





Classic Cars, Pin-up Girls and Elvis... What More Could You Want?

Although the Ellicottville Chamber of Commerce hosts several festivals and events each year, Brian McFadden, chamber executive director, says Rock n' Roll Weekend is a favorite of Ellicottville locals, though it draws many visitors, too! The last event of the summer, Rock n' Roll Weekend takes place from September 15-17th, and there's something for everyone to enjoy. From live music to classic cars to a pin-up contest, each day of the event celebrates the best of a bygone era while incorporating something new!

For music lovers, this is a must-attend event, as 15 regional bands will be performing throughout Ellicottville's bars and restaurants, all free of charge. On Saturday, Queen tribute band "Queen City" will be performing live outdoors at 1:00pm, and on Sunday, local favorite Terry Buchwald will be performing as Elvis at 1:30pm. Both concerts are free of charge.

On Sunday, the annual car show, which typically includes over 200 vehicles, takes place from noon-5:00pm. McFadden said, "We have a team from out of town that comes in to do the judging, and they also help promote the event. We have participants from New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and southern Ontario."

A unique feature of this car show is that all vehicles are parked in category order: eight categories, one per block. Categories include Classic (all stock vehicles from 1960-1989), Late Model (all stock vehicles from 1990 and later), Sports Cars, Rods, Convertibles, Custom, Trucks, and Antique. Registration is open now at ellicottvilleny.com. "We always sell out," said McFadden. "There are only so many cars allowed in each class because space is limited. Once a class is full, we take it off the website."

McFadden noted another unusual feature about the car show that draws many visitors. "We're one of the few regional car shows that's set up in the business district," he said. "Most are in a field or a large parking lot. Here, the ladies and families like to come, too! They can go for lunch, go shopping, and you don't have to walk far to do that." McFadden reminds visitors that this is a family-friendly event, and Ellicottville does have an open-container law.

This year's event includes the 2nd Annual Ms. EVL Rock & Roll pinup contest at the gazebo on Sunday, September 17th. Alicia Pearl of Ava Grace Fashions will be hosting the event, which is one of several she has organized over the years. While Pearl has participated as a contestant in past pinup contests, her true passion is hosting them. "I really like that our event gives a platform to ladies who don't necessarily do this all of the time," she said.

So what exactly is a pinup contest? "Basically, it's like a pageant where women show off their vintage style," Pearl explained. "Some people confuse it with a 'centerfold,' but that's not what it is at all! Everyone is fully clothed. My kids will be there," Pearl laughed. "Think 'old Hollywood!" All contestants must be at least 18 years of age and

identify as female. As this is a vintage pinup contest, 1930s to 1950s attire is recommended. Though the outfit doesn't need to actually be vintage, the look and overall style should suit the time period. Props such as gloves, glasses, jewelry, small handheld items, and more are acceptable.

The goal of the contest is to help women feel good about themselves and feel celebrated – both of which are important to mental health. Toward that end, the pinup contest helps raise money for the National Alliance on Mental Illness and Out of the Darkness Walk, a local chapter in Cattaraugus County. Those who register for the contest are asked to bring an item for the silent auction in addition to their \$10 entry fee. Proceeds will benefit NAMI and Out of the Darkness. To register, stop by Ava Grace Fashions or go online to bit.ly/3YWHhIX.

Pre-registration is from 11:00-11:30am at the gazebo, and the contest begins at noon. There will be first, second and third place winners of the contest, and the first place winner will receive a two-night stay in Ellicottville. The silent auction will be held from 11:30am-1:00pm; winners will be announced just after the crowning of Ms. EVL Rock & Roll.



#### **BIGFOOT PARK GOLF**

Ellicottville Bartender Swinging into the Recreation Scene with New Adventure

If you've been to Ellicottville even once, you know that we've got skiing/boarding in the winter and in the summer we have biking, hiking and golf. But you know what we don't have? A Park Golf course. (Actually, there are only a few in the whole U.S., and not many people are familiar.) So what is Park Golf and why is it important to Ellicottville?

Chad Neal, Ellicottville native and long-time Madigan's bartender, is beginning his first business venture by creating a Park Golf park next to the Ellicottville Distillery on Robbins Road. He took the time to talk with ellicottvilleNOW about this unique and fun outdoor game, his motivation to introduce it to Ellicottville, and when we can expect to be hitting the green to play!

"It's called Park Golf. Mine is called Bigfoot Park Golf," said Chad. "It's similar to traditional golf and mini golf. It's a Japanese invention using smaller amounts of land. The fairways are shorter and the holes and balls are bigger. And there's only one club, which is like a mallet. The head is like a driver but the angle and length are smaller. There are 18 holes to play. (Though a typical round of park golf is just 9 holes.) There are only a couple of these parks in the U.S. right now, and the flagship is in Akron, New York called Destroyer Park Golf."

