Ellicottville Brewing Company to Host Live Broadcast from Little Valley Location






Mark your calendars for some other EBC Little Valley offerings heading your way. On Saturday, November 18th they will

Bob McCarthy's Annual Fundraiser Returns to EBC's Brew Hall Dec. 1st

Bob McCarthy was a legend in our collective Ellicottville minds and hearts. He unexpectedly departed this earth seven years ago, leaving behind a remarkable giving legacy that continues to this day.

Since the late 70s, Bob was the "Voice of Ellicottville", serving as Master of Ceremonies for many Holiday Valley and Ellicottville events. Highly visible as he was at such times, Bob also worked quietly behind the scenes sharing his energy, drive and Irish humor to bring success to many endeavors. He worked tirelessly without any desire for recognition, yet his fingerprints will forever remain all over Ellicottville. Not only was he the force behind Irish Christmas, but he also created events like Farm Fest, Snowboard Auction, Celtic Thunder, and Americana Folk Art & Music Fair. All designed to raise funds for worthwhile causes, the jewel in his crown was Irish Christmas, started 18 years ago to provide funding for "Santa's Workshop" which quietly helps needy families with a holiday meal and gifts. Hosted by the Bob McCarthy Foundation (a 501c3 community foundation), the event now serves to raise funds not only for Santa's Workshop but also the Cattaraugus County Santa Sheriff Program.

A retired Special Education teacher, Bob loved kids, and one of his favorite causes was Santa's Workshop. Continuing support of this cause, The Bob McCarthy Foundation also focuses on supporting families' needs year-round by funding many other programs. They focus their endeavors on the Great Valley-Ellicottville School community by annually providing a number of \$500 scholarships to both ECS and BOCES students, giving assistance to area food banks, developing youth programs and a summer reading program, and much more. The organization works with local suppliers to help those referred by the school or social agencies. Like Bob McCarthy, a lot of their philanthropic work is quietly carried out in the community.

It wasn't just Bob's "Voice", or his philanthropy, or his energy and enthusiasm that made him such an outstanding individual... he was also a master woodcrafter who was constantly using those talents for good. The main part of the Irish Christmas event is the fabled auction (7:00pm - get there early to scope things out), hosted by Brooks LeFeber and helpers. The auction always includes handcrafted wooden items made by Bob, Ed Frederickson, Hughey Dunn and others. Frederickson and Dunn continue the tradition along with others who have generously contributed items to be auctioned off at the event. Word has it that a unique piece of Bob's work has surfaced and will be a hot item on the auction block. Because Bob had a little bit of quirky (ok, a lot) in him, he decided to have pies and baked goods as part of said auction, so every large item comes with "something from the oven" contributed by local home chefs who faithfully contribute their goods annually. This year, you are invited to bid on 15 unique auction pieces along with a basket raffle for over 40 locally donated gift baskets. Admission to the event is free, all beer and wine is specially priced at \$5 (thank you EBC) and Taste of Ireland food specials are priced at \$5, provided by Ellicottville's finest restaurants. Oh yes, all of those proceeds are donated to the fund when the event is over. Bangers and mash, anyone?

Naturally, there is live entertainment, again this year by Buffalo's Crikwater before and after the auction. Attendees have been known to say that this is the best party in Ellicottville, so why would you want to miss it? If you want to support the Foundation but find you cannot be there, you can donate at www.bobmccarthyfoundation.com/donate or via the mail at Bob McCarthy Foundation, PO Box 301, Ellicottville, NY 14731. As they say, "a little

SANTA CLAUS LANE PARADE

GOACC Announces this Year's Parade Grand Marshal Posthumously



OLEAN - As the Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce celebrates the 38th Annual Santa Claus Lane Parade in two weeks, staff reminisce on who has been the grand marshal of their celebratory holiday parade. "The Chamber has asked those student athlete teams / individuals to be the grand marshal of the parade - Portville Central Girls Volleyball (several times), Ellicottville Central Girls Volleyball, Salamanca High Girls Volleyball, swimmers from the Portville/Olean Girls teams; and even local celebrities such as last year, Eric Jones (West Clarksville) for winning Food Network's "Outrageous Pumpkins" show," reported Meme K. Yanetsko, GOACC COO.

At this year's organizational meeting for the parade held in April, Meme suggested the idea of having George Pancio's family be this year's grand marshal. And they have accepted.

George Pancio was Olean's Santa who helped the real Santa with the New York City's Macy's Day Parade and many of Olean's own parades. Mr. Pancio passed away January 20, 2023.

George began performing as Santa in the late 1950s and was a protégé of Charles W. Howard in the 1960s. He assumed the role as the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade Santa in 1966. For a decade, George represented Macy's as their official spokes-Santa. He also appeared on numerous television programs such as Good Morning America, the Tonight Show with Johnny Carson, and Gene Rayburn's Hell of a Town.

