



Let's face it. Bikers oftentimes get a bad rap - portrayed as violent, degenerate or dirty by various films and media. The opposite could not be more true. Motorcycle clubs are built on members who are very active in their communities. (Note: Many bikers are retired servicemen.) These clubs support their neighborhoods and give back whenever they can. One of the best examples of bikers giving back is through dice runs.

What is a dice run? It's a motorcycle ride for a cause. Supporting anything from local volunteer organizations to cancer research and awareness to special services for children. In this article, we're going to cover just a few of the events planned in our areas.

Let's start with a local event. The Ellicottville Distillery, located at 5462 Robbins Road, will host their Annual Vintage Motorcycle Showcase on Saturday, September 16th. Cost is \$15 to register. (If you don't have a bike to enter, you can still come out to join the fun! Donations aren't required but they are certainly appreciated.) There will be live entertainment provided by local favorite, Meet the Bacons, from 12:00-3:00pm. A food truck will be on-site to provide good grub to pair with any of the signature refreshments the Distillery has to offer. Proceeds from the 50/50 raffle will benefit Oishei Children's Hospital, the regional center for comprehensive pediatric, neonatal, prenatal and obstetrical services in Western New York.

"Our middle daughter spent 72 days in Oishei and we try our best to support them whenever we can," said Distillery owner Bryan Scharf. So bring your bikes out to Ellicottville Distillery for a great day of music and merriment while you help them support a great institution. Make a note to sign up for the DW Memorial Dice Run in Olean, NY on August 18th and 19th. (The DW stands for Dennis Jones and Wayne Johnston, whom the Inaugural event is in honor of.) This large scale run welcomes over 150 bikers participating each year and has multiple stops including Shinglehouse and Lewis Run, PA, before ending in Olean at Angee's Restaurant. This year's funds raised will go toward the DW Memorial Scholarship Fund, in memory of Dennis and Wayne and will help a local student from each Olean High School and the Arch Bishop Walsh Academy further their education. More information about the event, the route, and other details as they become available can be found at oleanny.com.

Bradford, PA isn't missing out on the action. The 26th Annual Motorcycle Benefit Run is on for Saturday, July 22nd. (The event actually begins on the 21st with a bike show at Ace Hardware, with the actual Dice Run taking place on Saturday.) Registration is open from 9:00-11:45am at the Zippo/Case Museum Visitors Center and cost is \$25 per person. (The first 500 participants will receive a free event pin.) The event will begin with a Blessing of the Bikes at 12:00pm. The run is approximately 90 miles. Along with door prizes and awards, everyone can enter to win the grand prize, "Harley of Hope" - a 2023 Harley Davidson Softail Heritage Bike. Zippo Lighters and event t-shirts will also be available for purchase.

We help them with utility bills, prescriptions, gas cards, doctor appointments, etc. - all the things that can get out of your control when one of your children or loved ones is fighting cancer.'

BROADEN YOUR HISTORICAL HORIZONS

Must-visit Destinations for History Buffs of All Kinds - From Comedy and Opera to Motorcycles, Seneca Culture and More

It's hard to resist the allure of the outdoors in an area where summers can feel oh-so short, but the occasional rainy day (or week!) and uncomfortably high temperatures can mean a change of plans. Why not make plans to check out some incredible local museums that highlight our area's unique history, culture, businesses, manufacturing, and more? Beyond a retreat from the rain or heat, these museums - some of which are free to visit - provide unique learning experiences that celebrate what makes this area so special!

ELLICOTTVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY & MUSEUM

Since 1956, the Ellicottville Historical Society & Museum has been dedicated to adding to and preserving the historical record of the town of Ellicottville and the surrounding vicinity. The museum, located at 2 Washington Street, is open every Saturday from 1:00-4:00pm during the months of June through September, and admission is free. Society meetings are held the first Wednesday of every month (May through October) at 7:00pm at the Ellicottville Memorial Library, and all are welcome to attend. On Wednesday, August 2nd, Mary Fox will present "Glimpses of Ellicottville History," a look at Ellicottville's history through pictures. On Wednesday, September 6th, Whitney Stewart will present research for the book "FELDPOST: The War Letters of Friedrich Reiner Neimann - A German Solider on the Eastern Front." On October 4th, Amanda Woomer will present "Legends, Lore and Ghosts of Ellicottville."

