



# ELLICOTTVILLE INDOOR GOLF

Play Any Course, Any Time of Year; 24/7 Access for Members

If you think you need to head south to golf all year long, think again! Jake Northrup, owner of Ellicottville Indoor Golf, invites golfers of all ages and skill levels to keep up their game or learn new skills at his accessible, state-of-the-art facility located at 6633 Route 219 in Ellicottville. Whether you're looking to book a tee time or considering the perfect gift for the golf enthusiast in your life, Ellicottville Indoor Golf has it all: multiple membership options, flexible hours, and private lessons with Northrup, a PGA golf professional since 2000.

Established in 2015, Ellicottville Indoor Golf was inspired by everything that Northrup, himself, wanted in an indoor course. "I wanted a great space to work on my own game all year and also give other people the opportunity to use the space the way they want to use it," he explained. Last winter, Northrup upgraded his technology to the best in the industry: TrackMan 4, the standard in launch monitor technology that is used by more PGA Tour players and coaches than any other program. "There are over 190 golf courses in that system," said Northrup of TrackMan 4. "The technology has come a long way."

The program includes plenty of options for those who would like to compete, whether with themselves or others. TrackMan Combine Tests and Skills Tests help golfers hone their skills and track their stats, which can be easily accessed through the Trackman app. Trackman will track all swings, the golf ball and the clubhead and send users an email with a full report of how they played that day.

The simulator also allows golfers to play in practice on any hole of any course and enjoy challenging games such as closest to the pin, bullseyes, and more. "TrackMan even has kids games, like Magic Pond which is hitting golf balls at cartoon monsters for points," Northrup added. "It's very user-friendly."

Speaking of user-friendly, the entire space is designed with the individual in mind. With no sign and no walk-ins permitted, all members enjoy 24/7 access to the facility for themselves and their guests. Members can book tee times on a rolling basis - up to 30 days in advance. Once a time slot is booked online, that time is blacked out to anyone else. While Northrup used a keyed membership system in the past, he now uses thumb-print scanning technology to allow members access to the space, which is managed through video cameras. Not only does this allow Northrup to remotely lock or unlock the facility and monitor the comings and goings of members, but it also allows him to see the hitting area and computer if users are experiencing any trouble with the technology.

Northrup's entire space is turfed and includes a 25-foot by 15-foot putting green, teaching aids, fitness equipment, and a 75-inch flat screen television. For those looking to plan a larger event such as a bachelor or bachelorette party, the space has plenty of room to golf and relax, like any member club. Groups of up to 15 people can be accommodated, and there is plenty of comfortable seating, a small refrigerator for guests to store their beverages, and a Bose speaker for those who'd like to bring their own music. Northrup invites interested golfers to join the partners league, which starts in January.

Ellicottville Indoor Golf memberships are tailored to the individual golfer's needs. Northrup explained, "Depending on how long you're here and how often you want to golf, you can purchase unlimited monthly membership, a full season six-month membership, or even a three-month membership." Membership also includes discounted rates on instruction and guest fees.

# 12 GATES OF EVL NOW ON TAP

Brewery Opens its Doors to Craft Beer Enthusiasts with NYC-Inspired Menu

A community rich in dining/entertainment options got a little richer just in time for Thanksgiving, as the 12 Gates of EVL Taproom opened its doors at 14 Washington Street downtown Ellicottville, NY.

With an impressive slate of award-winning craft beers on tap and sporting a menu styled after a New York City kosher deli, 12 Gates of EVL partners celebrated a "soft opening" just ahead of the coming ski season.

"I think it's safe to say we all love Ellicottville and we think what we offer fits well with all the other players in town," said Todd Wilhelm, one of 12 Gates' original founding fathers at the opening of the new taproom. "We've all been coming here for years as skiers and we're really looking forward to forming a symbiotic relationship here in town."

The main offering to be served up at the new 12 Gates of EVL Taproom is handcrafted beer with wide-ranging flavors and styles - from pilsners, lagers and stouts to their flagship brew: a West Coast Style IPA that leaves you longing for another.