For a decade, George spent 50 nights on his Main Street roof with a sleigh and Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer each winter to the joy of the families of the community. Last year, George was able to see his son, Steve recreate this Rooftop with Santa, with George's grandson, Steve back on Main Street on the younger Steve's house in Olean!

"The weather was so discouraging that evening, we were going to reschedule/cancel, but we're glad that we went on with the show, as Dad was able to enjoy his family carrying on this tradition of Santa on the Rooftop!" added George's son, Steve Pancio.

This year's Santa Claus Lane Parade will be held Friday, November 24th starting at 6:30pm at Delaware Avenue and will head south on both sides of Union Street to State Street.

In 2010, the inaugural class of Santa Claus Hall of Fame was presented by the International Santa Claus Hall of Fame. George Pancio received this designated in 2020. What is the criteria, you ask? Overall career, service to their community, range of appearances, contribution to the Santa world, length of service, uniqueness of career, originality and charity.

Nominations come from several sources including Santa communities where thousands of professional Santas, Mrs. Clauses, and helpers from around the world are members. Profiles of candidates are distributed to a panel of 15. Profiles are reviewed with a point value in each standard. The top 21-point value profiles are submitted for a 1 through 21 percentage vote. Those Candidates who received 75% are elected to the International Santa Claus Hall of Fame.

"I was very impressed with this designation of George's," said Mrs. Yanetsko. "To think someone from our town is recognized not only for him being Santa but for all he did for our community and residents internationally is outstanding."

Mr. Pancio was also the final Santa to visit Virginia O'Hanlon Douglas of the famous, "Yes, Virginia, There is a Santa Claus" newspaper editorial, not long before she passed away (1971). "From what I remember, she was dying in the hospital, and they wanted her to have one last visit from Santa Claus," Mr. Pancio told the Times Herald. "Macy's flew me down there to see her. They drove me in a limo to get to the hospital."

Although there is no official deadline for Santa Claus Lane Parade applications, GOACC urges all participants to get the information into the Chamber office by November 20th. All parade participants must have a waiver signed and Chamber officials ask that all waivers be handed in by November 24th to the office at 301 North Union Street or at the parade.

GOACC is encouraging organizations to participate in these other Thanksgiving week events:

• Thursday, November 23rd: Twin Tiers Striders Turkey Trot

•Saturday, November 25th: Both Portville and Allegany will host their Holiday Celebrations. Plus Portville will have a parade through the village to Pioneer Park.

•Small Business Saturday will also be held Saturday throughout the area.



Carrie expresses how it feels different owning a physical locale. "Online is a great option for many but a storefront has endless opportunities to change and grow. We will be able to offer more things that we love and create a great shopping experience. The space also

allows us an opportunity to grow our printing capabilities and even after the new year offer some printmaking and class opportunities."

Wild Roamer plans to carry a mix of screen printed items like Buffalo t-shirts, mugs and stickers, along with vintage items and gifts. "We are focused on a vintage camp vibe and will offer a lot of national park related items, vintage camping gear, items that support the outdoors and some traditional gifts as well as supporting other women-owned businesses," Carrie explained.

They aren't kidding around with their inventory. The displays in their new space during last weekend's soft opening boasted items from natural themed temporary tattoos to Buffalo-themed Christmas ornaments. Posters, pictures, vintage camping signs... so much variety in one small space! (They even have an old school Coleman drink dispenser!) CATTARAUGUS GIVES

Make a Difference in the Community by Supporting Area Non-Profits

One hundred years ago, a group of good people in Cleveland, Ohio established an organization to manage personal endowed funds established by families, groups, or organizations for charitable foundations. Today, these groups exist all over the United States. In 1994, a group of individuals, through the Olean Chamber of Commerce, came together to provide an opportunity to get support for the Allegany River Valley Trail Fund. "First named the Greater Olean Community Foundation, CRCF is founded with the purpose of enriching life in the Olean area by providing a vehicle and service for donors to pursue varied philanthropic interest and to serve as a resource for charitable activities."

In 2000, the name was changed to Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation (CRCF) to reflect broader geographic range of services outside of the immediate Olean area. By 2004 - their 10-year anniversary - they marked assets of more than \$7 million and more than 30 funds. Grant awards topped \$350,000 while scholarship awards totaled more than \$7,000. By their 15th anniversary in 2009, the foundation managed more than 50 funds and \$8.9 million in assets, awarding \$450,000 in grants. Two years later in 2011, CRCF hosted their very first annual Nonprofit Networking Day to help local nonprofit organizations generate ideas to build capacity and learn from one another. In 2017, The Foundation held its first ever Cattaraugus Gives during the state-wide NYGIVESDAY program, raising over \$28,000 for 40 participating nonprofits in Cattaraugus County, also sponsoring \$5,000 in incentive prizes. In 2022, Cattaraugus Gives eclipsed the milestone of raising over \$1 million for area nonprofits since 2019. Eighty-eight participating nonprofits together raised over \$275,000 last year. Aside from the 2022 data, this information was sourced from their 25th anniversary commemorative booklet.

