


### From Spring Skiing to Summer Fun

**WIN A HOLIDAY VALLEY SEASON'S PASS:** Interested in scoring a combo pass to HV for next season? SK8EVL will be set up on Saturday of Winter Carnival at the Holiday Valley Plaza (main lodge) from 11:30am-1:30pm and downtown next to the giant ski boot from 2:00-4:00pm, selling raffle tickets to raise money for the Ellicottville Skatepark Fund. Tickets are \$20 apiece or three for \$50, with the drawing to be held April 1st. They also have their hands on a pretty sweet poster of Tony Hawk from back in the day, signed by the legend himself, which will be part of the raffle as well! The best part: every dollar donated will be matched by The Skatepark Project/Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation and will go towards constructing a permanent concrete skatepark here in Ellicottville! #### GIVE TRENTON A LIFT

Local family looking for assistance in son's need of transport vehicle

At the beginning of October 2020, the family of Trenton Pierce of Great Valley organized a donation drive with the goal of raising funds to purchase an all-accessible mobile home. The home, which will accommodate Trenton's needs — who is diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD) — was ordered successfully and is set to be installed at the start of the upcoming spring season. Amidst the relief of securing a new home unit, Trenton fractured his femur after falling later that month, leaving him with another setback on his condition.

During his long battle with DMD, which gradually wears down muscular tissue, Trenton's ability to walk has been increasingly compromised and now needs the help of a wheelchair to maneuver his way around. The requirement of a wheelchair has made it difficult for Trenton to travel to his regular doctor appointments, which demand a twohour drive to Rochester.

Trenton's family has continued to safely transport Trenton to his medical exams by fitting him in their personal vehicle. But the slow loss of his ability to walk has resulted in the need of a new solution.

"We really have no way to properly transport him; it's becoming more and more difficult for us and for him," Jordan Pierce, Trenton's mother said. "My husband has to take off from work, fit him in the car, which isn't easy and we have to hope that it all goes smoothly."

Shortly after Trenton's injury in October, which has since been treated, his family began looking at possible options toward obtaining a transport van that will accommodate a wheelchair. Despite a number of Medicaid-funded van conversions to fit Trenton's needs, the cost of an accessible-friendly van is upwards of \$20,000. After financing a new housing unit in 2020 with the help of community donations, Trenton's family is faced with yet another substantial purchase.

In an effort to help Trenton's family with the additional cost of an accessible van, Michelle Wasserman, a long-time friend of Jordan, organized a virtual fundraiser through GoFundMe with the goal of raising \$18,000. The fundraiser is named "Give Trenton a Lift," inspired after Trenton's grandmother Joanie Weichmann who spent more than 15 years of her life as a lift attendant at Holiday Valley Ski Resort. The suggested donation amount of \$78 is also the same cost of a general ski-lift ticket, further inviting people who are willing to help raise the overall goal of the campaign.

The "Give Trenton a Lift" fundraiser has currently raised a quarter of the funds Trenton's family seeks. As donations continue to come in from Facebook users, community members and more, Trenton's parents hope they will be able to make his everyday life easier.

"I am absolutely thankful for everybody," Jordan said. "Our previous donation drive totally surpassed my expectations. We are all so grateful for the help and donations everyone has provided."

With Trenton's ADA-approved housing unit soon to be installed, the added ease of a transportation van will help him and his family continue the fight against DMD. #### SOUP BOWL FUNDRAISER

CCA kicks off spring fundraising efforts with 'Pot O' Gold' Soup Dinner

Over the past year, Cattaraugus Community Action of Salamanca celebrated many important milestones, and 2021 is no exception! In August, the non-profit organization, which is devoted to serving communities throughout the region, celebrated its 55th birthday and unveiled its new logo, "Building Resilient Communities," and new name, Connecting Communities in Action.

