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

New Bakery Coming Soon; Take the Survey to Give Your Opinion

One of the coolest things about life is when serendipity steps into your path. Serendipity: "The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way." So, Corey Hogan's law office (HoganWillig) in the plaza behind the Ellicottville Pharmacy was getting too small for the legal business they were attracting. Plus, they felt they needed more exposure with recognizable frontage. A larger space was needed, so Corey Hogan and his wife Jennifer took a scouting expedition through the village of Ellicottville visualizing where their next office might be located. They discovered that space was available in the mall across from Tops, next to Kwik Fill (5 Washington Street) but the space they were looking at was now too large for their needs.

A dilemma. They liked the location but had no use for something so sprawling. An idea struck. Perhaps there is a need in Ellicottville that they could fill utilizing this larger space? They browsed, they talked to people, they played with numbers, they took a deep breath and said, "an artisan bakery!" And then, Corey and Jennifer thought that fateful, ridiculous thought that so many business creators do when they haven't a clue of the Pandora's box they are opening but have the drive and faith to do something good and wonderful - and in their eyes - doable.

The thought? "How hard can it be to bake a loaf of bread?" Makes one think of another well-used expression, "Hold my beer and watch this!" Yep, it could go either way, but the couple was quite confident about their decision. They did their own surveying, talked to many people in similar activities in the community and plunged into plans, finally presenting them to the Village Board.

Talking with Corey and his marketing guy, Bo Sunshine (yes, that is his real name!) one can't help but get excited hearing the enthusiasm in their voices and their joy in filling a need in Ellicottville. They feel they are working with a win-win. They will have a larger space for the law office, now known as Tiveron Law, adjacent to the space which will house the new Ellicottville Bake Shop. Their excitement for the project seems to have no bounds. Having done their own market research, they now have a survey online https://www.ellicottvillebakeshop.com/survey/ which they ask would-be customers to fill out to give them a grassroots feel of the what the community would like to see in their Bake Shop.

Corey said his plans include top-notch equipment and talented people to create a bakery of consequence, using as many local ingredients and employees as are available to them. Local beekeepers, maple syrup makers, fruit and herb/spice growers should plan on reaching out to them. According to Bo Sunshine, the plan is to offer "handmade, fresh-baked loaves of artisanal bread made the traditional way," every morning they are open. "Pastries made from scratch including croissants, scones, muffins, fruit bars, macaroons and cookies. Unique, regional menu items will include Canadian butter tarts and NYC-style bialys." Here's one of the best parts for those rushing out to work in the morning without breakfast: "Made-to-order hot breakfast sandwiches and freshly ground locally sourced coffee will complement items on our bakery menu." They place great emphasis about items being sourced locally "for the best quality and greatest benefit to the community."

"Dennis was synonymous with the Rally in the Valley Olean - he was the heart and soul of the first Rally back in 2003 and it continued until his passing in 2016. Wayne, Dennis' brother-in-law was also a mainstay with both the organizing committee and the event staff of the Rally," added David "DJ" Dick, Rally organizer since the late 2000s and current member of the DW Dice Run committee.

The event has three ways for people to participate - sponsor, participant, and volunteer. Sponsorship forms have been out since March this year and the event has more than 50% of its \$11,000 sponsorship goal secure. There are two categories for sponsors: Johnston Leather level at \$100 and the Jones Chrome level at \$200. Please call the Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce at 716-372-4433 for sponsorship form or more information. To volunteer for this 'shaking' event, one needs to go online to bit.ly/46R9C73 or call the Chamber. There are three duties: drink servers, info tent and dice roll counters.

Meme K. Yanetsko, GOACC COO added, "This year's dice run has a twist - pick up your dice run roll card, visit the four or five stops throughout Cattaraugus/Allegany County anytime between August 13-18th, have the location stamp your card, and then on Saturday, August 19th you will roll the four/five times all at War Veterans Park."

