



HoliMont to Host a Fun Day to Benefit Roswell Park Cancer Center

Combine the desire to help support cancer research at Roswell Park Cancer Institute with your love for skiing/snowboarding and the natural beauty of the HoliMont Ski Club from 9:00am-4:30pm on Thursday, February 16 at the inaugural Ski 4 A Cure event, presented by the Ski Club of Lockport (SCOL).

Inspired by The Ride For Roswell summertime cycling event, SCOL board member Tom Doran of Amherst created a day centered around outdoor winter activities - where all members of the family would have the chance to participate and have fun together, regardless of ski/snowboard ability.

"We're really looking forward to a unique event," Doran said during a recent conversation. "We've planned an entire day's worth of fun activities with the goal of bringing people together in a beautiful winter setting for this great cause."

The \$100 ticket for the Ski 4 A Cure fundraiser includes a lift pass, catered lunch, snowshoe/x-country skiing, a fun race, scavenger hunt and much more. The fun day officially begins at 10:00am with a colorful costume parade of cancer survivors, friends and families, all skiing and snowboarding together down the main hill at HoliMont.

"I saw a fundraising event like this at the Vail ski resort in Colorado," Doran said. "It's called "Pink Vail" - it's a big festival with thousands of people all wearing pink and having fun to raise money for their local hospital out there."

Parade participants will be urged to wear colors that represent the kind of cancer they were treated for and the plan is for the entire procession to start at the top of Exhibition Run and work its way downward like a rainbow-colored snake, in a serpentine pattern that will not only be fun to be part of, but should also be great to watch for spectators in the chalet at the bottom of hill. SCOL members will be staffing the various activities that are planned throughout the day all over the ski area.

#### OTHER EVENTS OF THE DAY

The 'Bombardier Ball Drop' is sure to be a fan-favorite event, as it will allow participants to "purchase" numbered balls that they will then drop from the chairlift (hopefully accurately) as their chair passes over a basket down on the hill. Prizes will go to the best "bombardiers" of the day.

There will also be a self-timed race, where competitors will be allowed two timed runs down a slalom course. The winner(s) of this contest will be those skiers or snowboarders who come closest to matching the times of their two runs. Being the fastest in this race will not necessarily win you the prize!

The two-day event begins Thursday, February 23 from 6:00-8:00pm at Mud, Sweat n' Gears, where former US Ski Team member and Blizzard/Tecnica Marketing Director Leslie Baker-Brown will lead an educational discussion about the Women 2 Women Project and all things skiing. "Leslie has been in the ski industry for almost 35 years now and is a pioneer in developing women-specific ski products," Reading noted. The project's goal is to teach female skiers about women-specific ski equipment that will enhance their skiing experience and make them better skiers. This casual evening will give guests the opportunity to meet Leslie, learn about the importance of being in the right gear, and enjoy drinks and light refreshments.

The event continues Friday at HoliMont, where Baker-Brown and other representatives from Blizzard/Tecnica will be doing a private on-snow demo for participants. Reading explained, "There will be up to 40 pairs of Blizzard skis for women to demo. Participants will also have the opportunity to ski with Leslie and other Blizzard/Tecnica representatives. There is a light lunch and an apres party with raffles and giveaways." The event is limited to 40 participants and is filling up fast with many of last year's participants returning. "It's a really nice way for female skiers to get to know each other and become part of this wonderful community," Reading added.

Reading, who has been skiing her whole life, is all too familiar with the challenges of being in a historically male-dominated industry. "Basically, smaller skis with a women's graphic on them was about the extent of female skis," she said, "but in the last 23 years that my husband and I have owned Mud, Sweat n' Gears, the advancements in women-specific equipment have been incredible. We have an entire section in the store dedicated to wom-en's specific ski equipment... a category that continues to grow every year."

Another component to Leslie Baker-Brown's Women 2 Women Project is the Hilaree Nelson Education Scholarship, which supports women in their pursuit to further their education and expertise in the ski industry. According to Reading, "I'm thrilled to announce that Mud, Sweat n' Gears employee Hanna Lee was one of 30 women nationwide to be awarded this prestigious scholarship," said Reading. "Leslie is all about women being involved in the ski industry - whether you're working in a ski shop, on the hill, or behind the scenes."

300 skiers/snowboarders to HoliMont for the day and are quick to point out there will be fun activities going on throughout the day, even if you don't ski or snowboard at all.

HoliMont will have snowshoes available for those who choose to navigate the great outdoors without the thrill of slipping or sliding their way down a steep slope. Cross-country skis will also be available with miles of beautiful wooded trails, all waiting for you to explore at your own pace.