This month, CCA will be kicking off their first in-person fundraiser since the start of the pandemic, and Executive Director Tina Zerbian is looking forward to welcoming the community to the agency at 25 Jefferson Street in Salamanca on St. Patrick's Day for their Pot O'Gold Soup Dinner.

"We serve Cattaraugus County but work in several other counties, too, including Allegany, Chautauqua, Livingston and Wyoming counties," Zerbian explained. "We're an antipoverty organization, and fostering economic, physical, and emotional security is our mission. Our programs include youth and family prevention programs, energy and housing, homeless intervention services, and a lot of work in the mental/behavioral health field, as well as victim services for domestic and sexual assault."

Nutrition is one of the core services CCA has been providing during the COVID-19 pandemic. Zerbian pointed out, "We had a soup kitchen for 25 years, but we couldn't do congregate dining due to the pandemic. We found ways to get food out to the community, despite that!"

Over the past year, CCA has been delivering prepared foods that only require a microwave, as well as boxes filled with food and ingredients for at-home preparation. Zerbian noted that prior to the pandemic, CCA served individuals who did not have the resources to prepare their own food, and their Lighthouse Community Kitchen was a vital part of their nutrition services. Reopening the soup kitchen is one of CCA's most important goals this year, and the Pot O' Gold Soup Dinner will help support that program.

On St. Patrick's Day, Wednesday, March 17th, CCA is hosting their annual soup fundraiser at their Jefferson Street building. Under tents outside, soup will be served to-go style from noon-2:00pm and from 4:00-6:00pm. All proceeds will benefit CCA's kitchen by helping the agency make much-needed repairs to the freezers, refrigerators, dishwashers and more.

While the soup dinner is not a new fundraiser, this year's format is different to accommodate COVID-19 limits on gathering and congregate dining. Zerbian explained, "Prior to this year, we had a culinary arts training program and students would make our soup. That's not the case during COVID-19, so we called out to several area restaurants who are donating soup, and our own chef inside the agency is making soup."

Indeed, there will be 10 different delicious soups from which to choose, including vegan and vegetarian options. Salamanca restaurant Harvest Moon will be serving a spicy sausage soup, Seneca Allegany Resort & Casino will be donating a St. Patrick's Day soup of corned beef and cabbage, Marino's Pizzeria a stuffed pepper soup, Good Times of Olean will have Louisiana gumbo, Holiday Valley an Irish lamb stew, Dina's of Ellicottville a butternut squash bisque, Villaggio with their famous pasta e fagioli, Cupcaked (Salamanca and Ellicottville) is donating chicken Ajiaco, Katy's Cafe their blue mushroom soup, and CCA's own Chef John Haley is making Guinness and steak stew.

Soup bowls crafted by Hog-Shed Studio Pottery of Little Valley and Horn Hill Pottery of



Reggie Mawson: Honoring a friendly face who helped shape the town by showing up and enjoying it!

For his upcoming 90th birthday (on March 20th), we at EllicottvilleNOW would like to recognize Reggie Mawson, a fellow who helped make and keep Ellicottville a fun and friendly place. Reggie and his wife, Cindy have been making the most of Ellicottville for decades, and played a part in helping to make it what it is today.

Reggie was born 1931 in the small town of Yorkshire, England. He experienced the 2nd World War from the fringes – after Poland was attacked in 1939, Polish airmen moved to a base not far from his home. His family had to build an underground bomb shelter, and for a brief time the population had to carry gas masks in case chemical weapons were released. (Fortunately none were dropped on England). Towards the end of the war, at the age of 13, Reggie started a printer apprenticeship for Alfred Cooke Unlimited as a compositer. In these times, blocks were arranged with different words or letters on the printing press. It was a careful and time consuming process, but much faster than handwriting copies. As he worked and learned, the tides of war turned. Reggie recalls a firm belief from the English citizens that "God would never let Germany defeat them." With this resolute mentality, their swift and capable airforce, and the help of the collective Al-

lied forces, the war was brought to an end.

