkness. Totality (or highest peak of moon blocking sun coverage) will occur in only a narrow path across the earth's surface while the surrounding regions (up to thousands of kilometers wide or 3,000 miles away) will be able to see a partial eclipse. (So if you are in one of the regions that gets to view the eclipse in all its glory, you're lucky!)

WHAT'S THE DESIGNATED PATH?

Okay, this is a lot. While researching the apparent path of the Great North American Eclipse, I found that the totality will be visible in a narrow strip of the Pacific Ocean, passing roughly 200 nautical miles north of the Marquesas Islands (French Polynesia) ascending in a northeasterly direction through Mexico, the U.S., Canada and finally ending in the Atlantic Ocean. Since we're in the U.S., that's the section I'll focus on, but if you want the full trajectory of the path, you can visit the wikipedia page.

In the United States, totality will be visible through the states of Texas (including parts of San Antonio, Austin, and Fort Worth and all of Arlington, Dallas, Killeen, Temple, Texarkana, Tyler and Waco), Oklahoma, Arkansas (including Morrilton/Petit Jean, Hot Springs, Searcy, Jonesboro, and Little Rock), Missouri, Illinois (including Carbondale, where it intersects the path of the 2017 eclipse), Kentucky, Indiana (including Bloomington, Evansville, Indianapolis, Anderson, Muncie, Terre Haute, and Vincennes), Ohio (including Akron, Dayton, Lima, Roundhead, Toledo, Oak Harbor, Cleveland, Warren, Newton Falls and Austintown), Michigan (extreme southeastern corner of Monroe County), Pennsylvania (including Erie), Upstate New York (including Buffalo, Niagara Falls, Rochester, Syracuse, the Adirondacks, Potsdam, and Plattsburgh), and northern Vermont (including Burlington), New Hampshire, and Maine, with the line of totality going almost directly over the state's highest point, Mount Katahdin.

For those of us here in Western New York, the timing we should be focused on, per NASA (eclipse path on page 14), is the Buffalo time slot. Partial eclipse is expected to begin at 2:04pm (EDT), totality to begin at 3:18pm (EDT), and maximum peak at 3:20pm (EDT). Totality is expected to end at 3:22pm (EDT) and the partial will end at 4:32pm (EDT).

"This show will definitely be one for all ages to enjoy," said Barb Pump, Executive Assistant of the Ellicottville Chamber. "My 10-year-old son, Grayde, watched a video of Marc Martel back in 2019 and said, 'Mom, the Chamber should bring him to Summer Music Festival!' So after meetings and discussions, it was voted upon that Marc Martel was a great choice for this event. We always strive to give the best experience to concert goers for this event and this year will be no different. We look forward to having another exciting Summer Music Festival!"

FUN FACTS

The largest city entirely in the path of the eclipse will be Dallas, Texas. It will be the second total eclipse visible from the central United States in just 7 years, after the eclipse of August 21, 2017. Totality will pass through the town of Wapakoneta, Ohio, home of Neil Armstrong, the first man on the moon. The maximum number of eclipses (of any variety) is 5 per year. This will be the last total solar eclipse visible in the contiguous United States until August 23, 2044. (That's a long time to wait for a second viewing!)

WHY IS THIS ECLIPSE SO SPECIAL?


Obviously it's the first and last eclipse in so many years, so that should make it special enough for you, but April's solar eclipse is a little bit different. The last great American Eclipse in 2017 was when the sun's activity was approaching a minimum (it got a little burnt out and needed a break... *crickets*) and because of this, at the moment of totality, it was possible to look briefly at the convergence with naked eyes. This year's eclipse is happening when our sun is at the peak of its activity cycle. (So not only isn't this one even a little safe to look at without the proper viewing equipment, but it could also effect our communication/navigation satellites that orbit our planet or even mess with our power grid operations right here on the surface.)





Cattaraugus County Offers the Beauty of Friendship for Veterans

We're coming out of another fabulous holiday season. No matter what you celebrate, those few weeks at the end of the year are magical. It's the perfect time to be with loved ones and celebrate the new year to come. The holiday season doesn't last forever, and my mom would say that's both a blessing and a curse. I begrudgingly trudged back to my college campus after a very merry Christmas. But why does this theme of togetherness have to come and go? Why can't those three weeks of love and support last all year round? Well, in Cattaraugus County, it certainly does, all while supporting those serving our country in the community.

The Cattaraugus County Dwyer Veteran Peer-to-Peer Program provides veterans and their friends and families a space to come together to "fight isolation and loneliness," says Liz Conner, a Navy veteran and co-facilitor for the Dwyer Program in Cattaraugus County. This not only provides activity and togetherness for the whole community but also helps veterans combat PTSD and other mental illnesses developed from their time serving. I recently connected with Liz, and she told me how this all came about downstate back in 2012.

In Suffolk County, New York, Joseph P. Dwyer's parents noticed something. Being home on leave from combat, Dwyer's family noticed his deep struggle with his mental health and well-being. That was until his parents brought some of his 'battle buddies' around, or friends made while serving, and saw Dwyer begin to return to his normal self. When he finished serving, Dwyer returned to that dark place, demonstrating characteristics of PTSD and struggling with drug abuse.