Curious about some of the village's historical landmarks and structures? The EHS offers historical walking tours around the village, where participants can learn about the founding fathers and their homes. Take part in this hour and a half long tour on July 22nd, August 19th or September 16th at 1:00pm. (Meet at the gazebo.) The cost is just \$10; register by calling Ellen Frank, vice president, at 716-699-2276 or 716-474-8528. Be sure to save the dates for the EHS Ghost Walks this fall on the following Friday evenings at 7:30pm: September 29th, October 13th, 20th, and 27th.

SENECA-IROQUOIS NATIONAL MUSEUM

Located at 82 W. Hetzel Street in Salamanca, the Seneca Iroquois National Museum and Onohsagwe:de' Cultural Center invite visitors to learn about Seneca history, culture, art, and more through their new exhibits. "Women of Influence: Each Block a Story" features a large quilt comprised of beaded squares made by 41 artists who honored specific Native women through their designs. "Indianink: Iroquois and the Art of Tattoos" is an exhibit that shares contemporary tattoo art as self-expression, indigenous identity, cultural philosophy and more. Other exhibits include the Kinzua Dam, the Creation Story, and traditionally crafted items, such as beadwork and carvings. While there, be sure to check out the many handcrafted items available for sale, including baskets, antler carvings, stone carvings, and more. For more information, visit www.senecamuseum.org.

pre-Columbian times. Learn how edged tools were created, used, and made, and their unique production history in Cattaraugus County. For example, Little Valley's Cattaraugus Cutlery Company was the only cutlery company in the country to exhibit at the 1901 Pan-Am Exhibition and was responsible for the creation of dozens of companies forming in western New York and northwestern Pennsylvania. The museum is open from 1:00-4:00pm, Thursday through Sunday. Visit www.amcut.com to learn more.

NORTHEAST VINTAGE CYCLE

For those passionate about motorcycles - especially Hondas - a visit to Northeast Vintage Cycle is a must! Located at 9505 Routes 39 and 240 in Springville, Northeast Vintage Cycle began as a hobby and grew into a business formed by self-described "Honda nuts" Mike Krzemien and Bill Miller. The store sells vintage Honda parts and has a service department, Exploration Motorsports, that repairs vintage bikes and modern bikes and ATVs.

Also housed inside the store near the front is a small museum filled with hard-to-find vintage Hondas. There are approximately two dozen vintage motorcycles on display, as well as motorcycle memorabilia. Honda fans will appreciate the Honda snowmobile on display, which is one of only a handful ever made. To see customers' restoration project photos, vintage Honda advertising, order parts, and more, visit www.hondanuts.com. Northeast Vintage Cycle is open from 8:30am-5:00pm, Monday through Friday, and 9:00am-1:00pm on Saturday.

NATIONAL COMEDY CENTER

Designated by Congress as the cultural institution dedicated to presenting the story of comedy and preserving its history for future generations, The 37,000-square feet attraction at 203 W. Second St. in Jamestown includes exhibits that appeal to the whole family and every genre of comedy - from cartoons to sitcoms to stand-up and beyond! Earlier this summer, the Center announced the opening of a new exhibit honoring Caroline Hirsch and her Carolines on Broadway, the iconic Times Square comedy venue where comics including Jerry Seinfeld, Robin Williams, Chris Rock, Wanda Sykes, Margaret Cho, Jay Leno, Michael Che, and more began developing their talent.

Explore approximately 50 other exhibits that share the creative process of comedy and the history of comedy with plenty of interactive exhibits that allow visitors to try their hand at generating some laughs! Kids and teens (17 and under) are admitted free for the summer with the purchase of an admission ticket by an accompanying adult, now through September 4th. Comedy fans should be sure to check out the Lucille Ball Comedy Festival, August 2nd-6th, featuring comedians Gabriel "Fluffy" Iglesias and Taylor Tomlinson.

LUCY DESI MUSEUM

CATTARAUGUS COUNTY MUSEUM

There is so much more to explore when it comes to the history of Cattaraugus County, and the Cattaraugus County Historical Museum and Research Library is the perfect place to begin! Known as the Stone House, the museum is located on the first floor of 9824 Route 16 in Machias. Be sure to check out the newest exhibit, "Piecing Together History; Saving the 37th NY Regimental Flag," a Civil War exhibit that highlights the history of the 37th NY Volunteer Infantry, which included two companies from Cattaraugus County.