The committee decided to give this option for several reasons: they can stop at the locations all in one day or break it up during the week; there is no particular order, so head to

In talking with the owner, he makes it very clear that this is a team offering. Owners Corey and Jennifer Hogan couldn't have pulled this off without the team of Marketing Specialist Bo Sunshine, Graphic Designer Amanda Acker, Engineer Jeff Minner, and Head Baker Mark Notarpole, who brings 45 years of experience to Ellicottville Bake Shop, including working as a Head Baker and Chef for the prestigious Walt Disney World Resorts in Orlando and as Head Baker at a prestigious southtown bakery and restaurant for eleven years. Rounding out the team is Ellicottville area native and Pastry Chef Katie Cummings. Katie attended Alfred State College, receiving a Baking Production and Management degree. Katie has held positions as a cake decorator, barista,

Core Performance: How Much Water Do You Need? Learning How to Stay Healthy & Hydrated

With the summer heat and air quality warnings, you'd think it would be quite obvious to most people that the best way to keep our bodies healthy and high functioning is to hydrate on a regular and steady basis. But as I have learned and am still overwhelmingly shocked at is how little people actually drink water. Our bodies are over two-thirds water. Which means, if we do not supply a constant source of water to our bodies, then transporting all the nutrients, hormones and even wastes through our bodies becomes difficult. Dehydration can occur without you even knowing it. For instance, if you feel thirsty, you are already on your way to being dehydrated. So let me list the top 10 reasons to drink more water...

1. Improved brain performance. Even mild dehydration - as little as 2% fluid loss - can affect memory, mood, concentration and reaction time. Adding just a few glasses of water to your daily intake can have a positive effect on cognitive, stabilize your emotions, and even combat feelings of anxiety.

2. Digestive harmony. Your body needs water in order to digest food properly. Without enough, you may experience irregular bowel movements, gas, bloating, heartburn, and other discomforts that can hurt your quality of life. Upping your fluid intake may help get things moving in the right direction again. It aids in breaking down soluble fiber from your diet to keep your digestion process on track.

3. More energy. Dehydration can slow down circulation and affect the flow of oxygen to your brain. A lack of fluids can also cause your heart to work harder to pump oxygen all throughout your body. All of that expended energy can make you feel tired, sluggish, and less focused. Simply by drinking more H2O, you'll prevent dehydration and have more pep to get you through the day.

4. Weight loss/management. Since it provides a sense of fullness, water can help you feel satisfied in between meals - instead of heading to the snack cupboard. It can also help boost your metabolism.

5. Decreased joint pain. Did you know the cartilage in our joints contains approximately 80% water? Staying hydrated helps your joints stay well-lubricated, which helps reduce friction by creating more of a "cushion" between the bones. Less friction means smoother-moving joints and fewer aches and pains.

6. Better temperature regulation. Research shows that when you're dehydrated, your body stores more heat. This in turn lowers your ability to tolerate hot temperatures. Drinking plenty of water helps you produce sweat when you're overheated during activity, which in turn cools your body down. This built-in cooling mechanism is critical in preventing heat stroke and other potentially deadly heat-related conditions.

7. Kidney stone prevention. Kidney stones are clumps of mineral crystals that form in the urinary tract. If you've ever experienced one, you know how painful they can be. Consuming adequate amounts of water each day can help dilute the concentration of minerals in your urinary tract and makes stone less likely. Water also helps flush harmful bacteria from your bladder and can aid in preventing urinary tract infections (UTIs).

8. Healthier heart. Your blood is made up largely of H2O. When you don't drink enough glasses of water, it becomes concentrated, which can cause an imbalance of vital minerals (electrolytes). These minerals, like potassium and sodium, are key to the proper functioning of your heart.

9. Improved detoxification. Sufficient water intake supports your body's natural detoxification systems, which remove waste and harmful substances through urination, breathing, perspiration, and bowel movements. Supporting your own powerful, built-in detox processes can help enhance your overall health.

10. Fewer headaches. Even a mild fluid loss can cause the brain to contract away from the skull, leading to headaches and migraines in some individuals. Being consistently well-hydrated may help keep head pain in check.