That's when Joseph P. Dwyer's family pushed for Suffolk County to adopt the 'peer-to-peer' concept that had helped him so much in the past. Years later, the Dwyer Veteran Peer-to-Peer program now exists in every county in New York.

The idea of veterans struggling with feelings of post-traumatic stress after serving in the military is not new, and Dwyer's family was able to identify a solution in connecting veterans with other veterans to help catalyze open communication and a space of "non-judgmental open communication," says Liz. She also proudly runs the women veterans' branch of the organization, focused on empowering female veterans using the same peer-to-peer values.

So, how exactly does the Dwyer program bring people together? In Cattaraugus County, fun-filled community events are the name of the game. This past year, they notably held a veteran's breakfast, an open skating event, and of course their monthly game night.

Upcoming is the annual wine walk being held in historic downtown Olean, NY in the Union Street/Lincoln Park areas, where guests can taste local flavors and enjoy the spring air. Though the walk isn't until May 4th, tickets will be available ting April 1st at the "Early Bird Special" pricing of \$30. The link to purchase will be posted up on their Facebook page and website starting that day. This deal runs the first two weeks of April. If you purchase tickets any time after that, they will be the normal price of \$35. (This is a 21 or older event.) 



Brantley Gilbert's "Off The Rails" Tour Coming to Seneca Allegany Resort & Casino in Salamanca

Coming onto the music scene when he headed to Nashville as a songwriter in 2007, he found himself playing local venues until he released his debut album in 2009 titled, *"A Modern Day Prodigal Son"*. Having released six albums, with his most recent being *"So Help Me God"* in 2022, he has garnered several number one hit songs such as "Country Must Be Country Wide", "You Don't Know Her Like I Do", "One Hell Of An Amen" and "Bottoms Up".

Winning the Academy of Country Music's New Male Artist in 2013 solidified his contribution to country music. In 2013 he toured with the USO for eight days to entertain our troops in Italy and Kuwait.

The singer has had some big time "Whose Who" of the country_music world collaborations with Thomas Rhett, Justin Moore, Toby Keith, Blake Shelton, HARDY, Vince Gill and Jason Aldean.

For his fifth album, "Fire & Brimstone" he recorded a duet with Lindsay Ell called "What Happens In A Small Town", which was something new to him as far as recording and writing with a female country artist. We talk about that in the following conversation.



A Conversation with Brantley

HULICK: Your tour will be making a stop at Seneca Allegany Resort & Casino in Salamanca, NY on February 10th. It seems most of the artists I've interviewed have some sort of "Buffalo connection". Have you played the Western New York area in the past? Do you have a Buffalo connection? **GILBERT:** Oh yeah, I think we've been all over New York by this point. I don't think I have a Buffalo connection, but I always look forward to making my way to the area on tour.

HULICK: You've toured with some heavy hitters like Eric Church, Tim Mc-Graw, Thomas Rhett, Kenny Chesney, Kid Rock, Willie Nelson and most recently this past summer with Nickelback. What was the best advice you got from any of these artists? GILBERT: I think one thing I learned from them is that you set the tone for

the tour with your attitude. If you go into it thinking, "Man, I've gotta be out on the road for x-number of days," you kinda tire yourself out before you've even started. Keep the positives top of mind and remember, it's a privilege to be able to do what we do for a living.

HULICK: Do you have any advice you'd like to pass on to the up-and-coming artists?

GILBERT: Do your best to stay true to yourself, no matter what happens. You're the one that has to live with those decisions down the line, and if you follow your gut, you'll be just fine.

HULICK: You've collaborated with the likes of Jason Aldean, Blake Shelton, HARDY and Toby Keith to name a few. Is there anyone you would like to work with that you haven't?

GILBERT: There's not really one person that springs to mind. When I'm writing and recording, I try to do my best to serve the song as it takes shape, rather than writing it with a specific person in mind. The best collaborations happen organically that way, when you know there's a certain voice that would complete it or take it to the next level.

HULICK: You did a duet with Lindsay Ell on the song, "What Happens In A Small Town." Any thoughts of doing more duets in the future? **GILBERT:** For sure! That was my first duet with a female voice on the track,

and I really loved sharing that with Lindsay. She's got an incredible voice and she's one hell of a guitar player.

HULICK: You are a singer/songwriter. It has always fascinated me how songwriters do what they do. Can you tell us a little bit about your writing techniques... do you carve out a specific day or time to write or is it more

spontaneous? Are you one of those writers that jot down any ideas that pop up in your mind at 2:00am that you work on down the road? **GILBERT:** Probably a little bit of both. I'm a big fan of collaborating, and I typically host or go on a couple writing retreats every year with some of the folks I enjoy working with, usually with a wild card or two thrown in. We'll work on ideas that we jotted down since the last one, but sometimes a song just comes out of a conversation outside of the writer's room. That's how "Heaven By Then" came about – we were all just sitting around talking late "Heaven By Then" came about – we were all just sitting around talking late one night, and it just evolved from there.

