WNYMBA's Campout Weekend at HoliMont Promises a Truly Unique Adventure

If you're already a member of the Western New York Mountain Bicycling Association (WNYMBA), you've probably had August 12-14 circled on your calendar since the start of the summer. If you're a mountain biking enthusiast of any skill level and you haven't heard about WNYMBA's upcoming Campout Weekend, you've got to be asking yourself, "Why am I not part of one of the great events of the year and how can I join this welcoming community of riders?"

Folks headed to the organization's annual campout this year can look forward to a familyfriendly 'festival atmosphere,' with campers, live bands, food and beverage vendors, a mobile service trailer and outdoor lifestyle-related vendors - all before you even get on your bike!

"We are really excited to have HoliMont take on the responsibility of offering us the unique experience of being able to ride traditional cross-country trails, and for the very first time, we will have access to lift-serviced downhill mountain biking in the same setting," said WNYMBA President Jacob Bodway. "With the emergence of HoliMont on the downhill mountain-biking scene, we're thrilled to be able to collaborate with them to provide a special atmosphere for everyone - no matter what their skill level may be.'

With more than 30 miles of the best single-track mountain bicycling trails to be found anywhere, right here in the McCarty Hill and Little Rock City State Forests, there'll be plenty of cross-country riding options - but the true gem of the weekend's activities will undoubtedly center around HoliMont's new bike park and an experience you're unlikely to find without a 5-hour drive somewhere else - lift-serviced downhill mountain biking!

"We're thrilled to partner with WNYMBA for this event," said HoliMont's Snowsports Director Travis Widger. "We've had a link to the (cross country) trail system here for 20 years. We're happy that our bike park adds something to the scene.

The bottom of the Sunset Chairlift will provide the epicenter of the weekend's activities, as RVs and campers will park in the overflow lot and tents will pop up around the base of the lift. Live bands are scheduled to fill the evening air with music both Friday and Saturday nights, with The Dark Water Duo taking the stage Friday, Aug. 12 and Olmstead Dub System providing the entertainment on Saturday evening. Throughout the weekend, participants will find Carson's BBQ, Ellicottville's Bike & Bean, and 42 North Brewing's "Tap Trekker" mobile distribution center to provide alternate food and beverage options to the standard camping fare.

Also in the Sunset Chairlift area, campers and riders can stop in to the Loud Performance Bike & Board Shop's mobile repair and rental station, where owner Dee Dippel and his staff can fix what you broke, or get you on a different ride and right back on the trails!

"I'm really looking forward to the campout," Dippel said. "HoliMont's bike park is a fantastic addition to our area - there's really nothing like it in the region."

Dippel's Bemus Point location is a hub for mountain biking activity. His shop not only sells and services bikes (and snowboards in the winter), he also built 7 miles of his own mountain bike trails right behind the store! "We try to get everybody riding, from beginner all the way up," Dippel said. "That's the nice thing about our trails - they're not too steep, they're not too rocky. We really want people to feel comfortable going out into the woods on bikes.'







## MEETING NOTES

Village Board: Village Park a big topic; parking congestion, skatepark construction, pool discussed

The busy Village Park was a key topic during the July 26th meeting of the Ellicottville Village Board.

Village Board members discussed a recent successful groundbreaking ceremony for the \$550,000 skatepark construction project, but officials noted numerous events have brought crowds, and along with them traffic problems and bottlenecks as recreationists park their vehicles on both sides of Parkside Drive.

After some discussion it was agreed to place signs prohibiting parking on the south side of Parkside Drive, from the park entrance to Fillmore Drive, to prevent traffic jams. Also, the perimeter fence will be moved back from Parkside Drive to make room for diagonal parking.

Possibilities for a pool or a splash pad on the site of the former ice rink were raised by Village Clerk Mary Klahn, who has fielded requests from residents. The idea of an expansion of park facilities and athletic fields nearby was brought up by Village Engineer Ben Slotman, to accommodate more participants. He suggested requesting proposals from design firms to have something in the works for future development.

