



TRENDING: DISC GOLF

A Growing Sport Offers Fun Challenge for Golfers of All Ages and Abilities; Find Disc Golf Courses in Ellicottville and Olean

One of the fastest growing sports in the U.S., disc golf, also known as "frisbee golf," is a family-friendly, low-cost sport that is becoming increasingly accessible, especially in western New York. According to app UDisc's 2023 Disc Golf Growth Report, 4.3 disc golf courses were installed per day in 2022 and in the U.S. alone, 254 million people can play the sport within 6.2 miles of where they live. Twin Tiers Disc Golf Club, a non-profit organization dedicated to growing the sport of disc golf in the region, can connect players with a local league and tournament opportunities. For those who live in the Ellicottville area, HoliMont is a great place to enjoy this fast-growing sport, whether one is an experienced disc golfer or brand new!

According to the Professional Disc Golf Association, the sport is a great workout and affordable - the only equipment needed is a disc! While the number of disc golf courses is growing, technically one only needs an uncrowded open space and a few agreed upon targets ("holes") to enjoy the game. Similar to golf, disc golf begins with a tee area and ends at a target, but instead of a hole, players aim for an elevated metal basket. As players move down the fairway, they must make each consecutive throw from the same place where their previous throw landed. In a group, the farthest away player always throws first, and all are subjected to the challenges of the landscape, such as trees, shrubs, and changes in terrain.

A great upper and lower body workout, disc golf can be played by individuals of all ages and fitness levels, and approximately 90% of disc golf courses are free to play. The mission of Twin Tiers Disc Golf is to grow the sport by supporting those learning to play through offering community disc golf clinics, donating discs to new players, and facilitating leagues throughout the year at disc golf courses in the area, such as Gargoyle Park in Olean. Those who are interested in learning the sport or getting connected with a league can contact Twin Tiers Disc Golf through their website at www.twintiersdiscgolf.org.

HOLIMONT 9-HOLE COURSE

This will be the second year that HoliMont offers disc golf and Dan O'Connor, risk manager, is looking forward to another great season. Last year, HoliMont began with a nine-hole course and is currently considering options for expanding, possibly as early as this season, to offer an eighteen-hole course.

"There is a lot that goes into the planning of a disc golf course, such as course layout, basket types, launch pad designs, discs, maps, scorecards, pricing, etc.," O'Connor noted. "Planning and creating the course last year was a HoliMont team effort and was made possible thanks to the coordinated effort and support from many of our staff."

HoliMont's natural beauty makes it the perfect place to enjoy disc golf, though O'Connor noted that a great course does not happen by accident. "While HoliMont's variety of beautiful hills, wetlands, and woods makes it an ideal disc golf playground, we have to consider making it both challenging and fun, while avoiding existing or future trail systems," he explained. "Parts of last year's course were narrow with steep terrain making it easy to lose a disc and less 'beginner friendly.' We are currently designing a new course for this year that will accommodate both beginner and experienced players."

O'Connor has enjoyed disc golf for several years, having first been introduced to it in high school, when he played with his brothers, and continuing in college. "I personally enjoy the exercise, being outdoors, and challenging my friends," he said. "We invite everyone to play disc golf, whether you are brand new or experienced!"

He encourages beginners to come during operating hours as staff members will be able to help them get started and answer any questions. Disc golf rentals, scorecards, and chairlift access are all included with membership; however, anyone can play and get what they need at the ticket booth during operating hours. All are welcome to come after hours with their own discs. O'Connor also recommends a good pair of hiking shoes.

O'Connor and the HoliMont team are looking forward to an expanded and improved course this year. "Our goal is to eventually develop leagues and host tournaments," he added. "While we are still in the planning stages for this year's course, you can expect better launch pads, beginner-friendly terrain, and possibly more baskets."

There are over 35 miles of networked trails in this system which includes Jakes Rocks Trailhead, Elijah Run Boat Launch, Bent Run Parking Area, Forest Service Road 507 Devil's Elbow, and the Kinzua Point Information Center. The trails connect to the Dewdrop Campground for a convenient overnight stay. If you prefer to stay overnight in an inn or Airbnb, Kane Manor Inn, the Flats on Fraley, and the Lofts on Fraley offer convenient locations from which you can bike Route 321, along the Longhouse National Scenic Byway, to the mountain biking trails. The Jakes Rocks Trailhead is a favorite for those using the trail system for the first time.

