A NEED FOR MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

Bob McCarthy Foundation & Interfaith Caregivers Partner to Establish Loan Center



ELLICOTTVILLE - The Bob McCarthy Foundation is excited to announce a partnership with Interfaith Caregivers Inc., an Olean based 501c3 Foundation.

For the past year, the Bob McCarthy Foundation has been working on establishing a Seniors help program in Ellicottville. According to Kathleen Moriarty of the Bob McCarthy Foundation, "We have met with many organizations and individuals to understand the current services provided and real needs in our community. Transportation services, medical equipment needs, internet access and support for hearing and sight impaired were the critical needs identified.'

This investigation, along with a review of available services, led to discussions with Interfaith Caregivers Inc. who provide these services in Allegany, Cattaraugus and Chautauqua Counties. Julie Hall, their Executive Director, commented, "Servicing this wide area through a single location in Olean was not optimal. In fact, Interfaith has been looking to expand their services via a satellite location in Cattaraugus County."

Interfaith Caregivers have been providing these services for over 40 years and have all of the systems and logistics in place to provide an easy program rollout in Ellicottville. All services offered through Interfaith Caregivers are free of charge thanks to the generous contributions from their donors as they do not rely on any government funding. Julie felt Ellicottville would be the perfect location, so after an in-depth discussion, a mutual agreement has been put in place.

In December, the Bob McCarthy Foundation approached Ellicottville Mayor John Burrell about using a vacant office inside the DPW building. John, recognizing the benefit, presented the idea to the Village Board who unanimously endorsed it.

The 17 Mill Street location will require storage systems and some renovations to be funded by the Bob McCarthy Foundation. Mark Chudy and his crew have already cleaned up the building as the partners are targeting March for a soft opening of the facility. The Bob



Olean Business Now Offering Farm Fresh Delivery Service

For anyone who has ever been disappointed by the ending of farmer's market season, Light Work Farm has recently introduced a solution that bridges the gap between the end of one season and the start of another! Last month, Light Work Farm officially launched their Olean Farm Fresh Delivery Service, which brings over 100 local and regional farm products right to your door. Owner Stephanie Beneng is thrilled to offer a service to provide Olean area residents with fresh food while helping local farmers do more business year 'round.

Beneng has been a part of the Olean Area Farmers Market for several years and developed many strong relationships with participating farmers. She explained, "I spent a lot of years getting to know the farmers there, and we're always talking about where customers are gravitating toward and what changes we need to make to try to reach more people." She noted that local farmers were missing out on the local delivery trend, which inspired Beneng to try a delivery service "even at the smallest scale." She said, "I just had to see what the demand is and see if we can get people's interest that way. It's very exciting to be just jumping in and giving it a try!"



In December, Beneng did two trial runs of the delivery service and officially launched it at the beginning of January. Currently, the service receives more than a dozen orders per week, and most of those orders are repeat deliveries to happy customers. "It's really exciting, especially for the farmers who are participating that don't have any access to markets whatsoever during the winter," she added.

So how exactly does the delivery service work? Customers living in the Allegany, Hinsdale and Olean zip codes can order online via the GrownBy website or app: https://grownby.app/farms/Ci6rKF1zSEIAduj9iBvx. However, anyone can place an order for local pick up at Canticle Farm in Allegany. Orders must be placed before midnight on Sunday nights for delivery (\$7) or pick up (free) the following Tuesday. "I can't say enough good things about GrownBy as a platform," said Beneng. "It is a cooperatively owned, farmer-owned platform, so their whole goal is that we're all in this together and design this in a way that's going to work for all of us."

Customers can choose foods from a variety of vendors, who may be familiar faces from the Olean Area Farmers Market. Products include baked goods from the Savage Wheat Project, grassfed beef from Mascho Homestead Farms, cheeses from God's Country Creamery, dried beans from Genesee Valley Bean Company, kale, parsley, and mustard greens from Canticle Farm, root vegetables from Dirt Rich Farms, and more. While Light Work Farm typically offers fresh in-season produce, customers can preorder tomato plants and fruition seeds from Light Work Farm now via the GrownBy app.

Beneng said the response from her customers has been overwhelmingly positive. "The customers are thrilled with it," she said. "I think that that's a long six months to go without any easy access to local, fresh food. The more customers that are having a positive experience, the more we're going to slowly build from that because it's mostly word of mouth that makes people want to try something new."

For Beneng, access is key when it comes to providing residents with fresh food options. "One of the most important things to me is being able to reach more people who don't have access to transportation. That's something that I think about a lot in my role as manager at the farmers' market and at times when I've been a vendor," she explained. "I'm always so aware that the market is only open for five hours on a Saturday, and how many people are there that work on Saturdays that can never come and how many people are there that can't get there that quickly?"

Speaking of access and options, Beneng is pleased to share that GrownBy is the only platform where farmers can accept Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits online for free. "My account just got its approval this past week," said Beneng. "I'm really looking forward to being able to accept SNAP benefits electronically for these orders."



Interfaith Caregivers will handle all incoming calls, client evaluation, equipment recommendations and set up appointments for pick-up.

They have an established protocol and procedure with medical personnel who identify the need and suggest the proper supplies and/or equipment needed by our clients. The partnership will handle distribution to the Ellicottville Loan center, taking care of equipment maintenance, sanitation and transportation to the local loan center.

"We will initially start with the Medical Loan Center but intend to add their RSVP transportation services in short order as we put a volunteer network in place. The vision and hearing loss services dovetail well into what the Bob McCarthy Foundation already provide locally. We will be soliciting local volunteers to help us provide the best possible services in our community." ELIGIBILITY: Frail, elderly, health impaired, and sight impaired individuals are eligible.

SERVICE AREA: Allegany, Cattaraugus, & Chautaugua Counties.

TELEPHONE REASSURANCE AND ADVOCACY REFERRAL: For lonely and/or homebound residents in the community, not otherwise served.

TELE-HEALTH ROOM: Southern Tier Health Care System Inc., in collaboration with CASA-Trinity, has added a new tele-health room located at Interfaith Care Givers on West State Street providing internet services to their clients

VISION LOSS SERVICES: Financial support for eye exams and glasses, visual aids for those with impaired vision, and a monthly support group; acts as the umbrella organization for the Olean Area Association for the blind and visually impaired.

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LOAN: Loaned assisted devices, medical equipment and supplies, Olean Lions Club drop off point and donated audio books. Located at 315 West State Street in Olean, we are open and accept gently used or new equipment.

TRANSPORTATION: Linkage of volunteer drivers to provide transportation to and from local medical appointments and for essential errands. This service is for the frail, homebound older adults, and those otherwise health impaired. The program offers free transportation for medical appointments and general errands in Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, and Allegany Counties, provided by volunteers who use their own cars and gas.



Importantly, Beneng's goal is not to grow bigger in terms of geographic reach, but rather to provide a model that other communities can replicate. "You have to get to a critical mass of purchasers within a certain radius that are close by to make this work. I'm hoping that we can continue and develop models that will work in our little rural communities to do this."

Will the delivery service continue once the Olean Area Farmers Market reopens? "All options are on the table," Beneng said. "I know how busy the season gets and that it's not unreasonable to think that it might become too much. But if this project could get enough momentum, my hope is that it's going to keep going because I do think that it helps farmers market customers to have another option on weeks they can't go."
