Mud, Sweat n' Gears Brings Women2Women Event Back to HoliMont

Now in its third year, Powder to Prosecco is returning to HoliMont for an exciting two days of education, skiing, community, and fun! Mud, Sweat n' Gears owner Kim Reading is looking forward to celebrating the camaraderie of women skiers with Leslie Baker Brown, three-time NCAA All American, 1982 NCAA GS Champion, Middlebury Hall of Famer and the global leader of Blizzard Tecnica's Women 2 Women Project. The fun kicks off Thursday, February 22nd at 6:00pm at Mud, Sweat n' Gears and continues all day on Friday, February 23rd at HoliMont.

The program begins at Reading's store with a relaxed information session. "On Thursday night, we have wine and cheese for the ladies, and Leslie comes in and talks about the Women 2 Women program and the new equipment from Blizzard Tecnica," Reading explained. "It's a great little social gathering afterwards where the women can talk to Leslie directly."

So what exactly is the Women 2 Women project? Founded in 2015, Women 2 Women is a global Blizzard Tecnica program whose mission is to create "a diverse and engaged community of female skiers and outdoor enthusiasts by being a trustworthy and credible source for product, education and inspiration." In addition to being the global leader of this program, Leslie Baker-Brown is also the North American marketing manager for Blizzard Tecnica. "She's one of the only female product developers in the industry," Reading noted. "She's sort of like the pioneer behind women-specific skis... She kind of broke through that glass ceiling and is very well known in the industry for developing women-specific products."



The program provides annual opportunities for women to apply for scholarships to further their education in the snowsports industry. One of last year's recipients was Hanna Lee, who has worked as a boot fitter at Mud, Sweat n' Gears for 10 years. This scholarship gave her the opportunity to attend ski boot fitting school in Waitsfield, Vermont just this past September. "I've been able to use the skills I worked on at boot school to help me become a better boot fitter at MSG," said Lee. "That training definitely helped me become a little more confident in selling and fitting ski boots!"

Lee's learning opportunity wasn't limited to her boot fitter school experience, though. She explained, "For the past three years, Leslie and her colleague at Blizzard Tecnica, Sam Tischendor, have spearheaded a series of women's boot fitting Zoom meetings, which I have participated in. It's a great way to meet and talk to other female boot fitters in the ski industry. Sam is a clinical sports podiatrist and works as a boot fitter in Telluride, Colorado so she has a lot of knowledge and experience as a female boot fitter. She and Leslie make a great team and are doing an excellent job of reaching and connecting women in the industry."

Powder to Prosecco is the perfect event to connect with this incredible community of women, and Reading invites all women - regardless of ability - to join in! After Thursday night's gathering, participants convene at HoliMont from 10:00am-3:00pm for a full day of demos and skiing. Baker-Brown and local Blizzard women ambassadors will be demonstrating the award-winning collection of women's skis from their 23/24 lineup. "What made the Women 2 Women program famous was the Blizzard Black Pearl 88, so we'll have those on-hand, but then they also have a new ski," Reading explained. 




FROM IRELAND TO ELLICOTTVILLE

A Kiss on the Blarney Stone Results in Whimsical Mother/Daughter Art

Several months ago, you read in this paper about a book by local authors Katie Benatovich and Charity Burlingame, *Power Poems for Giraffes*, illustrated/designed by Carey Ann Welch and Neal Steward. From now through March, you can see more of Carey Ann Welch's work, along with delightful pieces by her nine year-old daughter, Simone Zella Phillips, inside the Ellicottville Memorial Library entryway. Prepare to be enchanted by their wonderful, whimsical presentations grouped around the walls honoring both Ellicottville and its famous ski culture, and the joy of being imaginative, joyful, hopeful, and maybe even a bit quirky.

