#### ELLICOTTVILLE SKATEPARK

Village awards design/build contract; first of two design meetings held



ELLICOTTVILLE - In 2018, a group of local skateboarders presented an opportunity to the Village Board of Ellicottville to build an outdoor concrete skatepark for public use. A year later, the Village applied for and was awarded a "Built to Play" matching grant through The Skatepark Project (TSP, formerly known as the Tony Hawk Foundation). Partnering with the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, TSP's Built to Play grant offers qualifying western New York communities up to \$250,000 in matching funds to apply towards the construction of said skatepark.

Following three years of advocacy and fundraising (amidst a pandemic), the Ellicottville skatepark committee (SK8EVL) has raised the funds needed and is moving on to the next phase - DESIGN.

Grindline Skateparks of Seattle has been hired to design and build the concrete park, which will be located in Ellicottville's Village Park. Groundbreaking is planned for later this spring, with an anticipated completion date of October 31st of this year, if not sooner. Grindline's senior project manager, Matt Fluegge, recently made the trip to visit the Ellicottville site and meet with village officials and the SK8EVL committee.

"We are excited to work with the Village and the local skateboarding advocates to build a quality, concrete park for the community," Fluegge said. "Our design team understands the unique backdrop that Ellicottville is set in and we want to showcase a creative design to reflect that ski town vibe."

To help with the design, Fluegge and the Grindline team posted an online survey, followed up with an in-person meeting hosted by Fluegge himself during his March 21st trip to Ellicottville. These two platforms invited local skaters and interested community members to provide their input on what they'd like to see in the park.

"The online survey provided skaters with photos of all the different types of features that you can find in a skatepark, and asked them to rate the features that they are most interested in," explained Fluegge. "We'll take those results, along with the community's input from the in-person meeting, to create a conceptual design, which we'll bring to the table at our second community meet-up, scheduled for later in April."

Suggestions for park features ranged from a flow bowl, quarterpipe and pump track, to ledges, hips and down rails, just to name a few. The overall impression: plenty of transition balanced with a skate plaza style layout.

One local skater, William Benatovich, voiced his vision during the community meeting, which no doubt got the creative juices flowing amongst those in attendance. "When we discussed possible features to include in the skatepark, I had an idea for a rail or rails to imitate skis or a snowboard. I think this would be a great representation of Ellicottville's rich history of skiing and snowboarding."

Another idea, pitched by the Grindline team themselves, is to incorporate green circles, blue squares and black diamonds - just like what you see on the ski slopes - to reflect the various difficulty levels of the features within the park.

"We're grateful for all of the community input we've received from that first design meeting," said Brenda Perks, SK8EVL lead advocate, "and we're excited to see what Grindline comes up with for an initial concept. We encourage everyone that attended the meeting, and also those who couldn't make it, to mark their calendars for the 2nd com-





Fat tire biking was all the rage this winter, seeing its most popular season in WNY. People want to get outside more than ever; and can you blame them? After being cooped up for almost two years, zipping through winter wonderlands on a bike sure sounds exhilarating. Fat tire bikes are designed to be ridden in the snow and through rough winter terrain. The sport is still newer to the world of extreme sports; over the last ten years it has gained lots of traction with winter ultras and bike festivals becoming more and more popular, especially out west.

But look no further, the sport makes its debut this Saturday, April 9th at HoliMont as they will host a Dual Slalom. "It will be head-to-head in format with snowboard race gates and banked turns on snow," Travis Widger of HoliMont told me. The race will be a citizen event with amateur competitors, "all are welcome!" Each rider will be given a chance to run each of the two courses, and the best combined time will win their heat. There will be a bracket style elimination based on seating from qualification runs.

Loud Performance bike and repair shop will provide various prizes ranging from gift certificates to free bike tunes and other products. Two HoliMont Bike Park Season Passes will go to the overall winners of the event curtesy of HoliMont. "This is an extremely exciting event for us. We are passionate about cycling, whether it be summer or winter," Colton Mulkins of Loud Performance conveyed. They hope to show with this event that they are here to help build upon the cycling community in Ellicottville. "We have been working closely with Travis and Chris [Perks] at HoliMont to build a fun and challenging course. We have taken our bike knowledge and their ski and snow sculpting knowledge and have come up with an awesome layout."

The best place to catch the action will be at the bottom of Grasshopper slope. The event can be accessed by walking from the main parking lot between the Race Center and the maintenance buildings, or from the small parking lot at the base of Meadow Chairlift.

Loud Performance, a full service bike and snowboard shop located in Bemus Point, NY will be there with their tents promoting the inaugural event. They also have a second location right in the village here. You can find Loud Underground below Ellicottville Coffee Co. "We specialize in mountain biking, winter fat biking, and have close to 10 miles worth of singletrack trails right behind our shop in Bemus where we host evening rides, as well as kids group rides throughout the summer," said Mulkins. "We are focused on building a community around the love for the outdoors." At Loud Underground here in Ellicottville, they offer bike and snowboard sales and services, gear and accessories, and bike rentals. "Our goal here is to service the needs of those looking for a fast and efficient service to get you back out and adventuring as quickly as possible."


