Culture and Celebration Unite in Salamanca

The Marvin "Joe" Curry Veterans Powwow Returns to Veterans Park July 15th and 16th

Picture this: It's a beautiful summer day. The sun is shining and there's a light breeze in the air. You're on your way to Salamanca, NY to experience the Marvin "Joe" Curry Veterans Powwow - maybe for the first time. As you enter into Veteran's Park, you hear the sound of drums and you see color everywhere. You can smell the native food and you discover a vendor village filled with native, handcrafted wares.

Now mark your schedule for July 15th and 16th and bring your vision to life when the Powwow returns. For those not familiar with the Powwow, it is an annual tradition with a deep, rich history. "The Seneca Nation has been hosting our annual Powwow for more than 30 years. It is an important celebration of our culture and a chance to honor veterans who have served. We view it as an opportunity to not only connect and reconnect with friends and family from across Indian Country to celebrate the common bonds we share, but also as a chance to share our culture with our neighbors here in WNY and to help build a better understanding of who we are as Seneca people and how our history and culture have helped shape our entire region."

LOST LADYBUG PROJECT

Cornell Cooperative Extension Cattaraugus County's Master Gardener Program received rare nine spotted lady bugs, larvae and eggs as part of Cornell's Lost Ladybug Project to help reestablish local native populations across NY State.

The Lost Ladybug Project is a citizen science that relies on the public to scout for native ladybugs, such as the nine spotted we received in Ellicottville. Volunteers across the county look for ladybugs in their yards, gardens, or other locations. When volunteers spot ladybugs, they upload a photograph and identify the location where the photo was taken for Cornell researchers. Cornell uses this information to learn more about where our native ladybugs are found, how many there might be, and what effect the changing distribution of ladybugs may have on local ecosystems (e.g., increase in garden pests).

FEDERAL GRANT MOVES SOUTHERN TIER TRAIL PROJECT FORWARD

U.S. Senate Majority Leader Charles E. Schumer and U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand announced last week a major \$7+ million grant for Cattaraugus County through the U.S. Department of Transportation's highly competitive Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity grant program to complete the planning, preparation, and design of the Southern Tier Trail. This long-desired project will connect trails between the City of Buffalo and the southern end of the Genesee Valley Greenway in Hinsdale in Catt. County, primarily following the old Buffalo-Pittsburgh rail corridor. The senators said that this significant federal funding will bring new recreation-based tourism traffic to the historic towns and villages across WNY and the Southern Tier ... page 13



The Marvin "Joe" Curry Veterans Powwow Returns July 15th & 16th

Picture this: It's a beautiful summer day. The sun is shining and there's a light breeze in the air. You're on your way to Salamanca, NY to experience the Marvin "Joe" Curry Veterans Powwow - maybe for the first time. As you enter into Veteran's Park (520 Broad Street), you hear the sound of drums and you see color everywhere. You can smell the native food and you discover a vendor village filled with native, handcrafted wares.

Now mark your schedule for July 15th and 16th and bring your vision to life when the Powwow returns. For those not familiar with the Powwow, let's break it down...

The Powwow is an annual tradition with a deep, rich history. ellicottvilleNOW reached out to the Powwow Committee, which shared with us that, "The Seneca Nation has been hosting our annual Powwow for more than 30 years. The Powwow is an important celebration of our culture and a chance to honor veterans who have served. We view it as an opportunity to not only connect and reconnect with friends and family from across Indian Country to celebrate the common bonds we share, but also as a chance to share our culture with our neighbors here in Western New York and to help build a better understanding of who we are as Seneca people and how our history and culture have helped shape our entire region. Last year was our first Powwow after having to cancel for two consecutive years because of COVID. It was great to see so many people return, and we think this year's event will be just as spirited."

DRUMS, DANCE, VENDORS AND FOOD


Salamanca's Powwow boasts one of the largest smoke dances in North America. When asked why the Smoke Dance is such a huge part of the festival, the Powwow Committee explained that it is a traditional Haudenosaunee dance - a very fast and athletic dance, which is incredible to watch. You can't help but be amazed at the footwork of the dancers while they are performing. "It is always one of the more popular dances during the Powwow," said the Committee. "Smoke Dance competitions regularly attract a large number of men and women dancers of all ages from across Indian Country."