"The way it all started for us was we put a glass of the West Coast IPA in front of our Master Brewer, Matt Gordon," explained Tom Kirchmeyer, the other original partner of 12 Gates. "We told him that if he could create a product like that for us, then we could be very successful."


Craft beer aficionados may have had the chance to sample 12 Gates brews already, either at the main brewery/taproom in Williamsville, NY, at events like Holiday Valley's Beer and Wine Festival, or at select bars and restaurants located throughout Western New York. 12 Gates products are also available on grocery store shelves and at beer stores throughout the region.

When asked what type of food would be featured on the menu, 12 Gates of EVL partner Kevin Lalock explained that the new taproom would be modeled after the kosher delis found in New York City - serving traditional brisket, roast beef, pastrami and corned beef sandwiches (among others) - all piled ridiculously high on fresh bread/rolls and served with housemade macaroni and potato salads.

"We'll be working to expand our menu over time," Lalock explained. "I'm working on a couple of homemade pickle recipes right now and we'll be making our own soups of the day and salads - we'll even be making breakfast sandwiches on the weekends."

Tentative hours of operation for the 12 Gates of EVL Taproom will be Thursday from 4:00-10:00pm, Friday from noon-11:00pm, Saturday 11:30am-11:00pm and Sunday from 11:30am-8:00pm. Chances are good you'll also find local entertainers performing live music during your visit.

As for the goal of creating their own niche in the Ellicottville community, one need look no further than the 12 Gates social media pages, where it soon becomes obvious how much these brewers have become imbedded in the fabric of the Williamsville, NY area - home to their original taproom. Anyone making a quick scroll through the 12 Gates Facebook page will find that they are involved with many and varied community activities, such as a running club, sponsored hockey and soccer teams, and even a club for Jeep enthusiasts!



Learn more about the latest technology in helmets and goggles, how The Boardroom connected with a Buffalo-based company to build a new snowboard model, and the shop's ability to now offer ski and snowboard rentals through their online store. And of course, we have to talk about The Boardroom Banked. Let's go...

eNOW: Be honest... have the vibes ever been higher at The Boardroom?

**SPENCE:** The vibes have never been higher. The momentum we've seen from the past few seasons with so many new people getting into snowboarding has continued, and we're especially thrilled to see so many youngsters standing sideways for the first time. Throw in an early season dump - the boys' powder surf and pow slash edits were featured on the Instagram accounts of Burton, Snowboard Mag, Out of Collective and more - so suffice to say the engine is running very hot at 6113 Route 219. Product offerings from the industry's best brands - including boasting the area's largest selection for Burton Step On - help us stand out from the crowd in terms of specialty snowboard retail. We want to do one thing really well, and that's snowboarding.

**eNOW:** How's product curation looking this year?

**SPENCE:** When we go into our buying cycle, we try and curate a product selection that can appeal to the entire spectrum of snowboarders. Our weekend warrior dad who's chasing his kids around is going to be looking at a snowboard completely different than the kid lapping park all day. What's important to us as we walk someone through their purchase is that we find the right product mix that will maximize the fun they're going to have. What do they want out of the snowboard? By offering a wide range of options - pricepoints, colorways, flex patterns, etc. - we can dial in almost anyone into that perfect setup. It's not just snowboarding, however. A lot of our outerwear and accessory brands are crossovers, meaning we can still service our friends on skis for jackets, helmets, goggles, gloves and base layers. Find everything from high-end Burton [ak] with Gore-Tex to the outstanding value-driven Porter jacket from Under Armour.

eNOW: Tell us about the Old Growth Exchange.

**SPENCE:** For the past few years, we've been hearing about this guy who's been custom-building skis in Buffalo. His name is Jon Capozzi, and he is Old Growth Handcraft. Last season, he approached us about wanting to build a snowboard. We sat down, spec'd some stuff out and he got to work. While a lot of our guys absolutely love the board he built, we knew that from a retail standpoint it was too stiff. So we went back to the drawing board, dialed in the shape, picked out the topsheet material (after going through about 50 species of wood) before settling on the final build design. Jon's shop is located on Exchange Street in Buffalo, and we figured that would be an awesome name. They're now in the shop in 155, 158 and 161W centimeter lengths, and we do have a demo for anyone that wants to come try one out.