For Saturday's event, you can sign up day-of at the HoliCenter or online at holimont.com. Cost is \$25 for HoliMont members, and \$55. for non-members. This cost covers event registration and utilization of Grasshopper slope's new conveyor lift.

HoliMont will be hosting more summer events and has plans to expand their bike park. "Schedule to be announced later this spring," said Widger. "The bike park crew has already started cleaning and prepping trails for the riding season and will be working on new features and additions this summer." The Bike Park Season Passes are on sale now at HoliMont.com. The projected season dates are May 28th-Oct. 9th, Saturdays and Sundays 10:00am-4:30pm, adding in Fridays noon-7:00pm starting June 17th.

Winter Fat Biking has grown substantially in the past five years. Loud has worked with local mountain bike organization, WNYMBA (Western New York Mountain Bike Association), to help develop an extensive network of groomed Fat Bike trails for the area. "We have ten groomers scattered throughout Western New York, two of which are in Ellicottville, that are dedicated to grooming single track for Fat Biking," said Mulkins.

This weekend's event aims to draw more attention to winter cycling and should be exciting to watch! Get geared up for the 2022 bike season and come support the competitors this Saturday!

#### A VESSEL WITH A VISION

Renowned muralist and Olean native to capture the heart of the city with a piece at Jamestown Community College - Olean campus

Murals - one of the largest forms of public art - begin in many different ways. Over the years, Olean native Meg Saligman has had communities and cities from all over the world approach her with a mural project, including a site, funding, and a timeline. She then meets with community members, leaders, and stakeholders to gather ideas, hear stories, and create the vision for the mural. When it comes to the Heart of Olean mural project, though, "There is nothing normal about how this process has worked," said Paula Fox Derwick, Saligman's best friend and founding member of the Heart of Olean committee.

Meg Saligman Studios has created over 40 permanent artworks internationally, including three of America's largest murals. In her words, "This one comes from the heart - the heart of Olean. My father died last year, and I always owed him a painting above his fireplace." While Saligman did not get the chance to create this painting, she considered another way to honor her dad and her hometown. "I thought that leaving something in Olean, a place we love and care about very much, would be a wonderful thing. Now was a good time to begin the charge and really spearhead this plan."

Last year, Saligman and Derwick joined forces to create the Heart of Olean committee and approached the Tri-County Arts Council about becoming the fiduciary non-profit to spearhead the project. The arts council's positive response has since become a catalyst for a project that has been on the horizon for several years. According to Mikel Wintermantel, Copley Master artist and recently retired executive director of TCAC, the mural project will help launch a much larger public arts program. He explained, "We'd like to have murals around the city of Olean first, and then we'll branch out to places in all three counties (Allegany, Cattaraugus, and Chautauqua). Another inaugural program that we'd like to get started is a public sculpture program, too." Any funds raised above and beyond what is needed for the Heart of Olean mural project will be used toward TCAC's public arts program.

The Heart of Olean committee also reached out to Jamestown Community College, whose Cattaraugus County campus is on Union Street in Olean. Saligman fell in love with the Library and Liberal Arts Center and proposed the building as the site of the mural, which was approved by campus leadership. Derwick said the next hurdle is planning the funding for such a project, which would normally cost approximately \$200,000.

She said, "Meg has stayed very connected to her Olean roots, and she really wants to do this. She's donating all her time and studio expenses." As she paints the mural, Saligman will be working with a team of local artists beginning in mid- to late-May through August.

"The start-up costs are high," Saligman noted. "You need to rent equipment, like aerial lifts that will get you access to the wall, purchase paint, and we plan to get the artist team paid. We want to support the arts in western New York. One of the most expensive supply costs is the top coat. We'll spray two, which will make the mural last 15 years longer than it otherwise would. It will be done with best practices and materials for exterior conditions, which is good."

The Heart of Olean committee has a fundraising goal of \$100,000, and there are many fun ways to get involved and help them reach their goal! Derwick, who is a member of the Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce through her business Fox Financial, approached Meme Yanetsko, GOACC chief operating officer, about doing a corporate challenge for members. The challenge encourages 250 of GOACC's 500 members to donate a combined \$25,000 through contributions in the amounts of \$50, \$100 and \$200. As an additional incentive, Derwick's Fox Financial will meet, dollar for dollar, the first \$10,000 that businesses contribute.

Businesses and individuals alike can visit https://www.tricountyartscouncil.org/heart-of-olean-mural-program/ to participate in the challenge and become a sponsor or donate in any amount. Derwick and Saligman are particularly excited about the business sponsor opportunity, which, for donations starting at \$2,500, includes a paint day. Saligman or a member of her artist team will visit an organization or business with a large canvas that has a portion of the mural printed on it and a paint-by-number type of guide. During the paint day, participants can paint directly on the canvas, which is later attached to the building with proprietary adhesives. Approximately 20% of the mural will be created in this manner, and Saligman will be painting the rest with a team of local professional and amateur artists. "I love involving people in every step of the process," said Saligman. "I love teaching the skills and techniques, and if I leave that in Olean I think that will have an influence on future projects."