The festival also showcases a wealth of vendors peddling not just typical wares but traditional native crafts. Just like the songs and dances at the Powwow, the crafts and artwork you will see help tell the story of Seneca and Native history and culture. Browse traditional beadwork, baskets, carvings, cornhusk dolls – these are all skills that have been passed on from generation to generation throughout history. They were critical to the culture and lifestyle centuries ago, and they are still important to them today. The vendors and artisans at the Powwow share that story through their works and are excited to share it with you. So make sure to peruse each vendor and find some items that speak to you to bring back home.

Another cultural experience at the Powwow is their food and drink. "We are a welcoming culture and society," stated the Committee. "Our Haudenosaunee ancestors lived in longhouses, where they shared what they had with all of the families and family members who lived under the same roof. When we welcome people to our territory, we welcome them as guests and offer to share with them what is ours. So, the foods that people can enjoy at the Powwow - from traditional foods to modern favorites - are part of our spirit of community." (Think fry bread, bean/corn soup etc.) The best way to find out this year's offerings is to follow the "Seneca Veterans Powwow" Facebook page.

The Smoke Dance isn't the only entertainment you'll experience during the Powwow. The Drum Contest is sure to get everyone in rhythm, and there will be dance contests for men, women, teenagers, young adults, and even little children in many different categories, including Grass Dance, Fancy Dance, Jingle Dance, Smoke Dance, and more. Other special dance categories will be on the bill, including a "We Are Still Here" smoke dance that honors the survivors and families of the Indian Residential School era. In addition to all of the dance competitions, they will also hold a social dance where they encourage everyone to participate. "Be sure to stop by our cultural tent which provides live demonstrations throughout both days from local and visiting artists, storytellers, and musicians," added the Committee. We think the area will echo with our traditional songs and the sounds of community, family, and celebration."

I asked what they felt made the Powwow so significant to their culture? The Committee replied, "We have been here since time immemorial, and our ancestors faced countless







LOST LADYBUG PROJECT

Cornell Cooperative Extension Needs Your Help with Local Ladybug Population



Cornell Cooperative Extension staff recently released nine spotted ladybugs, larvae, and eggs outside of their office site in Ellicottville.

ELLICOTTVILLE - Cornell Cooperative Extension Cattaraugus County's Master Gardener Program received rare nine spotted lady bugs, larvae and eggs as part of Cornell's Lost Ladybug Project to help reestablish local native populations across New York State.

As a kid, we learned when a ladybug lands on you, it represents good luck and fortune. If you count the spots, you'll have as many years of good luck as the bug does spots. Today, if a ladybug lands on you it is likely their non-native lookalike, the Asian Lady Beetle. There has been a decline in native ladybugs, which are a beneficial insect predator. If you are a gardener, these are welcomed friends of your garden!

Most ladybugs in North America are beneficial as both adults and larvae, feeding primarily on aphids. If aphids are limited, ladybug adults and larvae may feed on the eggs of moths and beetles, mites, thrips, and other small insects, as well as pollen and nectar. Because of their ability to survive on other prey when aphids are in short supply, ladybugs are a valuable natural enemy you want around.

The Lost Ladybug Project is a citizen science that relies on the public to scout for native ladybugs, such as the nine spotted we received in Ellicottville. Volunteers across the country look for ladybugs in their yards, gardens, or other locations. When volunteers spot ladybugs, they upload a photograph and identify the location where the photo was taken for Cornell researchers. Cornell uses this information to learn more about where our native ladybugs are found, how many there might be, and what effect the changing distribution of ladybugs may have on local ecosystems (e.g., increase in garden pests).





NEW ORNAMENT UNVEILED

Santa Claus Lane Committee Announces the Next Olean Landmark Keepsake



OLEAN - The Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce unveiled its newest Santa Claus Lane ornament, a depiction of the Angee's Restaurant, Olean, NY. Through these ornament sales, holiday lights are funded and can be lit in Olean from November to early January. The ornaments, in a series created by artist Kathleen McDonald, are \$25.00.

"This past January, we had a voting ballot that included four distinct buildings that call the area home. Each year, GOACC has an online voting on what should be the next ornament for Santa Claus Lane," stated Meme K. Yanetsko, GOACC COO. Joining the winner were Jim's Park and Shop, Old Library Restaurant, and the Olean Medical Group.