Mayor John Burrell pointed out that support for a pool should come from the surrounding communities, whose residents use the park facilities and who must pay a \$10 fee for children to swim three hours at Holiday Valley. He asked the Board members to think about the pool concept for a month and in August a committee could be formed to study the issue.

The Board also discussed skatepark construction that is set to begin soon, anticipating the possibility of a "strong public response" when five large trees will be taken down. Village Engineer Ben Slotman said he is holding a pre-construction meeting with the contractors. He assured Board members that the trees are in poor condition and the removal cost is contained within the contractor's fee.

The Taste of Ellicottville and the Jazz and Blues Festival special event applications were approved, but the Board refused to waive its open container law to allow two distilleries, a winery and a brewery - all holding farm licenses and partnering with food vendors - to offer tastings during afternoon hours of the Taste of Ellicottville, Aug. 13-14th. Officials said they were told the request was made because this had been done in the past.

Special Events Committee Chairman Doug Bush said Ellicottville is often compared with

East Aurora, where there is no open container law. However, after researching the legalities, he said it is clear that the Village can't contradict its own open container law without an amendment procedure and permission from the State Liquor Authority. There isn't enough time before the scheduled event.

"If we did it before, we did it wrong," Burrell said, adding that the Town is currently the enforcement agency and would have to agree to send any amendments to the State.

Bush also updated the Board on funding options for the Mill Street parking lot property. He said the Cattaraugus County Legislature has found no grants to pay for construction of the parking lot, but the County may be able to fund it, along with reimbursing the Village for costs of preliminary drawings.

On another front, the Village has more than two years to provide the Cattaraugus County Health Department with an inventory of all water service lines containing lead, copper or galvanized pipes under new EPA regulations for community water systems. In announcing the new directive, Burrell expressed doubt that there are many lead, copper or galvanized pipes because most of the older homes in the village have been remodeled and those materials aren't used in new construction.

Village Engineer Ben Slotman said some of the needed information is already recorded because his department has started taking notes while servicing the water lines. He suggested taking the inventory in winter when property owners are more likely to be in town, and doing needed inspections of aging meters at the same time. He added that the Town of Ellicottville's \$7 million water system upgrade will soon be getting underway and is another opportunity to identify and remove service lines that are out of compliance with the new rules.

Burrell said at this stage he will not approve digging to find lead pipes, and the Health Department isn't asking for a replacement plan yet. The inventory must be sent to the Health Department by Oct. 16, 2024.

The Board briefly discussed potholes and ongoing problems with the Mill Street railroad bridge underpass. On Aug. 22nd a contractor will be on-site with an excavator and will be placing new material beneath the underpass and on Mill Street. The County Public Works

#### Cattaraugus County IDA: Ellicottville Greens Seeks Local Headquarters

The Cattaraugus County Industrial Development Agency is poised to review an application for a state sales tax abatement and payment-in-lieu-of-tax deal (PILOT) for an intensive container-gardening project at a leased rural Ellicottville location. The company has been supplying the area and the region with food for the past four years.

Ellicottville Greens and Vertical Fresh Farms founder and CEO Gabriel Bialkowski, appearing in a Zoom connection during the IDA's recent monthly meeting, told the CCIDA Board of Directors that Ellicottville Greens supplies the county's schools, the Seneca Allegany Casino and area restaurants with leafy greens, microgreens and baby greens.

The company intends to place ten 40'x8' shipping container "gardens," along with a permanent steel barn for production, cold storage and packaging, on two leased acres at 6902 Simmons Road. It plans to spend \$720,000 setting up the new location as a first phase, he said, with intentions to make it a headquarters to showcase an eventual distribution hub to market, not only greens, but also to find future operators of container gardens under the Vertical Fresh Farms name.

The company's slogan is "Locally Grown Everywhere" and aims to set up satellite operations in other locations to grow and supply it with more produce. Bialkowski said it will be the management partner with a financing entity which will bring the real estate and capital. Any of the Western New York sites, however, will be owned and remotely monitored directly by the company, he added.