Lee grew up in Syracuse and started working at Mud, Sweat n' Gears nine years ago while still a college student. "I've been to boot fitting schools and there are only ever a handful of women attending," she noted. "It's become increasingly important to me to get as much education as I can to help more women in snowsports be more comfortable and find the right gear for them."

Lee went through the extensive application process in which she answered several questions about her history in the ski industry, why she is drawn to it, and what she'd do with the grant money. While still deciding which educational opportunity she'd like to pursue with her award, Lee is confident in her goal, which informs her career as a full-time member of the staff at Mud, Sweat 'n Gears. "It's important to me for women to feel comfortable in an industry that's often dominated by men," she said. "Seeing a female working in a ski shop provides comfort in a process that can be intimidating. There are a lot of women who aren't aware that there are skis and boots designed specifically for them, and it's really cool to help women go through that process and experience - really see the difference that the right gear can make."

Lee, who was part of last year's Powder to Prosecco event, is looking forward to the camaraderie of skiing with Baker-Brown and other women skiers again. "It's a whole different environment than a mixed gender group," she said. "It truly builds this amazing community of female skiers. I love that!"

#### 2023 SCHOLARSHIP PROCESS OPEN

Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation Now Accepting Applications



OLEAN - The Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation's 2023 scholarship process for will open to applications from area students on February 1. Students can apply using the online scholarship portal at cattfoundation.org/apply-for-scholarships. "The CRCF scholarship program has been one of the Foundation's largest areas of growth over recent years," said CRCF Executive Director Karen Niemic Buchheit. "To support so many of our area students as they go on to next chapter of their lives is a true embodiment of our Foundation's mission to 'Grow Good' and improve the lives of those in the Cattaraugus region."

New awards this year include: Dennis Jones and Wayne Johnston Memorial Dice Run Scholarship - for a student graduating from either Olean High School or Archbishop Walsh-Academy who will be attending a 4-year college planning to study business or a business-related field of study. Brian O'Connell Sr. Memorial Scholarship - for a graduating senior of Olean High School who will be pursing an education-related academic major and is involved in community service. Sondra J. Fox Scholarship - for a student from Cattaraugus or McKean County who is pursuing a career in the mental health field with first preference for a student in a master's level program and second preference for an undergraduate college student who will be entering his/her junior or senior year. Major fields include, but are not limited to, counseling, social work and psychiatric nursing. Terrence and Judith Mark Scholarship - for students graduating from Franklinville Central School/Ten Broeck Academy who will be attending a 2- or 4-year college. Students must have an overall GPA of 80% or higher and an overall GPA of 85% or higher in English. 

#### **GROWING GREENER**

The Allegheny National Forest Celebrates its 100th Year Anniversary in 2023

The Allegheny National Forest will be sharing and celebrating its 100th Year Anniversary with the public during 2023.

On September 24, 1923, the Allegheny National Forest(ANF) was established. The ANF is the only National Forest in Pennsylvania. The Forest, now one hundred years later in 2023, is a success story of regeneration and regrowth.

#### THE DOWNFALL OF A FOREST

In 1923 these lands looked vastly different. This area in northwestern Pennsylvania was commonly referred to as the "Allegheny Brush Pile." The trees had been clear cut by timber companies to meet the demands of a growing nation. Lumber was needed for cabins and barns. In 1840, a circular saw could process 10,000 board feet of lumber per day. The tanning industry was also a major forest industry in Pennsylvania, and it required large quantities of hemlock bark for the tanning process.

During the 1900's, the Allegheny Plateau, once a thriving forest of mostly beech and hemlock, with abundant wildlife, now had low deer counts, and was almost barren. Large landowners simply abandoned the land and moved west in search of new forests. The bare soil left after the logging caused floods, and wildfires were a constant danger.

It was the Weeks Act, passed by the Federal Government in 1911, which changed this story into a success story of regeneration. This act of Congress allowed for land in the eastern states to be purchased for the establishment of National Forests.

#### A MAJOR COMEBACK

The new forest grew quickly and by the 1940's the forest was primarily second growth. As reforestation took place, many of the older species were replaced by black cherry, red maple, and sugar maple. This change in species helped to fuel the local economy. The local black cherry timber is considered the finest in the world for making fine furniture.

There are now approximately 80 different species of trees in the Allegheny National Forest. This diversity is what provides the amazing fall colors of bright yellow, red, and orange. The hillsides, once barren, are now once again a vibrant growing forest with trees as far as one can see.

One area to experience existing old growth forest is along the hike to Hector Falls. Parking for the fall is approximately two miles down a dirt road, which starts in the town of Ludlow. At the end of the trek you will find a waterfall which plummets from a rectangular shaped rock face. The area has a lost world type of feeling. GPS coordinates are 41.6853 -78.975067.