Now a Philadelphia resident, Saligman has made several trips to Olean and been a part of multiple Zoom meetings as part of her "seeking" phase, in which she gathers ideas from community organizations, historians, and more about their vision for the mural. Saligman is currently in the first phase of the design process, and on April 7th, she has her first design meeting with JCC. There will be subsequent meetings involving other community groups before her design is finalized. Though Saligman isn't ready to share her ideas yet, she hinted that there will be some historical elements and possibly spiritual and literary influences of nearby St. Bonaventure University.

Saligman is excited to bring her vision to life this summer and hopes the mural inspires pride, creativity, and unity. "A collaborative, city-wide project of making something together is exactly the thing that could have an influence as we emerge from the pandemic," she said. "Part of JCC's mission is to embrace change and transformation. I think that it helps us focus on where we've been, what we've been through in the last couple of years, and where we are right now.

Art is a valuable catalyst in helping connect people and helping recognize that we're in this together."



#### SAFE AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Recently established Preston Fund to assist low-income families & the elderly



OLEAN - For 40+ years, the Cattaraugus Development Corporation helped to provide safe and affordable housing for low-income families and the elderly in Cattaraugus County.

Recently established at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation, the Cattaraugus County/Gene and Charlotte Preston Fund for the Elderly will help continue the mission of that organization in perpetuity by making annual funding available to the Cattaraugus County Department for the Aging. The fund was established with the remaining assets of the Cattaraugus Development Corporation (CDC) when that organization recently dissolved

Grants from the fund will: provide housing support by paying back taxes, rent or mortgage payments for elderly residents in financial need, provide legal support/services to resolve housing issues, or pay for repairs needed to make a home handicapped-accessible or address code violations to allow the residents to stay in their home as long as possible and feasible.

The fund also honors two long-standing board members from the CDC, Gene and Charlotte Preston. Gene passed away only a few months ago. Charlotte is still living.

"They [Gene and Charolotte] were always available for short notice support if needed and ensured all actions were in compliance with our mission," said Terri Stranburg, former CDC executive director. "Even after resigning, they maintained an active interest in our activities and status."

While one of the CDC's main roles was to administer HUD's Section 8 rental assistance program, Stranburg said that an emerging need through the last few years of the agency's work was difficult situations with elderly applicants.

"The loss of a deceased spouse's income or an unaffordable repair was resulting in the loss of their home. Since our waiting list timeframe was 3-5 years long, the elderly in crisis were left with few or no options," she said. "Our staff felt their despair very keenly and telling an elderly person we could not help was heartbreaking."

Seeing those needs emerge inspired the current director at the time of the CDC's dissolution, Rosanne Larsen, to support the Cattaraugus County Department of the Aging so that the department would be able to help resolve housing issues and keep seniors safely in their own homes.

According to Cattaraugus County Department of the Aging Director Cathy Mackay, the endowment will serve a crucial purpose. "One of the reasons our department exists, is to assist older adults in their ability to stay in their own homes, living with dignity, respect, and independence," she said. "There are only so many funds or programs we have to assist people, whether it is an issue of rental assistance, back taxes, a broken water heater, or a stair lift or ramp.

"When people aren't eligible for one program, we try to find them other options. This endowment will mean that we can help more people in their time of need," she added. "I cannot begin to express how much this means to us and the community we serve. "

According to Mackay, the fund will make possible annual funding that will allow the agency to address "crisis" housing needs, while maintaining sustainable funding for future needs.

The fund will also have an immediate impact, she said, as the agency will utilize funding this year to address immediate needs in two situations that will allow area seniors to continue living in their home, delaying nursing home placements.

CRCF Executive Director Karen Niemic Buchheit praised the forward thinking of the CDC's board of directors in establishing this fund to support housing for the elderly. "In rural communities like ours, the elderly face a number of challenges in being able to stay in their homes safely," she said. "Making these resources available to an agency that works with the elderly population will ensure that more seniors can stay in their homes despite the needs for repairs, paying back taxes and more."

munity input meeting, when we'll review the design that Grindline has come up with and make any final suggestions for change."

The skatepark, once completed, will welcome everyone - local and from surrounding communities - at no charge. Skateboarders, quad skaters and scooters will have a safe space where they can be outdoors, practice their sport, and make new friends. SK8EVL, although they have raised the funds necessary to build, continue to accept donations in an effort to build the best skatepark possible.

"When we first applied for the Built to Play matching grant (pre-Covid), the average cost of a concrete skatepark was \$50 per sq. ft.," said Perks. "Based on the amount raised, this would have provided Ellicottville with a 10,000 sq. ft. facility. However, due to Covid and the rising cost of materials, the present-day cost to build a skatepark has increased to \$75 per sq. ft., which means we are now looking at a 6,500 sq. ft. facility. All the more reason to continue to fundraise, so that we can get closer to that original 10,000 sq. ft. footprint."