Ellicottville Greens spent its first year in research and development on leased property nearby on Witch Hollow Road, then moved several containers to a temporary location on steep recreational property on Bear Creek Road in Machias, before settling on its current location in Clarence for six garden containers at the Transit Road spot behind the Eastern Hills Mall.

"Now we are looking to officially launch in Ellicottville and we have had site preparation and a showcase to investors and partners," said Bialkowski.

The facility will team with the proposed 5 megawatt Simmons Road solar farm planning

to lease another portion of the same 91-acre parcel. According to Cattaraugus County's real property records, the hilltop site is vacant farmland near Bryant Hill Road and has been owned by John C. Metz of West Palm Beach since 2017.

The solar project, if approved, would be the town's first and was the topic of discussions in 2021 at Town Planning Board meetings as Borrego Solar. Developers withdrew the application and in June submitted a new request for a special use permit and site plan review for "less than 25 megawatts of energy" under a different case number that, according to drafted meeting minutes, was deemed incomplete.

At that time Borrego's consultant, Marathon Engineering, stated the project will be sold after approval, the firm had not completed glare and line-of-sight studies and indicated the site contains a federal wetland. The town requested a third-party bonds, escrow deposit and decommissioning arrangements.

The matter was listed as a discussion item on the Planning Board's July 25th agenda and earlier in the month Town officials said they were working with legal consultants to finalize the Host Community Agreement. Marathon said the project is third in line to be connected to the electric grid, a necessary step for operations. The current status of the project could not be confirmed by press time, however.

"Electric is our second biggest cost besides labor," said Bialkowski, who suggested some funding may be available for solar farm partnerships from RechargeNY.

CCIDA Director Corey Wiktor said he expects the Town Planning Board review to be final in three weeks and that the Town Board is generally agreeable. He added that he planned to schedule a public hearing on the CCIDA application within several days. Borrego developers had requested a Planning Board public hearing in August and the project may be referred to the Cattaraugus County Planning Board after that. Wiktor said he does not anticipate the need for an environmental review.







Explore the Allegheny National Forest: Foraging for Food ... Where to Eat Like a Local

Where to eat? This is the question everyone asks themselves on a daily or weekly basis. Of course, here in the Allegheny National Forest there are those who can describe which mushrooms, plants, bugs, and berries will make a meal. This article is for those who want to "forage" through Google listings to find a new restaurant to try. This article will provide great ideas of nearby Pennsylvania restaurants which are worth the trip!

#### PORT ALLEGANY, PENNSYLVANIA

Port Allegany is a small community located along the Allegheny River in Pennsylvania. It is known for its creative Serenity Glass Park, summer concerts on the town square, and Lynn Hall - a beautifully restored example of American Modernism architecture.

Eddie's on Main offers a regular lunch and dinner menu with many specials plus theme night dinners. Chef Ed Vicic really enjoys cooking food, talking about food, and being creative with food. Currently, Thursday is Rib Night starting at 4:00pm. Order their "finger licking and bone sucking good" pork ribs cooked St. Louis style with a dry rub. #### SMETHPORT, PENNSYLVANIA

Smethport, Pennsylvania is the county seat for McKean County. Built by the Lumber Barons of days gone by in the 1880s, Smethport's Main Street is lined with a series of architectural gems including over 30 mansions from the late 1800s and early 1900s. A self-guided walking tour brochure may be picked up at the kiosk in front of the Courthouse. Nearby, Hamlin Lake offers fishing, kayaking, and canoeing. The Sheffield Trail System is an easy walking/biking trail which goes past farm fields and the original county Poor House.

After seeing the sites, head to Old Time Smethport to shop their General Store, America's First Christmas Store, and view artifacts including a historic, full-size stagecoach and Civil War Canon.

Dine at their Cottage House Restaurant & Winery, open for both lunch and dinner. Have dessert first! No one will tell! Delicious desserts are just some of the menu items you can enjoy. For lunch have a glass of wine with an iceberg wedge salad or chow down with a beer and a hearty burger. Lunch is an assortment of local favorites including Buffalo chicken wraps and Philly Steak sandwiches. 