This introduction brings us to Cattaraugus Gives 2023 held this year on Giving Tuesday, November 28th from midnight to 11:59pm, completely on social media. Even though one can do amazing things on social media - carefully read my lips... well, my words: You cannot pre-schedule your Cattaraugus Gives 2023 gift. Here's the hitch: For your donation to be counted towards prize incentives awarded on Cattaraugus Gives 2023, it must be made online between midnight and 11:59 pm on Nov. 28th. Yes, prizes!!!! Now, if you are not interested in prizes, you may donate on your own to a participating nonprofit before or after the Cattaraugus Gives 2023 event. But let me tell you about the prizes and why it's important for you jump in on the day of the event. The Foundation and community sponsors will offer some \$20,000+ in incentives (to be determined) to participating nonprofits.

Hopefully there will be more. 

THE ARTIST ON THE TITANIC

Original Great Lakes Steamship Drawings on Display

Allegheny Mountain Arts Gallery, 181 Main Street, Bradford, PA will be exhibiting original Great Lakes steamship drawings by Samuel Ward Stanton on Saturday, November 18th from 3:00-6:00pm. Mr. Stanton was an artist recognized for his historically accurate steamship drawings which he rendered in pen and ink. His drawings are used today to document the size and look of steamships that have no photographic record. They are also used when reproducing or refurbishing a historical ship.

In 1895, Mr. Stanton published a book, American Steam Vessels, in which he included almost five hundred illustrations of steamships and data pages. His drawings were from a large area of the country including Delaware Bay and Rivers, Coastal, U.S. Naval, Hudson River, New York Bay and others. The vast majority of the drawings on display at the gallery are from the Great Lakes region.

Two of the displayed works, "Black Rock" and "Christopher Columbus" were included in Mr. Stanton's display at the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago in 1893.

His love of steamships took him to study in France for a mural commission he had on a new Hudson River steamer, "The Washington Irving". Unfortunately his return to the United States was as a second class passenger on the TITANIC and in his forty-second year, he lost his life on April 14, 1912. Unlike the fictional artist Jack Dawson that was portrayed in the movie, Samuel Ward Stanton was the real artist that perished on the TITANIC.





Core Performance: Starting Out by Starting Strong

I absolutely love training new clients. No matter what their experience is with fitness/strength training, I am always able to teach them some commonsense tricks of the trade so that when they work out on their own, they will understand that there is an efficient and effective way to train their body.

Right off the bat I demonstrate that there are multiple parts to every exercise - pushing and pulling, raising and lowering. And while it may sound odd to break up a single exercise into multiple parts, there are advantages to understanding each. With every exercise there is both a concentric and eccentric component. A concentric movement happens when your muscles contract, while an eccentric movement occurs when the muscle lengthens.

My clients quickly become familiar with a third type of muscle movement - isometric contraction. Unlike eccentric and concentric muscle movements, an isometric movement involves a muscle contraction without movement. In simplest terms, an isometric movement is a static hold. While isometric exercises can help build strength, they won't increase mass or power (since the exercise is done without movement). However, since isometric movements allow you to fully engage your core to remain steady, some of the key benefits include increased balance, core strength, and posture. Typical isometric exercises are wall-sits, plank or holding at the top of a pullup.


Concentric movements occur when your muscle fibers shorten. The concentric portion of a movement works against the force of gravity (think of your arm curling towards your body in a bicep curl) and are known as "positive" movements. Benefits of concentric exercises include increased power and speed.

Eccentric exercise involves increasing muscle length. During the eccentric phase of an exercise, you work with the force of gravity (like lowering your arms back toward your sides in a bicep curl). These are often called "negative movements," and have been shown to help build muscle mass and increase strength. The majority of muscle damage (which sounds like a bad thing but is actually necessary for muscle growth) occurs during eccentric training. Therefore, one of the main benefits of eccentric exercises is muscle hypertrophy, or the growth of your skeletal muscle cells.

Another reason to love eccentric training is it can help you conquer various resistance exercises - exercises that often seem beyond your athletic ability. This is commonly known as "negative training." Negative training involves performing slow eccentric muscle contractions to gradually build strength.