Chad came up with the idea of making a course in Ellicottville two years ago when he and his sons were returning from Destroyer Park Golf. "We all thought it was a lot of fun!" he said. "I started seeking out property. I finally found a great spot at the Ellicottville Distillery just outside of the village. I officiated Bryan and Renee Scharf's wedding there and saw it was perfect for what I wanted to do. I asked Bryan about it and he and his father Don thought it might be a good idea. As spring came along I started working on the land to make it course-worthy. I box scraped it and rolled it to make it less choppy. It was a meadow that had been tilled so it took some work. I brush hogged it several times to get it looking like a large lawn. I've been building holes and tee boxes and flags and many other things mainly alone, but with help as well."

Almost nine holes are completed so far, and Chad admits that it's been a "one step forward two steps back" experience. "I've been a student of trial and error a lot during the process, but I love it! My goal is to have a grand opening next spring, but to have it playable this fall"

Cost of admission and other fine details are currently being considered. To help keep costs affordable, Chad is currently looking for sponsors to help with the park's creation and said that those who hop onboard with sponsorship will be recognized "in a really cool way".

"I am currently in the process of drafting sponsorship letters to send to businesses," said Chad. "Sponsorships will include advertising on the tee box sign, flag and in the scorecard." In other words, your sponsorship means you'll have one of the holes named after you/your business. What a wonderful way our businesses can support each other!

Park golf is a game for all ages and abilities, though it is an outdoor sport in a grass field and walking is required. It's less aggravating than the traditional version of the sport, as the ball doesn't fly too far, so it's less likely to get lost, but still provides a challenge and plenty of entertainment. "I've gone up to Destroyer Park Golf a bunch of times with my kids; they love it and it's a great way to spend time together. I think more families could use that opportunity, so I thought with the community's help, we can do that out here in Ellicottville."

Chad admits that it's a lot of work, but well worth it. "I've been bartending at Madigan's going on 28 years now and I love my job there, but I felt I needed more, something of my own. And this idea came and I've been pursuing it headstrong. I've been working diligently any chance I get to build Bigfoot Park Golf and it's coming together slowly but surely. I believe Ellicottville needs more reasons for visitors to enjoy themselves. We are always doing new things here and I think this will be a hit amongst not only tourists but the locals as well."

Our conversation ended with Chad stating, "I've never worked this hard for something that is mine and it is a great journey I am taking on my own. The help I get from my friends and family is grand as well, and I want to be a part of the local business community. As I make mistakes and figure out problems as I build Bigfoot Park Golf at the Ellicottville Distillery, I find solace knowing I am making something... quite big, too!"

Application Window for Cattaraugus County Non-profits Now Open

OLEAN - Applications for the next cycle of grant funding from the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation's Community Fund are due October 15th.

The Community Fund makes possible unrestricted, responsive grantmaking to support projects and initiatives led by nonprofit organizations that impact the changing needs of Cattaraugus County residents. Applicants must be 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organizations or a government entity or school district.

CRCF's board reviews applications based on the applying organization's stability, the impact its work has on the community, the feasibility of the project proposed in the grant application and the role a grant from the Community Fund would play in the overall project, said CRCF Executive Director Kirk Windus.

In the most recent Community Fund grant cycle, the CRCF board of directors approved \$11,340 in grants for projects that supported educational programming at Cattaraugus County libraries, upgraded handicap accessibility at an area food pantry, summer camp sponsorships for disadvantaged area youth, hygiene kits for those in area homeless shelters and more.



#### Singer/Songwriter Gary Allan Returns to Seneca Allegany Resort & Casino

Country singer/songwriter Gary Allan is making a stop at Seneca Allegany Resort & Casino on Saturday, September 30th at 7:00pm.

Selling out venues all across the country, Allan's tours had have him playing live to over one million people and this time around isn't going to be any different. With a strong connection to his fans and his love of playing live, the singer has no plans to slow down anytime soon and is loving getting back out there on the road in support of his latest album, "Ruthless".

While putting the album together, the songwriter put the track names on different shapes of pieces of paper tow-els and set them on his kitchen counter, and as he walked by them multiple times a day he would switch the order of the songs to put a flow together. "I viewed all that countertop work as putting a show together... you can't start out with something sad or slow, because that establishes initially the whole night." Adding, "You do have to come out and set the tone... then stand back and tell your story."



"The Ruthless Tour: 25 Years The Hard Way" is getting rave reviews as he brings to life the songs from the album that tells his story. "This is a montage of everything I have done since my last album, 'Set You Free',"

Signing his first record deal in November 1995, he released his first single, "Her Man" in July 1996. His first album, "Used Heart For Sale" was released in September of 1996. From there the singer/songwriter has garnered multiple Platinum and Gold albums and singles, and has had his share of those going to the number one spot on the charts as well as debuting in the top spot.

I had the pleasure of catching up with Allan to talk about the album, tour, a family business that is far different from his musical career, his success in working with female songwriters, the two years of the "shut down" and staying true to himself.

Allan is thrilled to have Seneca Allegany Resort and Casino on his list of stops for the tour and being back with his fans saying, "I feed off the crowd response, so come on out and let's get back to the fun!'