Each ornament contains a brief history: ANGEE's RESTAURANT | Olean New York: Libratore Angelo Fratercangelo made his journey from Italy to America in 1904. Like most Italian immigrants, Angelo could not speak English when he arrived, however, he successfully made his mark in the restaurant business. With the help of his son, Nicky, he opened a restaurant in 1948 at 475 North Union Street, Olean. Angee's Restaurant remains at the same location today. It is now owned and operated by his grandson, Anthony. The year 2023 marks 75 years of service.

THE STORY OF ANGEE'S RESTAURANT

Nicholas Fratercangelo, also known as "Little Nicky," retired from his job at Clark Brothers in 1948 to assist his father in the management of Angee's Restaurant. In the early 1960s Angelo retired and passed the restaurant on to Nicky. For the next 25 years, Nicky added a personal touch which made the restaurant what it is today. From the introduction of pizza to his trademark white shirts, Nicky's ideas and ideals made Angee's into a favorite meeting and eating place for the hometown crowd.

Nicky retired in the 1980s. His retirement came partly due to ill health, but mostly because he wanted to see his sons carry on a part of his life that he loved so much. Nicky passed away in February of 1998 but up until a week before his death you could find him every morning at the front table in Angee's visiting with old friends and making new ones.

Nicholas Livoto was one of Angee's original employees. He was referred to as "Big Nick" because he was much bigger than Nicky Fratercangelo. Big Nick was the head chef at Angee's for 41 years. He had a flare for serving up many a delicious meals. When he was in the kitchen, you knew it wouldn't be long before your favorite Angee's meal was at your table ready to eat. Big Nick passed away in 1989 but sometimes on a busy Friday night, you can still hear him in the kitchen giving orders.

Angelo L. Fratercanglo is Nicholas Fratercangelo's oldest son. He worked for Angee's for 14 years. In 1988, he left the restaurant to pursue another career. He left the daily operations to his younger brother Anthony.

Anthony Fratercangelo is currently the owner and operator of Angee's Restaurant. Shortly after Anthony took over in 1988, he gave Angee's a new look. A remodeled dining room, an enlarged kitchen, and an expanded menu brought a new generation of loyal Angee's patrons. An added catering business allows people to sample the great taste of Angee's food at home, in the office, or anywhere they choose.

A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Every year, the Santa Claus Lane committee (through voting) chooses the landmarks to be designed on the 3-1/2 inch circular resin ornament. The artist sketches the layout from photos provided by Chamber officials and a prototype is created. Once the prototype is approved, work begins with the process of pouring and hand-painting each piece. The ornaments arrive in Olean, individually boxed, with a brief description of the ornament.

Many of the previously made ornaments are still available with a limited inventory. The first to be unveiled was the Olean Municipal Building. The complete list can be emailed. These past ornaments are available at the Chamber office and can be purchased online at shop.oleanny.com.

The new ornaments are available at the Chamber office, 301 North Union Street, Olean, NY. Ornaments will also be sold at Angee's and will be available there mid-July. Ornaments can also be shipped outside Olean for an additional \$6 for shipping/handling charges per ornament. FROM BUFFALO TO HINSDALE

Southern Tier Trail will Join Erie-Cattaraugus Rail Trail Thanks to RAISE Grant



U.S. Senate Majority Leader Charles E. Schumer and U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand announced last week a major \$7+ million grant for Cattaraugus County through the U.S. Department of Transportation's (USDOT) highly competitive Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant program to complete the planning, preparation, and design of the Southern Tier Trail (STT). This long-desired project will connect trails between the City of Buffalo and the southern end of the Genesee Valley Greenway in Hinsdale in Cattaraugus County, primarily following the old Buffalo-Pittsburgh rail corridor. The senators said that this significant federal funding will bring new recreation-based tourism traffic to the historic towns and villages across Western NY and the Southern Tier, investing in both growing access to our outdoor resources and economic growth along our main streets.

"The Southern Tier Trail will help increase access to the natural beauty of Western New York, giving a breath of fresh air to our downtowns with a much desired boost for outdoor tourism," said Senator Schumer. "This rail-trail, primarily along what was once one of the central economic corridors of the old Buffalo-Pittsburgh rail, will help hike up much needed economic growth for scenic rural communities across Western New York. I am proud to deliver this major \$7+ million boost, a direct result of the historic increases we secured in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, to help bridge the gap in one of the final pieces of the puzzle for the Southern Tier Rail Trail in Cattaraugus County."