How much water do you need? If you want to prevent dehydration, it's as easy as incorporating more water and water-rich foods into your diet. Eight glasses a day is an easy rule to remember and a good general target. You can also use the body weight formula: take one-third of your body's weight and drink that number of ounces in fluids. For example, if you weigh 150 pounds, aim to drink 50 ounces of water each day. Certain situations will require you to drink more water to maintain good hydration. These include physical activity and exercise, hot and/or humid weather, and occasions when you are vomiting or have diarrhea. Every person's hydration requirements are different, depending on



factors like medical history, health conditions, and any medications being taken.

While plain water is best for staying hydrated, other drinks and foods can help, too. Water can be found in fruits and vegetables (for example, watermelon, tomatoes, and lettuce) and in soup broths. Fruit and vegetable juices, milk, and herbal teas add to the amount of water you get each day. Just make sure to limit sugary drinks that are high in calories. Sports drinks can be helpful if you're planning on exercising at a higher than normal level and for more than an hour. They contain carbohydrates and electrolytes that can be used as energy. However, some sports drinks are high in calories from added sugar. They can also contain high levels of sodium (salt). Check the serving size since often times one bottle is more than one serving.

Energy drinks are not the same as sports drinks. These typically contain large amounts of caffeine and other ingredients like guarana, ginseng or taurine which your body does not need. Most of these drinks are high in sugar and should be kept out of the hands of children. These drinks are NOT a good source of hydration.

If staying hydrated is difficult for you, here are some things I suggest to my clients: 1. Keep a water bottle with you at all times during the day - driving, sitting at your desk, or lounging in the sun.

2. If you do not like the taste of plain water, try adding lemon or lime slices.

- 3. Drink water before, during and after a workout.
- 4. When you're hungry, drink water. Thirst is often confused with hunger.

5. If you have trouble remembering to drink water, drink on a schedule. For example, drink water when you wake up, at breakfast, lunch, dinner and when you go to bed.

ART ON THE TRAILS

"Sculpture Alley" Debuts on the Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail in Springville



SPRINGVILLE — Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail (ECRT) is showing its artistic side in the Village of Springville. In partnership with Springville Center for the Arts, ECRT commissioned Bennington sculptor J. Brian Pfeiffer of A Sculptor's Soul Studio to create the inaugural two sculptures for "Sculpture Alley", a section of ECRT just north of Franklin Street behind the Peerless Winsmith building. "Incorporating materials reflecting this area's industrial past into art along this section of the trail is a creative way to enhance the outdoor experience here," said Seth Wochensky, Executive Director of Springville Center for the Arts, and originator of the "Sculpture Alley" concept in Springville. "The goal of 'Sculpture Alley' is to bring interactive art into an outdoor environment that is accessible to all," said Mary Brummer, President of Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail. ECRT is a multi-use recreational trail on the corridor of the former Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad. The trail is open to all free of charge 365 days per year from dawn until dusk.

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J. Brian Pfeiffer has created two sculptures using his favored medium of poured concrete over a rebar frame. The first sculpture is an abstract figure of a traveler sitting on a platform next to a suitcase which holds a spinnable sphere painted as a world map. The figure is positioned as if peering down the tracks awaiting the arrival of a train. The second sculpture is a tall form with a spherical base from which emerges a straight shaft topped by a colorful disc, echoing historic railroad signaling gear. The art pieces are mounted on either side of the trail some distance from each other, so they may be appreciated as the trail user approaches and passes each one. The art is meant to be engaging and interactive, as people are invited to linger with the works and to touch them.

The two sculptures were installed at the "Sculpture Alley" site in late July and were celebrated on August 4th as members of Erie Cattaraugus Rail Trail and Springville Center for the Arts gathered to thank J. Brian Pfeiffer for the creativity and sparkle that these works bring to the trail. As children climbed on one of the sculptures, Brian Pfeiffer noted, "To have an adult contemplate my artwork is wonderful, but to have a child run up to one of my sculptures and make it part of their adventure in that moment - now that is the ultimate reward!"