Having an interest in the importance of kids enjoying education, Carey Ann started early teaching her daughter art since Simone was practically born, with a crayon in her hand. Like the book Carey Ann helped illustrate, her art focuses on how art makes one feel. Intentional or not, one cannot help but feel joy and lightness when looking at their combined works.

Called "Painted Winter" (Simone's idea), their presentation features "glittering-snow-in-spired-art". They are certainly in the right place to love snow as they both do, catching the magical sparkles of falling or fallen snow enhanced by the bright, crisp blue winter sky. We here in the Southern Tier are so accustomed to our environment that we often take it for granted. Carey Ann and Simone give us a gentle nudge to stop and enjoy all the beauty, playfulness and magic that surrounds us. Hailing from Dubuque, Iowa near the great Mississippi River, Carey Ann was accustomed to snow, but was amazed at what happens in snow country when we are visited by a Great Lakes driven lake-effect snow event.



I suppose it was inevitable that Carey Ann would be in touch with whimsy and magical mystery and unknown enchanted forest creatures. You see, per her bio, she was "made" in Ireland the day her parents risked life and limb to lean over and kiss the Blarney Stone. Those of you who have traveled to the Emerald Isle with Bobby McCarthy and possibly have kissed the Stone can surely appreciate the grit and mysticism involved in that ritual. To begin with, kissing the Blarney Stone at the top of the castle is said to give one the gift of gab, which might explain Bobby McCarthy. But it is not

for the faint of heart. One must dangle down headfirst (used to be without safety bars which are now in place) and give it a smack. Carey Ann's viewpoint was surely meant to be.

Carey Ann's mom was an artist and her dad was a storyteller who grew up on a farm and told wild tales of fictitious (but believable to the child, Carey Ann) animals. She comes by all this talent quite naturally. Her mom, Ann, would give 4-5 year old Carey a brush as she was working a garden piece for example, and would encourage her to draw little animals onto the piece. It took no time at all for this budding artist to get bitten by the bug, which she then, fittingly, passed onto her child who also has an artist mother and writer father.

So, the beat goes on. Interestingly, Carey Ann's mom was a southpaw, who are known to often be very artistic (think Michelangelo, DaVinci, Klee). Both doodlers, Carey Ann says Simone is the better of the two. Doodling is also a form of art (think Dali, Jackson Pollock, along with famous people like Marlon Brando and Queen Victoria), so these local doodlers are in great company. And they are willingly sharing their unique talents with us.

Carey Ann's mantra, "Kindness Rules", seems to have been handed down to Simone, as illustrated in her fine work. Having gone to the University of Fine Arts in Northern Iowa, Carey Ann keeps refining her work as time passes. Simone loves her art teacher at school and participates online in a Kids Cartoon Academy, honing her skills and developing new techniques in 3D clay and cardboard design.

Carey Ann currently works at HoliMont in Customer Service and has had her hand in designing stickers and coloring pages for the young skiers when they come in for breaks. She loves her work there, loves her art, and loves Ellicottville. Quite a love affair, indeed.

Be sure to stop in at the Ellicottville Memorial Library on Maples Road to see their work. It is best described in this quote from Carey Ann: "Paintings created at the intersection of humor and imagination. Inspired by freedom in vivid dreams and childlike imagination, I adore creating images that have yet to be seen. Blending the absurd with the known is an intoxicating and humorous process. My art is impishly sprinkled with hope, humor and surprise."



Their treatments included a bath house in the basement, fresh air, and a good diet. They also used light bath therapy, which is like a modern day tanning bed. Stepping into the building almost feels like stepping back into the 1800s. You can book special events, private investigations and ghost tours by visiting their website at wildwoodsanitarium.com.

February 17th's event is made for couples. The cost is \$75, which includes dinner, historical tour, investigation time and sleepover for two people. (That's a spooky good deal!) Dinner will feature pasta with your choice of red or white sauce, side dishes and non-alcoholic beverages. All you need to bring is yourselves, a flashlight and anything you need for a comfortable evening away from home.