In addition to exploring the museum this summer, visitors can attend the Summer at the Stone House series on the second and fourth Thursday nights through the end of August. On July 27th, Ron Cary will be giving a presentation on tavern music; on August 10TH, Linda Hunter, quilting instructor, will be giving a presentation on "What Do You Do with Five Inch Squares?"; and on August 24th, Jeanette Sheliga will be giving a presentation on "Newspapers: Above the Fold, Your Ancestors in the News." The entire event series is free to attend, as is the museum. For more information, visit www.cattco.org/museum.

AMERICAN MUSEUM OF CUTLERY

Proud to be the only cutlery museum in the western hemisphere not affiliated with a manufacturer or retailer, the American Museum of Cutlery shares a unique part of Cattaraugus County history with visitors. Over the years, there were over 50 cutlery companies within a 100-mile radius of Ellicottville, but the museum actually traces the history of cutlery back to


Ellicottville, West Valley Graduates Receive CRCF Scholarship Awards

MOTOR THOROUGH THE MOUNTAINS

Discover a Number of Unique Attractions Throughout the Allegheny National Forest Region of Pennsylvania

Experience slow two-lane byways while learning about America's industrial and agricultural history on this motorcycle road trip which offers stunning vistas, great eateries, wineries, and even a brew pub or two.

MUST-VISIT MUSEUMS

Begin your adventure in Bradford, Pennsylvania, just a quick drive south on Route 219 from Ellicottville, New York. Two major museums to check out in Bradford are the Zippo/Case Museum & Flagship Store and the Marilyn Horne Museum. The Zippo lighter, invented in 1932, along with Case knives, and their newest addition Northern Candles, are still "Made in America." Their gift shop is the only place in the world that carries the complete line of Zippo lighters and Case knives. Admission is free! The museum is open daily at 1932 Zippo Drive, Bradford, PA.

Nearby, the Marilyn Horne Museum, located within the National Historic District of Downtown Bradford, highlights the talents of this world-famous opera star born in Bradford. Enjoy a short movie of her career while seated in a replica of her favorite opera house, then explore the interactive musical displays. Browse their gift shop, enjoy a coffee or snack, then back on the bike to drive over the mountain to Eldred.

Drive Route 346 East to the Eldred World War II Museum where an M255 tank seems to burst through the museum wall. Highlights include a working submarine periscope, award-winning video, vehicles, and an exhibit on the seven fronts of the war. During World War II, Eldred was the site of a British and American munitions plant that produced mortar and over eight million bombs. Fifteen hundred people, mostly women, worked there, 24 hours a day from January 1942 to May 1945, supporting the war effort.

SERENITY GLASS PARK

Depart Eldred driving on Route 446 East, merging onto Route 155 to Serenity Glass Park in Port Allegany. Serenity Glass Park is a sparkling artisan creation constructed of glass blocks which played a large part in the community's rich industrial history of glass production. Eddie's on Main offers a broad selection of lunch entrees. Now head west on Route 6 towards Smethport. Lynn Hall is located between Port Allegany and Smethport; this building is a prime example of modernism architecture. Treat yourself to a stay in the Architect's Suite or The Cottage.

TREASURES ALONG ROUTE 6

Heading west on Route 6 is a scenic delight. The roadway winds up and down, twisting side to side, with each fold of the roadway offering a new glimpse of rural life among the forestlands and farmlands of northern Pennsylvania.

In Smethport, turn off Route 6 to visit Old Town Smethport, located at 113 Water Street and the Old Jail Museum at 502 W. King Street. Old Town Smethport is a step back in time. See a real stagecoach up close, a Civil War cannon, and toys manufactured by Smethport Specialty Toys - the most famous being Wooly Willy. Painted holiday lawn ornaments from the original America's First Christmas Store are on display. America's First Christmas Store and the General Store both offer an opportunity to shop for unique collectibles and gift items. The Cottage House Restaurant located onsite offers food and beverages. If you love to explore haunted locations, tour the nearby Old Jail Museum, considered Pennsylvania's sixth most haunted place with a resident ghost in their dungeon!

Back on Route 6, enjoy the ride past the original McKean County Poor Farm, blueberry farms, and elk farms as your elevation reaches 2,240 feet in Mt. Jewett. Turn onto the Kinzua Scenic Byway to visit the Kinzua Sky Walk, located within the Kinzua Bridge State Park at 296 Viaduct Road, Mt. Jewett, PA. The Kinzua Sky Walk is "one of the top 10 most scenic skywalks in the world." Plan time to walk 624 feet out on the skywalk to view the Kinzua Gorge from a height of 225 feet through the partial glass floor. Then cruise back to Mt. Jewett, along Route 6, for ice cream at Lick N'Sip or Swedish breads at Kaffee Sol.