Core Performance: Add Sea Salt for Hydration + More Benefits

During the hot and humid days of summer, I have found that drinking water alone has not been able to quench my thirst. Sports drinks are designed to replenish sodium and potassium for athletes who do a moderate to high intensity workout of 60 minutes or longer each day. Unfortunately, sports energy drinks are also high in sugar and food dyes and drinking more than 1 serving a day can increase the risk of diabetes and other health conditions. According to the Gatorade website, a 20-ounce serving of Gatorade contains 140 calories and 36 grams of carbohydrates, with 34 grams of carbohydrates coming straight from sugar. One serving size is 8 oz. of Gatorade (the smallest bottle sold).

So I started researching ways to stay hydrated and discovered numerous articles about the benefits of adding sea salt to your water. Did you know that high-quality sea salt has 84 trace minerals that nourish and strengthen our body? We used to be able to get enough minerals from the food we eat. However, with monocropping and improper farming methods, our soil has been depleted of these essential minerals and doesn't provide the nutrients to our food like it used to.

So, what's the difference between sea salt and table salt? Sea salt comes from ocean water or saltwater lakes, full of healthy minerals, and is made with little processing. Table salt, on the other hand, comes from underground salt and is heavily processed to remove healthy minerals.

While there are many different varieties, these are the two most common types of salt that's unrefined and minimally processed:

- Celtic sea salt is gray, and sometimes purplish. It has a high percentage of magnesium than other sea salts, in addition to 34 trace minerals.
- Pink in color, Himalayan sea salt is rich in iron and can have as many as 84 trace minerals. It's mined by extracting natural salt deposits from the mountains.

Because of these essential nutrients, here are some of the top sea salt health benefits:

1. Keeps you hydrated: Contrary to popular belief, sea salt is extremely beneficial in keeping us hydrated. The amount of nutrients in sea salt also satisfies our thirst for a longer period of time and keeps us holding on to the fluids for longer. However, with real sea salt, the opposite happens because of its balanced ratio of minerals especially potassium and sodium which help release retained water. Eating real food and salting your own food with sea salt will help eliminate bloat and water retention.
- **3. Balances electrolytes:** Because of its amazing mineral content, electrolytes in salt include magnesium, calcium, potassium, and sodium. These electrolytes are vital for muscle, brain and heart health because of its critical role in the nervous system. Instead of the typical sugar-filled electrolyte drinks you can find at the supermarket, try adding sea salt to water with a squeeze of lemon juice.
- **4. Prevents muscle cramps:** When your electrolytes are low, you can experience muscle soreness, cramps, charley horse, and even restless leg syndrome. The lack of minerals keeps the muscles from relaxing and causes contractions that are out of your control. This is why Epsom sea salt baths are recommended for any kind for muscle fatigue. The magnesium in Epsom salt plays a huge role in loosening and calming the muscles and your entire body. If you know you'll be doing a strenuous activity, make sure to add sea salt to your water before and after to replenish your body with the minerals that it loses during the exercise. Sea salt baths can also help with muscle cramps!
- **5. Great for skin health:** Because of its potent mineral content, sea salt has anti-inflammatory properties that are beneficial for skin health. There are many beauty products that use sea salt because it has the power to detoxify the skin while exfoliating, increasing circulation, and providing the skin with nutrients. Sea salt has been shown to be especially beneficial for acne, psoriasis, eczema, and anti-aging.
- **6. Improves digestion:** Sea salt is necessary in the role of digestion, and it starts in the mouth. The salivary amylase, an enzyme which helps break down carbohydrates in the saliva, is activated by the flavor of salt. Also, salt plays a huge role in the making of hydro-

Loud Performance also sponsors regular group rides (including kids' rides) and is the site for a bicycle instructor certification program.

While amongst the vendors' tents, campers looking for a unique memento of the event would do well to seek out the friendly, flaming hot chicken wing logo of Greg Culver's Hot Wings Designs tent, where they'll find the artist's creative and humorous original illustrations of rock and roll icons, local sports heroes and the fiery chicken wing on Culver's line of apparel, fun stickers and accessories.