#### A Conversation with Gary Allan

**HULICK:** When I spoke with you last in 2014, we talked about your album, "Set You Free" and your new approach of working with female songwriters. I see that your newest album, "Ruthless" includes some female songwriters. That experience must

**ALLAN:** My songwriting group was always focused around a few friends who would bring other writers to the group. I didn't realize I had not written with females until my manager mentioned it. Once I did, it brought a new perspective to writing. I have enjoyed writing with females and wish I had done it sooner.

**HULICK:** A lot has happened since then in all of our lives because of the pandemic. The world shut down immediately and all musical artists were blown off course. I've talked to many artists this past year that expressed their songwriting took on a whole

new meaning. What was your experience during those difficult two years? **ALLAN:** To be honest, I didn't write during the pandemic. I shut down then, but I have just started writing again recently. Getting back in the process has been great, and I am excited about creating new music.

**HULICK:** I know when I go to a concert now the artist has a sense of appreciation that you can really see and the audience seems like they are really enjoying the experience right along with them. There is a difference all the way around. How has this related to you?

**ALLAN:** I have always loved and appreciated my fans. Without them, I could not do this for a living. I feed off the crowd response, and the more they are into it, the more excited I am. It definitely makes a difference in the show.

**HULICK:** You are known for staying true to yourself, which you demonstrated after graduating high school while you and your band at the time, "Honky Talk Wranglers" were playing in bars and a promoter tried to sign you into bigger bars but with the stipulation that you could not cover any "old country" artists and their songs. You refused. Do you think that was a pivotal moment in what has been a very successful career? ALLAN: It was a little of that, but more the advice from my Dad. He wanted me to find my voice and not imitate other artists. Once I found my voice and decided how I wanted to sound, I wanted to stay true to that.

**HULICK:** Music isn't your only talent. You design and sell jewelry with your daughters under Gary Allan Custom Jewelry. This has become a successful venture you enjoy. What's it like working with your daughters?

**ALLAN:** Working with my daughters is a great experience. Before starting the jewelry business, I had a clothing store, The Label. My daughters worked there while they were in school. Once we closed the store, two of my daughters decided to go to jewelry school with me. My oldest is the only one who works full-time for the jewelry line now, but we all pitch in and help during the holidays. I enjoy having a family business.

**HULICK:** Your album, "Ruthless" is being released on vinyl, which like you, I believe there is nothing better in music than putting that album on the turntable and setting the needle down and hearing it get into the groove on the album... that very first sound of scratching before the music plays. You are also going to have different colors of vinyl to choose from. A lot of our readers probably remember Elvis Presley's

"Moody Blue" album which was one of the first color vinyls in blue. There's something so nostalgic about the experience. Can you talk a little bit about that?

ALLAN: The sound of music on vinyl is different. The sound, the nostalgia of thinking of my Dad playing vinyl albums, it is an experience all around. When we decided to release Ruthless on vinyl, Universal wanted to do the standard black vinyl and two alternate colors. My favorite color is green, so I gravitated to that one first. Then we looked at the album packaging with all the available vinyl colors, and the purple was a good fit. They turned out well, and the fans seem to love them all.

**HULICK:** The artwork on the cover of "Ruthless" is terrific and will look awesome on

the album cover. Who is the artist and have you worked with them before? **ALLAN:** We were finishing the packaging for Ruthless during the pandemic. At that time, I had joined a friend on a boat in the Dominican Republic and did not want to return for a photo shoot until Covid had calmed down and vaccines were available. The label needed the cover quickly, so we decided to do something with my skeleton bronc logo. Craig Allen is the designer who created the cover and has designed the packaging for several of my albums over the years. Once we had the cover, we still needed photos, so I had my photographer, Eric Adkins, come to the Dominican and shoot all the images there.

**HULICK:** How good does it feel getting back to touring and playing live?

**ALLAN:** It was 452 days between my last show of 2020 and my first one in 2021. I had never gone that long without playing live since I started performing as a teenager. The band and I rehearsed for two weeks before the first show. It took a while to build back up to singing and performing for 60 to 90 minutes. Thankfully, those first shows were great! Walking onto the stage with the fans excited and screaming was emotional, not only for me but for the band and crew as well.

**HULICK:** Fans surely have more choices of concerts to choose from this summer and fall. Everyone is out on tour this year. Do you have a message for your fans and our readers on what they can expect from your show?

**ALLAN:** I always say to come out expecting to have a good time. We play the hits and some fan favorites and throw a few newer songs into the mix. I want the fans to hear the songs that made them become a fan while giving them something they were not expecting. I want them to leave the show just as excited as they were coming into it and leave wanting more.

**HULICK:** What's next for you after your tour?

**ALLAN:** We have dates booked through the end of this year, and we are already starting to announce shows for 2024. We will break for the holidays and then jump right back into it. I am also writing and hope to have new music out in 2024.

**HULICK:** Before you go, I would like to thank you for taking time out of your crazy busy schedule to answer a few questions. One last question... What is the best thing about being Gary Allan?

**ALLAN:** The best thing about being Gary Allan is that I get to do something I love for a living, which brings other people joy. I am very thankful for that.