FROM LOBO WOLVES TO LOGYARD BREWS

Head west to the McCleery Wolf Center in Kane, PA. Take your photo with the statue of to save an endangered species - the Lobo Wolves. As you explore downtown, you will find the first brewpub, the Logyard Brewery. There are a variety of other eateries, wineries, and shops in Kane. Want to enjoy the beverages? We suggest staying overnight. Choices include the retro Kane Tourist Home & Motor Inn, Airbnbs on Fraley Street, and for a special treat, an overnight at the historic Kane Manor Inn.







MORE FLAVORS TO WET YOUR WHISTLE

Continuing your road trip, drive west on Route 6. New sites to explore include CJ Spirits Craft Distillery, the historic Olmsted Manor, and the Wilds Sonshine Factory, Tours of the Wilds Sonshine Factory highlight local agriculture and the distillery process which uses sunflower seeds. Loopback on Route 6 and take Route 321 North which is a section of the Longhouse National Scenic Byway. Then head east on Route 59, returning to Route 219. Plan a stop at the Penn Brad Oil Museum to learn about the rich history of the first million-dollar oil field and explore the replica oil derrick.

Back on the bike, return to Bradford, with a planned stop at the Bradford Brew Station for some music and craft brews named after the local oil field history. Staying overnight? The Best Western Bradford Inn is within walking distance of the brewery. Just north of town is Hay-Den, an Airbnb close to the intersection of Route 219 North.

Ten of the historic sites listed are part of the Collectible McKean County History Trail which features a fun series of collectible pins which would look great on your hat or jacket! For help planning your road trip, call 809-473-9370 or click on VisitANF.com.

DIGGING DEEP

Allegheny Valley Project Welcomes Visitors; Uncovers 800-Year-Old Smoking Pipe



ALLEGANY - Allegheny Valley Project (AVP) is back at Canticle Farm to continue its annual research into the history of the Allegheny River Valley. The village currently being studied was built around 1200 AD by ancestors of today's Seneca and other Iroquoian groups. Just this week, volunteer Bence Szita from Hungary uncovered a ceramic pipe fragment thought to be about 800 years old. Many other exciting archeological finds have been uncovered in past years at this dig site.

AVP is a nonprofit community archaeology program that brings people together for research and education in a hands-on environment. The organization works to protect and preserve the archaeological and historical heritage of the Allegheny River Valley and provides environmental education, advocacy, and preservation projects.

This season, the international Volunteers for Peace program returns after a three-year hiatus and welcomes volunteers from Germany, Taiwan, Mexico, Italy, Hungary, and The Netherlands. The international volunteers leave on July 22nd, but the project continues until July 29th.

"Visitors and volunteers are welcome whenever they can see people working at the site, behind the Canticle Farm Market," said Steven Paul Howard, director of AVP field work and field director at the Gault School of Archeological Research at Texas State University. "We are generally there from 9:00am to 3:30pm, but are sometimes earlier or later."

For those interested in seeing it firsthand, there is signage for a self-guided tour starting at Canticle Farm Market, 3809 Old State Road, Allegany, that is perfect for families and home school groups. Sara Baker Michalak's collages reflect the fluidity of form in the natural world and at the interfaces of the natural and built environments. She holds a BFA from RIT's School for American Crafts and an MA in Interdisciplinary Studies (Humanities/Geoscience) from SUNY Fredonia.

Sara Baker Michalak uses her art to explore the notion of change and continuity in her collage compositions. "To understand our own experience, I often look to the natural world. We observe the seasonal rhythms of rise/birth and fall/death, yet the repetitions and cycles that guarantee continuation: a wildflower rises from winter hibernation, grows to maturity and days back - after setting seed and promising life again. I convey this in our own experience using the fundamental elements of line, form, color, and space. I use additive techniques, layering in imagery as I go. The subtractive processes of sanding, scraping, and washing follow, serving to create the imagery that I'm after with only the essential remaining. My compositions express our experiences of time, too. The past, present, and future are sequential. But the wildflower in front of us embodies proof of its past here, and the potential for its future now.... is all time compressed into this very moment." - from her artist statement.