"I'm thrilled to be announcing that the Southern Tier Trail will receive over \$7 million in federal funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law," said Senator Gillibrand. "This funding will allow New Yorkers and visitors alike to enjoy the beauty Western New York has to offer. I am proud to have worked to secure the funding for this project and will continue to advocate for Western New York to receive the federal resources it needs to thrive."

Howard VanRensselaer, Chairman, Cattaraugus County Legislature said, "That's wonderful for our municipalities in Cattaraugus County! The increase in tourism will be an exciting boost to the businesses along the trail corridor. It is a great opportunity to bring in a new outdoor tourism destination to our county that will be a catalyst for community revitalization for our small communities here."

Norm Marsh, Cattaraugus County Legislature Chairman of the Development and Agriculture Committee said, "The RAISE grant is a tremendous step forward for the Cattaraugus County trail system in connecting larger systems in the region. This will be a huge economic boost for many of our small municipalities. The Southern Tier Trail system will give many opportunities for the restaurants and retail stores in our communities."

"Thanks to support from the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation for the development of the 2021 Southern Tier Trail Feasibility Study and continued capacity through the NYS Department of Health's Creating Healthy Schools and Communities program, GObike has been collaborating with Cattaraugus County along with the towns and villages throughout the corridor to bring this trail to fruition", stated Justin Booth, Executive Director at GObike Buffalo. "Throughout this process, residents and stakeholders consistently expressed a desire for the trail to support active transportation and recreation - creating a safe space for people of all ages and abilities to safely walk and bicycle within their communities."

Schumer and Gillibrand said this over \$7 million in federal funding will go towards Cattaraugus County's "Southern Tier Trail Planning and Design Project," investing in the completion of the planning, environmental, design, and permitting for the construction of an approximate 52 miles of trail that will connect the Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail in Erie County with the Genesee Valley Greenway, crossing through 11 small municipalities and the Seneca Nation Allegany Territory. The STT will be the connector between the Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail and the Genesee Valley Greenway, creating a regional trail loop in Western NY. Schumer and Gillibrand said the benefits of building a regional trail system have been shown to represent a huge economic return on the money invested into trail projects throughout New York State by bringing significant foot traffic to small businesses and energizing main streets. This model for economic development and revitalization has been successful across Upstate New York, including the Empire State Trail, parts of the Finger Lakes Wine Trail and other areas like Lake Placid that have leveraged natural attractions to spur economic activity, which then spills over to the entire community.

The senators explained that the over \$7 million RAISE grant (formerly known as BUILD or TIGER) that Cattaraugus has just received is a highly competitive national grant program through the U.S. Department of Transportation which funds transportation projects of national and regional significance. The senator secured historic increases for the program in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, at \$7.5 billion over five years, with \$1.5 billion per year. The recent Fiscal Year 2022 spending bill included an additional \$775 million, bringing the total amount for FY22 to \$2.275 billion.

RAIL TRAIL IN O.P. NOW OPEN

Village of Orchard Park Residents Celebrate New Multi-Use Recreational Trail



After three years of preparation by Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail, Inc. (ECRT), Village of Orchard Park residents may now enjoy a 1.3-mile multi-use recreational trail for walking, running, biking, and strolling. Opening day was Saturday, June 17, 2023 at the historic Orchard Park Railroad Depot next to the Orchard Park Library.

"Local residents have been enthusiastic supporters, and this section of the trail was made possible because of their generosity and commitment," said Mary Brummer, ECRT President. "ECRT is transforming this railroad corridor into a community asset we can all enjoy, and we will continue this work over the full 27 miles of our trail."

The transformation is dramatic. An area that previously had become overgrown and unsightly has been cleared, proper drainage has been reestablished, and the trail has been resurfaced to accommodate comfortable and safe use by residents. Neighborhoods beyond the Orchard Park village center and adjacent to the trail now have safe, off-road access to the village parks, schools, library, and shops.

ECRT celebrated this new beginning with a crowd of 100+ members of the community on opening day. People rang bells, sounded train whistles and cheered with enthusiasm as the ribbon was cut by ECRT Board members and trail barricades were removed. Walkers and riders smiled and thank-yous were flowing freely as everyone walked, biked, or ran on this section of the trail for the first time. The sight of three little riders testing out their training wheels on the trail was heartwarming! Kids and 'kids at heart' were treated to frozen treats from ECRT after their trail excursion.