For smaller events, Culver says he has the capability of producing on-demand, custom-designed t-shirts featuring his artwork. "People love sitting and watching you make their shirts - I think it adds to the experience of the event," Culver said.

A lifelong member of the mountain biking community in WNY, Culver applauded the return of the annual WNYMBA Campout to the HoliMont Ski Club saying, "The event first started at HoliMont and yes, it's a campout, but it's really exciting to see there will be that 'festival atmosphere' again."

Event organizers "strongly advise" pre-registration for the campout. If you're interested, go to booking.holimont.com. If you are not already a member of the WNYMBA community, the cost for the entire weekend of camping will be \$100. For non-members who are unable to commit to the entire weekend of camping, a day pass is available at the cost of \$50 for one night of camping and lift access. The cost for the entire weekend of camping and lift-access is \$80 for IMBA members. Day passes for members cost \$40 for one night of camping and lift-access. Children under the age of 18 can camp for free with a parent/guardian who has purchased a camping pass; however, they still have to purchase a lift ticket if they want to ride.

The 30-year-old WNYMBA organization is comprised of more than 350 mountain bikers and hikers who form a community of all skill levels and ages, and are dedicated to working together to create and maintain trails in the Western New York region. Regular trail maintenance work days get scheduled and group members turn out to leaf blow, rake, tamp and clear debris from trails - this is the fairly visible function WNYMBA members perform.

Bodway explained the importance of the association's other main function - a slightly less-visible role WNYMBA members play - that of securing riding access to some of the most beautiful terrain this region has to offer.

"We work hard with land managers and other stakeholders to create and maintain our trail systems," Bodway said. "It's truly a community-building effort (and hard work) to form the long-term relationships necessary for securing trail access into the future. We think Western New York is on the cusp of creating something special and the mountain bike community is in the vanguard of the movement."

Loud Performance's Dippel describes membership in the organization in this way: "We're the ones going out there building bridges, maintaining trails, building new trails and getting access to the places you want to ride."

Certainly, you don't have to ride a bike to realize that a well-maintained trail through the woods is your easiest path and fastest track to all the glory of being outside in a beautiful natural setting. But no matter what skill level you currently find yourself at, if you like riding a mountain bike, it's easy to see how you'd want to be a part of the WNYMBA community.

chloric acid, which is secreted in the stomach for the breakdown of food, especially protein. Most people are insufficient in hydrochloric acid, and this can cause numerous digestive issues like bloating, gas, heartburn, indigestion, and can eventually lead to leaky gut and chronic disease.

- **7. Nourishes the adrenal glands:** Adrenal fatigue of varying degrees is extremely common today, resulting from stress and poor diet. With adrenal insufficiency, one of the main symptoms is salt cravings. This is because the body is craving the nutrients it needs from sea salt. Among their numerous demanding functions, our adrenal glands release hormones that regulate sodium and potassium in the body. So how much sea salt should you consume each day? Most experts agree that adding ¼ teaspoon of Celtic or Himalayan Pink Sea Salt per quart of water (4-5 glasses) is best. These salts are readily available locally at Ellicottville Salt Cave. I recommend drinking this water prior to eating and after to support the digestive process.

crews will follow up with binder.

Slotman told the Board work is being done to try to address drainage problems in the underpass and on the adjacent hill. He said it was discovered that a culvert and a railroad ditch had been filled in long ago. Also, an outlet to an "underdrain" can't be located. Mayor Burrell commented that the railroad is not doing a good job maintaining its drainage.

In a related matter, Burrell said the Village Clerk received a complaint from Brent Martin, who asked for reimbursement in repairing a leaf spring he claimed was broken on July 24th when he drove through a pothole in the area of the Mill Street underpass. In an email dated July 26th, Martin said the Village should be responsible because Mill Street's conditions have remained poor and in need of permanent repair for a length of time. Burrell stated Martin then must have known of the road condition, adding the Village attorney advised the Village that they don't make these kinds of reparations.