After turning 18, Reggie served two years with the British Army. His technical skills and precision set him up as a mechanic for the coding machines made to send and receive secret messages. He was stationed in Khartoum, Sudhan, and got a taste of adventure living in a place so different from his home. When his term of service came to an end, he wrapped up his apprenticeship; Reggie found a family living in the United States who were willing to sponsor him for a move across the Atlantic. After working hard to meet a lot of requirements, he made the move to Niagara Falls in 1956. His printing skills landed him jobs for some local newspapers, where he worked until the jobs were automated. Around this time, Reggie started making regular 'pilgrimages' to Ellicottville for fun and a different flavor of life. He began skiing at our beloved Holiday Valley in 1962 ... his first two ski lessons were taught by Edna Northrup and Pete Widger! (If you're a local, you will likely admit – that sounds like a quintessential introduction to Skiing in Ellicottville!)

Reggie became a Holiday Valley Ski Patroller just four years after starting to ski. He held a position in that essential group for 22 years. He is also an honorary member of the Ellicottville Ski Club. Early on with small investments from himself, Ken Brown, and eight others that were or had turned 70, they started the '700 club' which served food and drinks at the top of the hill for a great price. The money from this endeavor went to support local charities and non-profits. They provided money to the SPCA and to the Alley Katz (our town's awesome gardening gals who volunteer their time to arrange and provide beautiful flower boxes and baskets around the village in the summer months). Reggie also became a realtor part-time, and through his connections at Holiday Valley and his time here, he was present and a part of Ellicottville's shift from a lumber and industrial-centered town to the tourism-focused getaway it has become.

Reggie has lived in Kenmore, NY most of his life, but makes the journey to Ellicottville weekly with his wife for skiing, golfing, and to spend time with this community he grew to enjoy so much. He and Cindy wed in 1982 (no doubt that celebration was a blast!), and since 1986 they have owned a beautiful property just far enough outside the village to be quiet year-round, and just close enough to get in on the activities with no troubles. A real home away from home, as Ellicottville can be for so many.

Just in sharing a conversation with them, one can feel their genuine love and care for one another. Cindy and Reggie continue to visit and enjoy Ellicottville regularly. Although Reggie has hung up his ski boots, you can still find him enjoying the view from the Lodge. If you see the couple walking their big beautiful Alaskan Malamute, Leonard, around town and enjoying the day, give a wave or say hello!

Zerbian said, "We're kicking it up a notch with lots of different baskets to raffle off!" "We've been a staple in the community, especially during the pandemic," said Zerbian. "We've really risen to the occasion and found very creative ways to get food to people who can't travel, are ill, in quarantine, are disabled, or are seniors. We found ways to deliver food, while also keeping people safe, and we're looking forward to continuing to serve the community after the pandemic, too."



#### Core Performance: Working Out With Intention

SOOO, pretty much every article I write, I second guess. Was it too long, did I give enough information on my topic or did I give too much and lose my reader, was I too preachy, and is anyone really interested in what I am rambling on about?

So this week I am going to back track to an article I wrote a few issues ago about the duration of time for an effective workout and tag onto that - working out with intention. What that means is whatever length of time your workout is, you do it with purpose, resolve and determination.

I see this firsthand every day I train my clients. Some are scheduled to workout for an hour, but really only want to put effort into 20-30 minutes' worth of work, and even that work looks like a walk-through. Other clients are scheduled for a 30- or 45-minute workout and train so hard that in the first 10 minutes their heart rate is at 80% of their max and they are pushing themselves to complete every rep with resolve.

The length of time you workout will only produce results when you "show up!" Not just physically, but mentally. It's one of the reasons I left the typical gym and opened a studio I wanted to make the most of my client's time with an effective and efficient workout. Your time IS precious and valuable and if you want to get results you need to focus. IF you struggle to focus or are strapped for time, then less is more - I like to train hard 3 days a week and light on the other days. That does not always work out for me, so instead of feeling like I am falling behind or like I am slacking, I decide what my objective is and I put 2/3 exercises that are opposing muscle groups together (back/chest, biceps/triceps, quads/hamstrings etc.) I will create a smaller workout and complete it 3 times through with intention.