For those who prefer to keep their two feet on the ground, there are over 40 miles of trails around Bradford, making it a great overnight hub for those interested in hiking or backpacking. Marilla Bridges Trail System, located just west of Bradford, features a variety of trails from the scenic 1-mile loop around the Marilla Reservoir to the challenging Marilla Springs Trail, Marilla Rocks Trail or Bullis Hollow Trail.

Timberdoodle Flats Interpretive Trail - Two trail loops totaling 1.5-miles. The timberdoodle is the nickname of the American woodcock, one of the many birds you might get a glimpse of along the trail. The Woodcock Loop is marked with yellow woodcock insignia and features 12 interpretive stops. The Bluebird Trail is suitable for wheelchair or walking assistance equipment and features six interpretive stops. The trail is perfect for the casual hiker, parents with small children, and first-time birders. The trailhead is located along Route 59, west of Bradford. Difficulty level is easy.

Rimrock Overlook & Trail - A short 1.3-mile trail connection between one of the most stunning overlooks in the Forest to the Kinzua Beach Recreation Area is located along Route 59, west of Bradford. A large sign on the left of Route 59 marks the access road to this recreation area. Trail difficulty is easy to moderate. The recreation area does include picnic tables and free parking.

ONLY FOR THOSE UNAFRAID OF HIGH PLACES

The Kinzua Sky Walk is located high above the Kinzua Gorge. It extends 624 feet into the gorge at a height of 225 feet, with a partial glass floor at the end. As "One of the top 10 most scenic skywalks in the world," you will have amazing views of Kinzua Creek far below, the forest covered gorge, and the 2003 tornado scattered ruins of 11 of the original viaduct's towers. The skywalk is the reinvention of six of the historic towers left standing after the tornado. A wonderful interpretive display area within the Kinzua Bridge State Park's Visitors Center tells the storied history of the Kinzua Viaduct. The viaduct, when first constructed in 1882, was the world's highest and longest railroad viaduct. There are three trails at the park. The General Kane Trail is family friendly. The Knox & Kane Rail Trail runs from the park to the village of Mt. Jewett; it is open for both hiking and biking. The Kinzua Creek Trail winds down the side of the gorge; it is for experienced hikers only. We recommend taking water with you and wearing hiking boots. No flip-flops please.

The park also offers picnic areas, a children's train themed playground, and during the main travel season a food truck. The park is open every day from 8:00am to dusk. Admission is free. Dogs are welcome, but they must be kept on a leash. The Kinzua Bridge State Park is located at 296 Viaduct Road, Mt. Jewett, PA.

FORE! GOLF

Our area offers two public golf courses plus a private golf course with an Airbnb which offers Play & Stay packages. Springville Center For the Arts and Volunteers Organize Springville Art Crawl

I live in Ellicottville and am very accustomed to large, person-powered events that take place regularly on our beloved streets. We almost take them for granted as they almost magically re-appear year after year to delight and entertain us. We should not. They are tons of work – no magic.

I can't help but love my town and village, but I am also a great fan of Springville, 18 minutes south of us, which often buffers the winter snows between us and Buffalo. I am grateful to this little geographic region, and I love supporting their businesses and endeavors. Imagine my surprise when I found that the upcoming Springville Arts Crawl (June 3rd) and 4:30pm parade (adopted from now defunct Dairy Fest - year 2) is run by a small handful of employees at the Springville Center for the Arts, along with 40 or 50 generous volunteers who devote time, talent, energy, muscle, and lost sleep to this endeavor. Who runs this? I asked. Not the Chamber?

"Well, no, we no longer have a Chamber... it's on us," said Cassandra Cross at the non-profit Springville Center for the Arts. The endeavor is quite ambitious. My head spins as I think of the many parts and pieces to this giant puzzle on Main Street, Springville, called the Arts Festival which has been a staple in Springville for many years but has morphed into this community-wide celebration of art and fun and kids and families and, and, and... You just have to see it!