Wildlife has also returned. A special research area on the ANF and nearby lands is the Kinzua Quality Deer Cooperative which is based on the science of quality habitat for quality deer.

It was after World War II when families first discovered the joys of camping and outdoor recreation on the National Forests. Today, the ANF has over 3.7 million visitors annually on its 514,029 acres, with camping and cabins, fishing, boating, hiking, biking and mountain biking, plus ATV and snowmobiling trails. In all, there are over 600 miles of multi-use trails. It is now often remarked that the Forest is "so big, so green."

#### YEAR-LONG CELEBRATION

To mark the Centennial of the Forest a variety of stories, outreach at events, and planned activities will be held throughout the year to celebrate this amazing story of regeneration and recovery.

One upcoming event is the Full Moon Walk on Friday, February 3 from 5:30-6:30pm. Guided by the light of the moon, this will be a family-friendly exploration of the Moon and life in the forest. The Moon Walk will begin at Timberdoodle Flats Interpretive Parking Lot, along Route 59 in the Allegheny National Forest. It is suggested you wear your hiking or winter boots, weather appropriate clothing, and bring along a flashlight. For additional information on this event please call 814-363-6000. This young woman is joining the ranks of the young entrepreneurial whiz kids in this community who take life by the horns and decide that they want to drive their own bus, be their own boss, and start their own business. Rachele has established her own brand-new business, Sunshine Pilates by Rae. Rachele is a STOTT Pilates instructor who specializes in Neurological Pilates, Injury Rehab and Athletics. She is offering one-on-one sessions inside Core Performance Health & Fitness Studio, 30 Bristol Lane, Ellicottville, NY.

Pilates can be a great exercise for older adults or those recovering from injury due to its low- impact exercises and subtle movements. There are many forms of Pilates. The main difference between them is the type of equipment used. Rachele offers all types of Pilates (mat, chair Pilates, injury, rehab, barre and neurological conditioning) and a program on the Reformer machine. Reformer Pilates is a form of exercise that shares the principles of centering, concentration, control, precision, breath, and flow with traditional classes.

Webmd tells us the following: "Some studies have shown that Pilates could help with weight control as well as increasing core strength to improve stability, improve posture, increase flexibility, and ease lower back pain. Pilates is also a valuable tool for physical rehabilitation. In one review of 23 studies, 17 studies found that Pilates reduced pain and disability in individuals with a variety of conditions, including back pain, neck pain, sco-liosis, and multiple sclerosis. Pilates is not an aerobic exercise. But it can reduce stress, which does benefit the heart. In most cases, Pilates is safe for pregnant women, seniors, and children. Beginners should learn with the help of a certified Pilates instructor."

Now, as Paul Harvey used to say (go ask your parents or grandparents who he was) here's the rest of the story: Rachele isn't just a health fanatic who decided she likes Pilates and getting certified to teach it would make a fun business opportunity in a town devoted to athleticism and health. Although that may be true, here's the part of the story that tells you how she got here.

Today, Rachele Dove is a 34-year-old young woman who has been teaching Pilates for 10 years, after she first went to workout in a Pilates studio 12.5 years ago... as a form of rehab following a massive stroke at age 21. Now, this stroke took her out, big time. She couldn't speak. Couldn't move her right side. Couldn't walk. Couldn't swallow and needed to be tube fed. To top it off, she couldn't even smile her sweet, beautiful smile. This twen-ty-one-year-old Olympic hopeful was a snowboard instructor at Whistler, B.C. with plans to go to Vermont in the fall of 2010 to try out for the Olympic team.

But, in June 2010, her destiny changed in an instant.

This young aspiring athlete became a victim of her own body. Instead of being surrounded by healthy strong young athletes, she became surrounded by therapists - speech, physio, occupational, kinesiologists and she underwent treatments from seeing a nutritionist, swimming, hyperbaric oxygen treatments and more. Of course, her friends and family were with her the whole way.

Her mother started a blog to update people and took a leave of absence from her job. They all got to work, with Rachele at the helm. Instead of a snowboard she had a wheelchair, braces, and every other kind of equipment to get her back in the game. She fought like the devil was on her heels and worked diligently to outrun him. In two years, she was back up on the boards, and later riding her bike on unforgiving terrain, acquiring a few bumps and stitches along the way.

She was teaching Pilates even though she hadn't quite relearned the art of speech, crediting her clients with patience as they learned how to read her cues as she taught them. And today, Rachele invites you - especially if you are rehabbing, recovering, or rebuilding your body to train and recover with her guiding you along, because, after all, she has "been there, done that."

Remember I said that you sometimes you meet someone and you know right away that someone is a keeper? Hope my story helps you to understand why I felt that way when I first met Rachele.