The event will begin with a historic tour of the property. The tour will be hosted by the current owners of the sanitarium, Brooke Przystal and Zachary Przystal. They will guide guests around the location and talk about the full backstory of the facility, along with sharing paranormal experiences associated with the sanitarium. They will also include details of the restoration that has taken place and future restoration plans.

Then it's on to the fun part - the investigation! (Time to put your ghost hunting pants on!) The investigation during the event will be hosted by volunteers that help care for the property and have a love for Wildwood. Guests will be led through all four floors of the building with various pieces of paranormal equipment that can be seen on all the ghost hunting shows. Core Performance: Drinking Pop

In my last article I shared how processed and "ultra-processed" foods were a major contributing factor to our nation's obesity and declining health. This week I wanted to zero in specifically on pop.

Pop, like all things, can be enjoyed in moderation. And while it's pretty common knowledge that soda isn't the greatest for your health, what really happens to your body when you drink pop? You may have seen various videos online showing how soda can be used to clean pennies, create soda-bottle volcanoes when paired with Mentos mints or even corrode metal. And according to a 2021 article published in Preventing Chronic Diseases, 63% of adults in the U.S. drink pop at least once per day.

According to the CDC, drinking pop frequently is associated with weight gain, obesity, type 2 diabetes, heart disease, kidney disease, non-alcoholic liver disease, tooth decay, cavities and gout. Additionally, adults and adolescents who drink pop frequently are more likely to have less healthy behaviors, including smoking, not getting enough sleep and more screen time. The following three health concerns were so glaring that I decided to focus this article primarily on them.

1. Chronic pop consumption rots your teeth: Drinking pop is associated with tooth decay (dental caries), enamel erosion and tooth loss. Anything really acidic and anything with a lot of sugar can cause tooth "rot". Pop is quite acidic and usually has high amounts of sugar, which gets turned into lactic acid by plaque and microbes in the mouth and starts to dissolve the teeth.

In addition to damaging your teeth, pop can also impact your oral hygiene in several ways, including changes to saliva and gums. "Saliva plays a crucial role in oral health, as it helps to neutralize the acid in your mouth and wash away food particles and bacteria. However, drinking pop can decrease your saliva production, making it harder for your mouth to fight off harmful bacteria," says Ankit Patel DMD at 24/7 Dental. "Also, the sugar and acid in pop can irritate and inflame your gums, leading to swelling, bleeding, and even gum recession. If left untreated, gum disease can result in tooth loss and other serious health problems."

- 2. Pop contains flame-retardants: Some popular pop brands, including Mountain Dew, use brominated vegetable oil - a toxic flame retardant - to keep the artificial flavoring from separating from the rest of the liquid. This hazardous ingredient (sometimes listed as BVO on soda and sports drinks) can cause bromide poisoning symptoms like skin lesions and memory loss, as well as nerve disorders. If that's not a good enough reason not to "Do the Dew," I don't know what is.
- 3. Drinking pop makes you a lab rat: Many American pop brands are sweetened with high-fructose corn syrup, a heart-harming man-made compound derived mainly from genetically engineered corn. The problem? Genetically engineered ingredients have only been in our food chain since the 1990s, and we don't know their long-term health impacts



because the corporations that developed the crops never had to test them for long-term safety. Case in point: Some recent findings suggest that genetically engineered crops are linked to digestive tract damage, accelerated aging, and even infertility!

Pop impacts your insides by damaging your oral hygiene, irritating your stomach and changing your gut microbiota. Because of its high added sugar content, it can contribute to a myriad of health problems associated with high added sugar intake, including metabolic syndrome, diabetes and cardiovascular disease. Enjoying a pop occasionally can be refreshing, but drinking it frequently/daily is associated with adverse health effects. If you're craving pop but worried about the impact on your health, consider a healthier, lessrisky alternative, such as flavored seltzer, kombucha or sparkling tea.