The point of the endeavor is to spotlight area artists (60 of them - 175 pieces out of over 300 submitted). The works have been juried by gallery curator for Wyoming County, Jacqueline Swaby, multiple galleries owner, Emily Tucker, and Alberto Rey, whose work has been featured in over 200 exhibitions and screenings in the United States and internationally. Hardly small fry, their stamp of approval guarantees that you will find top quality art hung throughout the main street business establishments.

Yes, they are all for sale. Your informative brochure will give the details for the how to's because you can't just pick something off a wall and take it to the restaurant or store cashier. By the way, the artists are regional, mainly from Springville and surrounding areas with some from Ellicottville and Jamestown. The artwork consists of photography, acrylics, watercolors, pottery, ceramics, hand-carved Pacific/Native American wooden masks, stained glass, plaster 3-D pieces, jewelry, etc. The Art Crawl goes until 8:00pm. Then it's time for the adults to enjoy the after-party until 11:00pm.

PARADE KICK-OFF

The parade kicks off the celebrations. It starts at Heritage Park, hangs a right on Main, then right on North Buffalo and back to Franklin. You might be able to slip Santa your wish list as he passes by with his Mrs. Trevett Tree Farms and Springville Dairy will have fun floats to watch. For me, the big thing is the elementary, middle, and high school musicians from Springville Griffith Institute. It brings back memories of my own kiddos marching in parades in Ellicottville - sweltering in their hot uniforms but toughing it out anyway.

From 5:00-8:00pm, kids will have loads of opportunities for showing off their artwork or creating new. Look for the UNOVA Co-Working tent on Mechanic Street where the K-12 artists' works (juried by their teachers) are hung for you to enjoy. At SPARK, another feature dedicated to kids' creativity, kids ages 2-5 are encouraged to explore, interact, and create based on the Reggio Emilia model of educating children. At the core of the Reggio Emilia philosophy is its emphasis on building and sustaining relationships (https://www.rasmussen.edu/degrees/education/blog/what-is-reggio-emilia/). The tent is staffed by SCA interns who will moderate music, visual arts, movement etc. to the children's delight. If you have little ones, go there first. This inspiring display will be open until 8:00pm.

Kids will love the petting zoo (Mechanic Street area) with a chance to pet or even snuggle farm animals, lawn mowing goats from Let's Goat Buffalo, and rescue pups from Queen City Pitties. Suggestion: bring a carrier, blankey, treats, and leash in case you find yourself going home with a new furry pal. Hey, you never know when love at first boop will happen! Juried Art Show in Kane's Evergreen Park Returns for its 17th Year

Now in its 17th year, Art in the Wilds is returning to Evergreen Park in Kane, Pennsylvania for one of the region's most anticipated juried fine art and fine crafts shows on Saturday, June 24th and Sunday, June 25th from 10:00am-5:00pm both days. Merry Ryding, assistant director, is looking forward to the participation of brand-new artists and the return of many familiar faces. After a competitive application and review process, Ryding said the panel of three jurors selected 38 out of 60 applicants to participate in this year's show. "This year, we have a couple of new painters, a new jeweler, a new potter, and a new leather artist," she explained. "I'm really looking forward to seeing what they bring and seeing new pieces created by our returning artists."

The festival takes place rain or shine each year during the fourth weekend of June in the beautiful natural setting of the Allegheny National Forest. While good weather always ensures a good crowd, Ryding pointed out that the last weekend in June is also alumni weekend in Kane. "There will be a lot of people who are returning who have been away," she noted. "They always like to bring back a little piece of home with them, and Art in the Wilds has kind of cemented that space."

A small venue compared to some, Art in the Wilds is a thoughtfully curated group of artisans, many of whom apply each year. "We keep it small purposefully because it's more fair to the buyers and to the artists to keep it small so that it's not a diluted market," Ryding explained. "We do try to curate it so that we have a good balance of artists."

An artist and retired art professor, Ryding knows firsthand how important it is to create an environment that is friendly for festival goers as well as the participating artists. "We want quality artists to come, so if we can accommodate them with little things, like free bottled water throughout the day, free breakfast, and a special reception on Friday night, our hope is that they continue to come," she said. Clearly, these efforts have paid off, as Ryding noted that approximately 90% of previous years' artists apply every year to get in. "Some years, the percentage is even higher than that," she added.