Examples include:

- Eccentric pushup: Can't quite do a pushup? Start at the top of the plank (on your toes no knees here!), then slowly lower yourself to the ground. Once you reach the floor, you can use your hands and knees to return to a plank position.
- Eccentric pullup: A full pullup (without momentum) is one of the hardest bodyweight



exercises. To start, use a step stool or resistance band to pull yourself above the pullup bar. From there, gradually lower yourself until you're fully extended, then let go. Climb up the steps again to repeat.

• Eccentric boat pose: Want to target your core? Start in the top of a boat position, then slowly lower yourself until you're fully extended (a hollow body hold). Try to take as long as you can.

My goal is to educate my clients so that they understand that whatever muscle component they are focused on should be done with the mindfulness of what they are trying to achieve. Plus, I preach - always remember to engage your core, breath and slow down your reps to allow your muscles to fully contract, extend or hold their intended position. This is how you'll build a stronger, smarter and resilient anatomy.

Soaking in that smell of freshly fallen leaves carried to me by the cooling autumn breeze signals the end of summer and the start of something truly special, grouse hunting!

My introduction to upland game happened when I was young - really young, 9 or 10 I think - while visiting my grandfather in northern Ontario near Parry Sound. It was March break and the family had all gathered to welcome spring. The sap from the maple trees was just starting to flow and the three feet of snow still left on the ground was slowly melting. While searching for trees to tap my grandfather always carried his trusty Savage 24. The model 24 was an over and under rifle and shotgun combination, chambered in a .22 rimfire rifle cartridge over a .410 gauge shotgun. At that time the grouse season ran until March 31 and you never knew what you might run into.

Grouse of today are sporting birds and unless you shoot one in flight, it is considered unsporting. That wasn't always the case, especially in northern Ontario. Grouse was food and there was no sport in going hungry so the best time to shoot a bird was before it flew away while still on the ground or perched in a tree. The weapon of choice was the .22 and not the shotgun... too many teeth broken biting into a pellet, too few dentists around to fix them.

It was a beautiful spring day, warm enough for just a sweater and slightly overcast. We were down by the lake on his 100 acre woods when he spotted a bird out for a stroll. I'm sure the bird spotted us, too, but wasn't alarmed... (not enough hunting pressure to spook it in those days). My grandfather handed me the gun still broken open and I placed a small

.22 cartridge into the chamber before snapping it shut. I lined up the open sights and took careful aim at the bird's head. The summer before I was taught how to hold and fire a rifle, hold your breath and squeeze the trigger gently. My aim was true but the bullet had a mind of its own and decided to dive into the snow with a little poof! I'm sure the grouse smiled as it thundered off!

Needless to say that first hunt was a learning experience for me and the lesson learned was, 'use the shotgun barrel'! When I turned 13 my grandfather bought me a beautiful Laurona side by side 20 ga manufactured in Eibar, Spain. After my grandfather passed away, my hunting partner became that Laurona.

Grouse hunting exploded for me when my parents bought some property on Georgian Bay just south of Parry Sound. Throughout my teens and twenties I spent almost every weekend in the woods behind our family cottage hunting not just grouse but also woodcock and occasionally jump shooting ducks in beaver ponds that seemed to be everywhere. Although I became quicker on the draw, I still gave the birds more than a sporting chance to get away.

I even recruited my family golden retriever to help flush out the birds that I couldn't see but suspected they were there just the same. The drumming and the beat of their wings are the ghostly sounds one's ear gets trained to hone in on. Unfortunately the brush is so thick in the boreal forests of the Canadian Shield that even when you flush a bird, the chances of getting a clear shot off are slim to none.

The dog proved to be more effective in getting covered in burrs than in uncovering birds. The best solution was to walk fast along game trails and startle a bird and then carefully watch in which direction it flew. Grouse never fly far and will usually land in an evergreen tree about half way up and a few feet from the trunk. Spooked once you now have to be very stealthy not to spook them a second time. Walk slowly and quietly with your head up, straining your eyes to distinguish clumps of branches from the silhouette of a bird. Shoot quickly and ask questions later because as soon as you see him he'll see you and take flight!

Nowadays I still hunt with my trusty Laurona but have recruited a well trained yellow lab named Frenchie to keep me company and help in flushing and retrieving birds. I have long since left the dense woods of Ontario and now stomp through the numerous state lands of WNY surrounding Ellicottville. The Ruffed Grouse season started October 1 and will run to the end of February, making for a nice long season. I have spotted at least one grouse in almost every state land that I have visited from the Zoar Valley, throughout Allegany State Park and all the way across Allegany County past the Genesee River. Unfortunately, flushing a bird in WNY is still few and far between but the leaves still smell the same and the autumn breeze feels just as good.