Honestly, short and sweet workouts done hard will get you better results in the long run than lengthy workouts done poorly. And, with the amount of stress we put on ourselves already, keeping it simple can be exactly the boost your body requires to reap the many benefits physical activity offers.

Also, do not think for one minute that you need to be in a gym to get a good workout. This



winter has given us the most beautiful snow we have seen in years. Nordic and Alpine skiing, as well as snowboarding and snowshoeing, are excellent ways to exercise. Even a brisk walk can do wonders for your mood and body.

I guess what I would like you to take away from this article is that whatever you do that gets you on your feet and moving is beneficial, and if you make it purposeful, you will feel a true sense of accomplishment knowing you put forth your best in completing what you set out to do.

#### The COVID-19 Vaccination Rollout Explained: A One-on-One Interview with Dr. Kevin Watkins, Cattaraugus County Director of Health

Across our nation, a vaccine has been deployed to battle the COVID-19 virus. This comes with so many questions nationwide, including right here in Cattaraugus County. How long will it take for me to get vaccinated? What if I don't have Internet access? What if I'm elderly and need help in this process? We decided to go right to the top, to get answers to some of these questions. Dr. Kevin Watkins, the Cattaraugus County Director of Health, took time out of his busy schedule to field our questions.

**eNOW:** How is the vaccine roll-out working in Cattaraugus County? **Dr. WATKINS:** We have a limited number of vaccine and therefore we are only able to vaccinate a limited number of our residents. We're asking our residents to be patient as more vaccine is coming; we are hoping to move down our waiting list of residents that want to be vaccinated.

**eNOW:** As for seniors who don't have Internet access or aren't comfortable with computers, what is their recourse?

Dr. WATKINS: Cattaraugus County has opened a COVID-19 call Center. That number is 716-701-3777. You can call our staff and they will walk you through getting an eligibility document in order to come to the vaccine clinic. They will put you on a wait list to get the vaccine, so if you do not have computer access, our staff will do all of that for you. You just have to

answer a couple of questions, they will print out that eligibility form, and they will mail it to you or you can stop by our office and pick up this form.

eNOW: What are some of the worries you would like to dispel that you're hearing from residents?

Dr. WATKINS: I'm more than sure that people are concerned about the warp speed in which the vaccine was developed. We want to tamp down some of the misinformation about this. This vaccine has shown to have a 95% efficacy. This vaccine has been shown to reduce the severity of the symptoms of COVID-19. The vaccine has been shown to reduce the actual ability to contract the virus itself. So if anyone has a concern about the vaccination, we would like to put that to rest and we'd like everyone to consider getting vaccinated.

**eNOW:** How concerned should women who are expecting be when it comes to the vaccination?

**Dr. WATKINS:** As far as women who are pregnant or lactating, recent reports show that there are no adverse effects. I would recommend that if they're concerned and are pregnant or are considering getting pregnant, to reach out to their OB/GYN and discuss before getting vaccinated. But again, studies of pregnant women have shown no adverse effects.

#### eNOW: When will Cattaraugus County receive more vaccine?

Dr. WATKINS: We are getting weekly shipments but our supply is far less than our demand. We do know that we're supposed to see a 20% increase from our baseline shipment. Starting immediately the normal allotment to hospitals will now be allocated to the local health departments as well, this way we can start to vaccinate individuals with comorbidities. We are hopeful that now by expanding the vaccine to local health departments, the vaccines delivered will mirror the demand we have from our residents.

#### eNOW: Where are you in the vaccination process right now, which group?

Dr. WATKINS: We are still vaccinating the 1B group, first responders, healthcare workers, police officers teachers and essential workers. We, however, are in a community with very few pharmacies, so we've been asked to help vaccinate seniors 65 and older. 
