New Mardi Gras Lift on Schedule to Open Fall Fest Weekend

At 4,500 feet long with a capacity of 2,800 people per hour, Holiday Valley's new six-passenger chairlift is the first in the region, and soon it will be ready to hold its first passengers! Holiday Valley's biggest lift project, the lift has been under construction since the summer of 2022. Marketing Director Dash Hegeman said, "The Mountain Operations Team has been doing a great job and working very hard. The goal has always been to have the lift operational for Fall Fest weekend so that people can ride the new lift to the top of Mardi Gras."

The decision to upgrade the Mardi Gras lift is well-aligned with the resort's goals. "Holiday Valley has a long history of reinvesting back into the infrastructure of the resort - from lodges to landscaping to lifts and everything in-between," Hegeman explained. "The experience of visiting Holiday Valley is a fantastic one for our guests and we want to ensure that vibe continues. Upgrading the Mardi Gras lift was something that the team here felt was important for our guests, especially those who visit us on busy weekends. We want people getting as much time and enjoyment on snow as possible and this new lift will help make that happen."



The new lift is made by Doppelmayr, which is based in Salt Lake City but has its global headquarters in Austria, according to Hegeman. Compared to the original Mardi Gras lift, the new one has a capacity of 400 more people per hour. "The towers and every component of this new lift are brand new and are a much larger gauge than the old lift, he added.

Even compared to Yodeler lift, the new six-passenger lift is larger in every way, including capacity and length, as it is 2,500 feet longer than Yodeler. "Yodeler was steeper terrain to work on and my guess is the Mountain Operations Team would say they had to manage a lot worse weather that year, but this project is definitely a massive one for the team and unlike any build they've done here at the resort," Hegeman explained. "Jim Curtis, the Mountain Operations Manager, has worked on 22 lift builds here at Holiday Valley. which is a really impressive accomplishment and speaks to one of the many reasons that his team is able to complete projects like this."




Construction began last summer with the installation of concrete foundations for 10 of the 11 lift towers. Starting early allowed the team to begin deconstructing the old Mardi Gras lift right after the end of ski season this past spring. The project has been progressing well this summer, and Hegeman is enthusiastic about completing the project in time for Ellicottville's Fall Festival. In addition to providing gorgeous fall views, the lift is sure to be a game changer come ski season. "On busy days, it's going to do a nice job of efficiently getting people out of the base area and to the top, where

they can spread out across the resort, thus cutting down on wait time at the base of Mardi Gras," said Hegeman. "Less time waiting means more time skiing and riding, which is a win-win for everyone."

Anticipation is definitely building as the completion date draws near. This will be the first "six-pack" lift in the area, and Hegeman said Holiday Valley's social media channels have been buzzing with excitement. 

For those unfamiliar, Night Lights is an outdoor evening adventure unlike any other. A portion of the legendary park's Mill Valley Road landscape is transformed into a vibrant landscape that invites guests to venture on a self-guided tour where the trails and sculptures interact with creative lighting. It's a truly unique experience that producer Doug Sitler of SitlerHQ was happy to discuss.

Of course, we had to start our conversation by asking if there was anything new coming to this year's event. "Night Lights has become an autumn tradition in Western New York. We are thrilled to welcome back visitors who return year after year," said Sitler. "This Fall we are happy to bring new additions to the festivities. The event will feature more music and performances from local artists than in years past. A new snack bar area is being installed that will offer hot chocolate, coffee, pastries, etc.'

In addition, Sitler and his crew are working on some new lighting and trail improvements that will no doubt provide guests with an even better view of the nature-combined-with-art landscape. The entertainment doesn't stop there.

"We will feature an array of LED hoopers, musicians and artists this year. Hoopers Transcen-Dance and Brandy Welch - Hooper Chick will be making return appearances. "Setting up Night Lights is a daunting task," he said. "It takes 1.5 miles of power lines and two hundred LED light fixtures to illuminate the section of the park that hosts Night Lights. The whole process of building Night Lights takes about two weeks.


Despite all the work that goes into the event's creation, the goal is simple. "We want as many people as possible to come out to the Sculpture Park and experience it for themselves. Night Lights is a good way to showcase a part of our park and show people what we are all about. Hopefully, many of these folks will make a return visit or tell their family and friends about our wonderful park.

This is an event you don't want to miss! This year's schedule is as follows:

A "GEM" RIGHT IN OUR BACKYARD

Rock Enthusiasts Prepare for 14th Annual Gem Show at Rock City Park

Over 130 years ago, area residents and visitors made their way up Rock City Hill to Rock City Park by electric trolley. Along with the amenities at the fabulous Bon Air Hotel and the dance pavilion, they could enjoy a day on the merry-go-round and explore the nooks and crannies of this geological wonderland formed about 315 million years ago. The glaciers, which halted before Olean, stopped moving but continued to melt, bringing rocks and sediment to the area with the melting water. This action formed the Olean Conglomerate, so called because it left quartz imbedded in the sandy soil that used to be a seabed. Imagine this... today Rock City Park is located on top of Rock City Hill with an altitude of 2,348 feet above sea level. What a difference a few hundred million years makes! As a result, Rock City is now home to the world's largest exposure of quartz conglomerate. The world's! Imagine! It makes you want to run right up there to see it, doesn't it?