HULICK: Do you have any new projects in the works? **GILBERT:** I'm pretty much always writing, but I've been back in the studio working on something special, and I can't wait to be able to share more!

HULICK: Do you have a message for your fans that will be coming out to see you February 10th in Salamanca?

GILBERT: Get ready to get a little rowdy and have a whole lot of fun! We're pulling out all the stops on this tour, and I think BG Nation will love what we've got in store.

With the ski season battling climate change, it might be time to consider a different pastime. All of you ski bums should consider becoming trout bums if you haven't already. The fly fishing season is longer, it's more universal and best of all, the mind set is still the same. I suppose tele-skiers are the most likely to put away their boards and pick up their rods. After all, "free the heel, free the mind" - the rhetoric of the free heeler - is the same as that of the fly fisher, "It's not the fish that we're after" to paraphrase Henry David Thoreau!

Fly fishing is truly a sport of all ages! The fly rod is equally at home in the hands of the Miss or the Mister, the child or the grandfather, the doctor or the farmer. Fly fishing is beautiful, like an Olympic rhythmic gymnast performing with their ribbon; the fly fisher performs with their fly line, forming graceful loops in the air or more relatable to some, like the telemarker creating a sensation on the slopes with a series of graceful bent knee turns.

The fly fisher combines the endless summer with the endless winter, a non-stop pursuit of the tailing redfish or wintering steelhead. When you can't get out on the water you pass the time at tying bench waxing your thread to create the perfect duping loop. There is always something to do to soothe your soul and please your mind. The danger is not to become an addict, obsessed with perfection that so many succumb too. Moderation is the secret to contentment!

Fly fishing takes on a whole new dimension when your start using flies that you've designed and created yourself on those long and cold wintery nights by the fire. The satisfaction is euphoric and completes you! The only thing that tops tricking a trout into taking your delightful presentation is serving it with a hand crafted bamboo fly rod, the quintessential moment in any trout bum's dream.

Conditioning like in all sports plays an important role in enhancing one's enjoyment and safety. The fly fisher can't simply satisfy the soul and the mind, the body also has to be taken into consideration. After all your body is your vehicle to get to the contest, the game between you and your scaly competitor. The venue can be literally a walk in the park or it can be as challenging as climbing Everest. The degree of your physical fitness will determine where you can do battle, on your terms or his, on the most remote stretch of wilderness rarely if at all visited by a human soul or by the car park! Fly fishing is a complete sport and the complete angler is in top form!

The game plan, the strategy that the fly fisher has to devise is best based on ones skill and ability. Planning keeps the mind sharp and fit! Knowing where to go, when to go and how to get there is sometimes as much fun as being successful in your quest. Anticipation is a really underrated component in fly fishing, after all, that's why it's called fishing and not catching. You'll never be disappointed when you are anticipating; it's the one time everyone is always 100% successful! Cherish your time to dream and plan, whether you're rich or poor it's the ultimate equalizer.

Therapy - another reward when you go fly fishing. I can't say its free, fly fishing costs money

Imagine going for a massage, relaxing and soothing; well in fly fishing, your masseuse is the water! Wading out into a river and being surrounded by a pulsating current gently massaging your legs and buttocks is pleasure in itself. Choosing to correct flow goes back to the planning, fish like the perfect current as well, so when it's just right you're both content. The definition of a tall tale has no

If there ever was a fountain of youth it's the retelling of all the tales that flow from your mind of when you where younger, whether by a day or a decade. The past is a miraculous thing - it never gets too old, just older! Some of the worst trips that I had the misfortune to be on were immensely successful because of two important factors, the anticipation and afterwards, the story telling. Story telling is the great fixer. Your mishaps or successes are equally entertaining to the listener, the juicier the saga the more mouth watering it becomes! Ironically enough we'll find humor in it all! Everyone will end up with a good laugh even if it's the last one!

HOW DO WE VIEW THE ECLIPSE SAFELY?

The whole threat of blindness from staring at the sun is no joke on the day of a solar eclipse. Except during a very brief total phase of a total solar eclipse, when the moon completely blocks out the sun, it is not safe to look at it directly without specialized eye protection specifically for solar viewing. If you try to look at the sun though a camera lens, binoculars, a telescope or the naked eye, without a special purpose solar filter secured over your optics, you will instantly (as in right then and there) suffer severe eye injury (and possibly, actually go blind. So I'd personally avoid this.)

In order to avoid what I can only assume seems like a bad time, you should look into picking up a pair of eclipse glasses or a solar handheld viewer. Please note that eclipse glasses are not regular sunglasses. It doesn't matter how dark a pair of regular sunglasses are, they are not even a little good enough to stare at the sun. Eclipse glasses are actually thousands of times darker and must comply with ISO 12312-2 international standard. (DO NOT USE THEM with cameras, binoculars or telescopes. Those items require different types of solar filters and you should always seek expert advice before attempting to outfit your own equipment with a solar filter.)

And remember that just because it is dark outside, doesn't mean you aren't still standing under direct sunlight in the middle of the day. Remember to wear sunscreen and other appropriate outdoor attire.