Village Trustee Ed Imhoff attended his final meeting. He has resigned his post because he is moving out of the Village and is no longer eligible to serve. "I'm leaving reluctantly," said Imhoff as the meeting was adjourned and Board members thanked him for his service. "It's been a pleasure," he added. Mayor Burrell introduced Imhoff's appointed successor, Jolie Newpher, who was in attendance.

#### In other business:

- Burrell said he attended the Village Ambulance Board of Directors meeting July 6th, where he learned that a new ambulance will be delivered before winter, but there is still a need for volunteers.
- The village will prepare an application for a NY Forward public/private program grant, with preliminary applications due Aug. 10th.
- A single auto dealer, West Herr, submitted bids July 1st for 2022 trucks, with the half-ton extended cab in stock and the 3500 regular cab dump truck and plow which would have to be ordered.

Wiktor told the Board vertical container farming is "power-intensive" and the location is a "unique spot" for a solar project "not readily seen from the road." He added that the solar energy would be fed into the National Grid substation about five miles east in Franklinville and the site would be the kind chosen if the Town designates a solar development zone.

Ellicottville Greens presents a "unique opportunity" and by 2023 will be farming at additional locations," Wiktor added.

"We look at this as a great location, we love the green space, and the restaurants, and the customers buying from us for many years," said Bialkowski. "We love the solar field to showcase what is possible down there, and with startups and innovations (solar energy) will kick it off further."

According to Ellicottville Greens' application, construction could start as early as September 1st, ending one year later. Occupancy will begin in December. Once underway, the Simmons Road project will add 8 full-time and 2 part-time positions, for a \$87,500 payroll at an hourly rate of \$15-22. Twice-weekly deliveries of fresh greens will be carried from Simmons Road in cargo vans.

In another matter, Wiktor updated the Board on his research into commercial solar projects to determine true local benefits before a six-month moratorium can be lifted. He said energy savings from the Olean-area solar arrays have been tallied at \$80,000 to \$100,000 (as opposed to the \$90,000 to \$120,000 promised before approval) for the hosts of DQ Energy, Solean and Solean West, as well as the city of Olean and St. Bonaventure hosts. One of the projects was higher, he said.

Wiktor was asked by the Board to collect figures on the total usage the plants are producing to compare the benefits. In addition, he said, West Valley Solar puts out 10 megawatts and was built by DQ Energy through NYSERDA on the former Nuclear Fuels Reprocessing Center site. He added that NYSERDA is advertising another request for proposals for a 20 megawatt facility on the property.

He said he has learned that it's difficult to realize the promised 10% savings on community based solar projects because the public is not signing up to cut energy bills by \$8 a month. This results in a lower obligation by the solar purveyor. Some communities insist projects be placed on brownfields only and there are policy options to require labor and suppliers come from the local area.

Board member Ginger Schroeder commented that community solar benefits are divided differently. Tax exemptions are only realized when taxing authorities opt out, but if they don't opt out, it's tax free (to the developer). She said local officials think that if they don't opt out they are not giving up power to the county. She pressed for education of host communities because they think the PILOT will be higher and because agreements are binding even if the project isn't built for many years.

After research on the costs of maintaining and repairing equipment damaged by this type of waste, along with an inability to accurately assess the weight of a load without the use of a truck scale and after careful consideration to minimize taxpayer costs, it was determined that limiting collection to this site was in the best interest of the residents of the County.

The materials Salamanca can accept are: shingles, wood waste, drywall, insulation, vinyl siding, and fixtures (doors/windows). Salamanca cannot accept concrete, gravel, soil, pavers, millings, asphalt, or asbestos. All loads will be checked for contamination and/or excluded materials by a transfer station operator. All loads will be required to travel over to the scale to accurately weigh the load before off-loading. Once the deposit is complete the empty vehicle will return to the scale to weigh out and the tipping fee will be based on the net weight of the load.

For your convenience or option, Casella (Olean); L&R Roll-Off, Inc. (Freedom) and County Line Recovery (Ashford) may also accept construction and demolition debris.

The NYSDEC website also provides a listing of alternate Material Recovery Facilities that will accept concrete, gravel, soil, pavers, millings and asphalt.
