

Publisher's **PICK** ST. JOHN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH G Wilbur Northrup Building Endowment Fund Supports Recent Restoration Efforts

Saint John's Episcopal Church has been a long-standing staple of the historic Four Corners of Ellicottville, NY. A true testament of the commitment and faith a community holds, and in return it reminds us of the rich history held within its walls.

A congregation of settlers established the church in 1829, the first of their denomination in the area. It was then built in 1834 on one of the corners of Washington St. and Jefferson St., a Gothic Revival church unique to the area. Inside and out, you'll always find yourself something new to admire, from the fine detail in the pew doors, to the towering bell tower.

One of the most notable features of the church is "Gabriel", a bell, purchased for \$125 by subscription and cast in Malaga, Spain in 1708. The bell originally was part of a monastery until a fire where it switched hands, was sold, resold, then finally found its way to its final home at St. John's Episcopal Church by two oxen and wagon making the delivery in 1838.

Gabriel is said to be the oldest working church bell in New York and possibly the United States at 315 years old.

The church is true to its original state, without addition or tear down. The belfry, which is the bell tower that holds Gabriel, draws your eyes up to the exterior details throughout. A masterpiece in design and built entirely of wood, St. John's features detailed finials and spires on the rooftop. The classically white painted facade is an original characteristic of the church, almost as if it were a bright beacon of faith on a sunny day or a quiet reminder of a calm, snowy night.

Onlookers often stop and stare at the wonder the building holds. Within the interior of the church is where you'll find some interesting characteristics. An obviously uncommon feature is the double aisle, opposed to single centered. You'll also notice doors at the ends of the pews with fine detail of the generations before. As a member of the congregation, Amy DeTine had stated that "the historic nature of the church is truly something to be enjoyed, and rightfully so." She continues, "We still have an organist that plays for us and that's a piece of history in itself, along with another one that was originally used in the church and is still onsite." There prove to be plenty of relics to admire whether you're in a service or exploring the architecture.

The extensive history of St. John's Church has put it in favorable position, recognized and loved by members and the community alike. In the true fashion of the Village of Ellicottville, the church is regarded as a prized piece of history and thankfully many work diligently to keep it that way. The G Wilbur Northrup Building Endowment Fund for St. John's Episcopal Church was generously founded in January of 1978 after his passing, by his son John Northrup, and Dave Eldredge. With this funding they were just recently able to complete a costly renovation to keep up the integrity of the building, nearing \$100,000.


Under the direction and funding of The G Wilbur Northrup Building Endowment Fund, Aldrich Painting applied a fresh

coat of paint to the entirety of the church. They worked with local companies including Fitzpatrick and Weller to repair, restore, and replace lumber where needed while matching the detail of the structure. Also included in the restoration was Mazza Sheet Metal of Olean, who added aluminum to the spires to better hold for future weathering. Additional projects by Carpentry by Gerry Musall and his crew were completed throughout the building to finish up some much-needed cosmetic touches.

John Northrup explained the need for restorations on a building having been built "in the early 1800s and try to restore it so that it'll continue to be a beautiful building on the four corners of Ellicottville" and a lot goes into that. Not often do you see wooden churches nearing their 200th year. Many have caught fire or have faced irreputable damage before





The Ratchet Hatchet is making a comeback in Ellicottville - bigger and better than ever with their brand new location! Everyone is invited to attend their Grand Re-Opening Celebration on Friday, September 29th at 5 E. Washington Street (in the plaza next to Kwik Fill). Doors will open at 5:00pm.

Owner Nate Woodruff gave ellicottvilleNOW the scoop on the situation, why they chose to move, what the food menu will look like and what the larger size venue means for the business.

"With not having the option to renew the lease on short notice and the continued business from our patrons, it was the perfect time to grow into a larger space that was more functional for The Ratchet Hatchet," Nate said about their move. "The new location will allow us to now be able to offer a more unique experience to patrons, both locals and those that are visiting Ellicottville. The location is separated into two areas: one that features the bar with small table side seating, and the other offering axe throwing ranges. In addition, there are a few things that we will be gaining at the new location that we are pretty excited about. The new location will feature an outdoor patio and customer parking that we feel will enhance our customers' experiences."

Does this mean the range itself will be larger? Indeed it does. "The new location will offer a total of 4 ranges - three of those ranges will be double targets and the other being a single target. Two of those double ranges will have more of a private feel to the axe throwing experience," explained Nate.

Cost of axe throwing will vary depending on group size. Customers will have the choice between a 30-minute session, 60-minute session, or a 90-minutes session depending on the size of the group. The 30-minute session will be \$25/person, the 60-minute will be \$45/person, and the 90-minute will be \$65/person. The Ratchet Hatchet also plans to offer special packages for both small and large groups that feature items that are included with the axe throwing experience.