Back in time (1890), five local businessmen with a trolley company called Western NY and Traction Company were running electric trolleys in the Bradford/Olean area. Seeing an unusual opportunity, they bought the land that is now Rock City Park. It was these men who made it into an amusement park. Their vision was spot on. Thousands of visitors came in on their trolleys every day. Things were good for many years until other forms of entertainment took the interest of their visitors. Somehow, through multiple changes of hands, the park managed to remain viable, probably because there's not much damage that can be done to 315 million years old quartz conglomerate. Finally, a local couple who love nature and saw a great opportunity bought the park in 2001. (Can you imagine buying a park?) Cindy and Dale Smith, successful businesspersons for many years in the local communities (Worth W. Smith Hardware company) found themselves owning what some people call the Eighth Wonder of the World.

Fifteen years ago, realizing that many of their visitors were interested in rocks and fossils, they embarked on an endeavor known as their giant Gem-Mineral-Fossil Show, at the park of course. This year, the show is on September 30th (10:00am-5:00pm) and October 1st (10:00am-4:00pm). Adults \$6, kids under 12 are free. Parking near the building is also free. The admission fee includes not only the show and vendors but access to the trails, photo opportunities only the Southern Tier can offer in fall, and the museum. The usual vendors will be there along with some new ones, owner Cindy Smith tells us. You will find a large selection of minerals, rocks and gems, brilliant geodes, artisan made handmade jewelry pieces, even prehistoric bone pieces, and of course, goodies from the two truck food vendors. Owner Dale Smith will be on-hand to join the fun, hand-churning freshly squeezed apple cider and doling out samples.

Yep, it's that time of year. Dale reminds guests that some of their vendors are experts in their fields, so if you have a mineral or vintage gem you wonder about, bring it along and you might be able to have a little help identifying it from the experts. (Kind of like Antique Road Show).

Do be sure to step outside to enjoy the expansive view from the flat stones surrounding the building, at the same time pondering that the spot you are standing on was underwater 315 million years ago. Grab a map if you plan to explore the trails (NOT handicap accessible), head down the steel stairway and think "Flintstones" as you gaze at the amazing rock formations as tall as



skyscrapers, some looking as tipsy as a drunken sailor. Give yourself a bonus if you can identify "The Old Man," and always watch over your shoulder for Sasquatch!

Contact the park for information not covered here. Leashed dogs are allowed but bear in mind that between 1,100-1,200 people pass through the doors in that two-day affair. Always carry your baggies for waste cleanup. Handicapped, gender-neutral bathrooms are available indoors as well as porta-potties outside. The park season will end October 31st with the park reopening on May 1st for the 2024 season.

AMISH MARKET & FALL CRAWL

Catt. County Tourism Organizes New Event Combining English and Amish Goods

If a peaceful day in the country perusing handmade wares, delicious baked goods, and beautiful views sounds like your kind of Saturday, then you won't want to miss the first-ever Amish Market & Fall Crawl this Saturday, September 9th from 10:00am-4:00pm. "This is a brand-new event and something we've talked about doing for a few years," said Samantha Hayes, tourism specialist for the Cattaraugus County Department of Economic Development, Planning & Tourism. "We've wanted to put an event together where both English and Amish products are available, and we're looking forward to it!"

The starting point and "market place" is Valley View Cheese, located at 6028 Route 62 in Conewango Valley. For over 60 years, Valley View has been a must-see stop for visitors, as their impressive selection of cheeses - many of which are made fresh in the cheese factory next door - includes something for everyone's taste. Valley View has also gained a reputation for carrying a large variety of Amish-made goods, and there will be plenty to choose from at Saturday's event. Hayes explained, "The back room of Valley View is opened up with lots of beautiful quilts on display. There will be polywood furniture, Malinda's candies, fresh pies, and lots more."





While Hayes hopes that participating Amish vendors will be there in person to sell their wares, some may not be able to attend, due to time-sensitive work at home. However, there will be plenty of Amish-made products to shop, as well as items from "English" (non-Amish) vendors who will be in attendance. Vendors include "If Unique is What you Seek" (recycled and repurposed items made into wind chimes, yo-yos, jewelry, home and garden décor); Borden Street Bakery (barnwood home décor items and delicious cookies); Herbal Expressions (dip, soup, and slushie mixes, knitted and crocheted items, soaps, and more); and Peaceful Intentions (aura readings, genuine crystal bracelets, wire-wrapped necklaces, and rings).

While there is plenty to choose from at Valley View, there's even more in store for those who participate in the "crawl" aspect of the event. "Valley View will have a little bit of what you'll find if you get out and explore the Amish Trail," said Hayes. "We plan to hand out Amish Trail brochures, which include a map of other businesses. There are hundreds of Amish shops for people to get out and about and explore!"

The other element of the "crawl" includes the participating museums. Hayes explained, "The Leon Historical Society (62 Main Street, Leon) will have Amish women there presenting on the process of quilting. They'll be there from 10:00am-4:00pm to show the different stages of quilting and answer questions. The LHS will have other exhibits for visitors to explore, too." South Dayton's Depot Movie & Rail Museum at 108 W. Railroad Street (famous for appearing in "The Natural" and "Planes, Trains & Automobiles") will be open to visitors. There, former Mayor Larry Zollinger will discuss how the railroad affected the community of South Dayton after 1875. The American Museum of Cutlery at 9 N. Main Street in Cattaraugus will be open from 1:00-4:00pm. Known as the first railroad "boom town", Cattaraugus was once home to several different cutlery companies in the 19th and 20th centuries, and this museum is the place to see examples of knives, swords, and other edged tools and weapons that were made locally

Hayes has some important reminders for those who plan on enjoying the Amish Market & Fall Crawl. "We recommend taking your time, going slow, and watching for buggies," she said. Due to Amish religious beliefs, "NO photographs of the people, but they're usually okay with photos of the landscape and buggies." Remember to bring cash, as Amish shops do not have electricity to accept credit cards. Core Performance: The Best Way to Exercise with Bad Knees

Recently, a friend of mine asked me to put together a list of leg exercises that he could do with bad knees. This friend is an avid skier and cyclist and is only in his 30's, but as he says, "has the knees of an 80-year-old." So, I put together a list and thought it would be a good idea to share this with others.

Many of my clients have bad knees. How they ended up with bad knees varies from overuse to excessive weight gain or even trauma due to an injury. But once your knee or knees are shot, what can you do? Many folks worry that working your legs will only cause your knees to hurt more. Not true, says Willibald Nagler, MD chairman of rehabilitation medicine at the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center in New York City.

"Exercise may be the best medicine for chronic achy knees. Strengthening the muscles around the joint protects you from injury by decreasing stress on the knee." But you must use good form and technique when doing exercises for knee pain.

The First Commandment: Be sure to never bend your legs to a point where your knees stick out past your toes. That puts a lot of pressure under the kneecap. This not only applies to the following exercises for knee pain but also when you're stretching or doing aerobic activities.

THE BEST EXERCISES

Partial Squats: Stand about 12 inches away from the front of a chair with your feet about hip width apart and your toes forward. Bending at the hips, slowly lower yourself halfway down to the chair. Keep your abs tight, and check that your knees stay behind your toes.

Step-ups: Using an aerobic step bench or a staircase, step up onto the step with your right foot. Tap your left foot on the top of the step, and then lower. As you step up, your knee should be directly over your ankle. Repeat with your left foot.

Side-Lying Leg Lifts: Wearing ankle weights above the knee, lie on your left side, legs straight and together, with your left arm supporting your head. Keeping your right foot flexed and your body straight, slowly lift your right leg to about shoulder height, then slowly lower. Repeat with your left leg.

Inner-Thigh Leg Lifts: Wearing ankle weights above the knee, lie on your left side, slightly back on your butt. Bend your right leg and place it behind your left leg with your right foot flat on the floor and your left leg straight. Support your head with your left arm. Slowly lift your left leg about 3 to 5 inches, then lower. Repeat with your right leg.

Calf Raises: Using a chair or wall for balance, stand with your feet about hip width apart, and toes straight ahead. Slowly lift your heels off the floor, rising up onto your toes. Hold, and then slowly lower.

Straight-Leg Raises: Sit with your back against a wall, left leg straight and right leg bent with your foot flat on the floor. Slowly raise your left leg straight up about 12 inches off the floor. Hold, and then slowly lower. Repeat with your right leg.

Short-Arc Knee Extensions: In the same starting position as the straight-leg raises, put 1198.



a ball (about the size of a basketball) under your left knee so that your leg is bent. Slowly straighten your leg. Hold, and then slowly lower. Repeat with your right leg.

Hamstring Stretch: Lie on your back with your left leg flat on the floor. Loop a towel or rope around your right foot and pull your leg as far as comfortable toward your chest, while keeping a slight bend at the knee. Keep your back pressed to the floor throughout the stretch. Hold for 10 to 30 seconds and then release. Repeat three or four times with each leg. Do this stretch five or six times a week.

EXERCISES TO AVOID

A few of the following exercises can be done safely if you have chronic knee problems - they're on this list because they're more likely to be done improperly. The exercises above are safer, while still giving you similar results.

- Full-arc knee extensions
- Lunges
- Deep squats
- Hurdler's stretches