"Also, with having a larger space that's more unique to our business, we will be able to showcase a menu that's catered to The Ratchet Hatchet," said Nate. "We will be offering

Now that I have the M/WBE Certification, I intend to complete the business plan and impact statement so all this wonderful equipment and resources can be utilitized; and work with the three counties to see what kinds of incentives and possible grants we might be eligible for. I would love to add an education component and partner with a college to measure the impact of consciousness medicine, quantum medicine, and the importance of grounding, eating natural foods, consuming living water, having a sense of purpose as well as community/oneness."



Onöhsagwë:de' Center to Host Opening Exhibit of Haudenosaunee Beadwork

When I was younger, my mother's friend made me a beautiful pair of beaded earrings that I still keep in a case in my bedroom. They are delicate pieces of work that were painstakingly strung in a waterfall pattern with tiny little seed beads. I remember being in awe of the creation, and to this day, I still appreciate so much hard work for something that seems so small.

Beadwork is truly an art, and the Seneca-Iroquois National Museum (housed at the Onöhsagwë:de' Cultural Center, 82 W. Hetzel Street in Salamanca, NY) is planning an exhibition to celebrate just that. "Here, Now, and Always: Haudenosaunee Beadwork" will open on September 23rd from 10:00am-4:00pm. ellicottvilleNOW took the opportunity to discuss the event with Cultural Center Director Hayden Haynes.

eNOW: The newest exhibition really details the traditional art of beadwork. What prompted this exhibit's creation?

HAYDEN: Since the beginning of this year, our vision of the Center is to put more emphasis on highlighting our collections. Beadwork has become a traditional art that we have a large amount of and it also made sense to highlight it now as the International Iroquois Beadwork Conference is being held at the Allegany Administrative building right next door, on the same weekend.

eNOW: Could you give us a little history on the art of Haudenosaunee beadwork?

HAYDEN: It's a form of self-expression at heart - the forms and motifs speak to our cultural stories, beliefs and identity. European people brought over seed beads and our People began to integrate them into our art, clothing and jewelry. But the forms, designs and motifs are really a continuation of earlier design found on our pottery, then on antler combs to quillwork to animal hair embroidery, and then to beadwork, which is now just showcasing our People's continuing creativity.

eNOW: Is there a cost to attend the opening? What will be happening?

HAYDEN: This is a FREE event, no cost of admission. There will be food trucks and traditional foods offered, beadwork demonstrators/vendors and the biggest highlight of the day will be our two guest speakers. Ken Williams Jr. (Northern Arapaho/Seneca), the world renowned bead artist originally from Cattaraugus (now lives in Santa Fe) is coming out to talk about the traditional art and how the modern design is integrated in his works today. Grant Jonathan (Tuscarora) will be speaking about historical beadwork methods and pieces. Having these two gentlemen travel so far to come speak at the exhibit opening is greatly humbling and appreciated.

eNOW: This collection features works from across Turtle Island and the event is hosting demonstrators. Can you tell us about them?

HAYDEN: The collection has pieces that are both old and modern. Some of the past pieces are so old we do not have their origin information but are well deserving of display. The event will not just be featuring the collected works but there will also

We have traditional and non-native vendors showcasing amazing works of art, jewelry and home decor. Then we have our Annual Spring Art Show for 2024, which is one of our most popular events.

eNOW: Anything else you would like to add?

HAYDEN: We would like to invite everyone in our surrounding communities to come out to the Cultural Center to see the museum's new exhibit. Young and old alike are welcome to come and view the pieces, learn about their origins and what they mean to our culture and enjoy a nice educational but entertaining family day out.



sense to sub out every single need. The conference room space, meals, lodging, taxes and gratuity adds up fast. Being charged over \$120 to rent a projection screen is ludicrous. I own all my own equipment already. To put on my retreat, I have to hoist over \$20,000 of gear, tools and equipment, much of which is fragile and/or heavy, for a weekend. This last event I did, one of my large quartz singing bowls in a tuned set became cracked overnight and I was unable to use it. It's a \$900 set of bowls that I can't just replace the (broken) one, because they are all tuned to one another. Last year, a designer \$3,700 Leandro deSouza "One Love" crystal carving fell over and broke. Things get damaged in the setup - it's never during the event. What I need to do is painfully clear. Stop going external and create the center so everything can stay on-site under one roof and it can all be managed from one single point. This will be a dream come true, and I will make it happen."

While we are waiting for this impressive expansion, the shop will continue on as always. 