**eNOW:** The Boardroom's online store now also offers rental booking. Details please... **SPENCE:** We're a snowboard shop. But did you know that the store originally started as Barnyard Ski Rental? Ski and snowboard rental is such a huge part of our business, and we wanted to make that process 1) easier for our customers, and 2) legitimize the store by joining the 21st century. The online rental booking software is clean, easy and will streamline the process for both us and our customers. It's our first season with it, and we know they'll be some growing pains, but we're super hyped on it and encourage folks to

The chocolates and truffles are outsourced from chocolatiers in Vermont, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, New York, New Jersey, and some Belgium chocolate imports. Justin added, "The roost currently has 50 varieties in the bulk case alongside several prepackaged favorites like sponge candy and sugar-free selections."

The couple have such fond childhood memories of local five-and-dimes with assortments of penny candy they just had to include them in their product lines - jawbreakers, rock candy, Neccos, Charleston chews, bazooka, lemon heads, fireballs, candy necklaces - to list just a few. They also have a great selection of saltwater taffy, a dozen fudge flavors, and 9 varieties of Jelly Belly jellybeans.

The Chocolate Roost had a soft opening in early November with great success, and held their official ribbon cutting on Small Business Saturday. Local officials, company staff and community leaders as well as the public were in attendance to celebrate the special occasion.

Rusty Rooster opened its 'barn' doors in mid-2019. At the time, the store was vintage resale retail with architectural salvage with reclamation wood products as a service. The showroom grew from 1300 square feet to 4500 square feet which now includes the chocolate shop and the addition of other favorite specialty food items like Finger Lakes Coffees, Amish Popcorn and Gourmet Creations Dip Mixes.

So why chocolate? Mrs. Smith replied, "One of my favorite things to do when we travel is check out the small hometown shops and restaurants. I often found fantastic little confection shops and we just don't have anything like this in our immediate area. I've long thought it would be a great addition to our shop.'

"The best part of the months leading up to opening was researching and taste testing," added Mr. Smith, "finding those chocolatiers that have built excellent quality products like Birnn truffles of Vermont.'

The store does have options for corporate gifts, event favors and dessert set-ups. Working with other local businesses for the holiday markets is a future option they'd like to explore. The Chocolate Roost has prepackaged selections including gift packs of truffles, sponge candy, fudge and a few sugar-free options. Other selections are all available by the pound with 50 varieties in the display case to mix and match (you can buy one piece or hundreds).

Mrs. Smith's favorites include sponge candy, dark truffles and coconut clusters, while Mr. Smith loves the thin mints. Stop in for yourself and decide which sweet treats are your favorite! # "A LITTLE SOMETHING"

Support Local Artists: Tri-County Arts Council Small Works Show Sure to Impress

Tired of long lines in big box stores or scouring the internet for this season's most popular gadgets? Looking for a thoughtful, one-of-a-kind gift for that special person in your life? For a gift they won't wear out, re-gift, or replace with next year's new model, check out the incredible selection of art in the Tri-County Arts Council's "A Little Something Small," the third annual juried small works show. Visit in person at the Peg Bothner Gallery, located at 110 W. State St. in Olean, or browse and shop online at www.tricountyartscouncil.org. From now until January 14, the public is invited to view more than 140 pieces of artwork submitted by over 50 different artists from Allegany, Cattaraugus and Chautauqua counties.

Now in its third year, the TCAC's small works show features more artists and pieces than ever before, and according to Sean Huntington, exhibition coordinator, this year's selection is incredible. "Every year, this has grown," he said. "In the first year, we had approximately 100 pieces, and in the second year, we had 130. This year, we have almost 150 pieces and the quality is amazing - these artists just keep topping themselves!

New this year, the TCAC is giving out awards in two categories: Amateur and Professional. Sean Conklin, assistant curator at St. Bonaventure University's Regina A. Quick Center for the Arts, will select winners for the following awards: Best in Show, Best Professional, Honorable Mention Professional, Best Amateur, and Honorable Mention Amateur. Each award winner will receive a cash prize and a year's Artisan Membership, which allows the artist the opportunity to sell in the TCAC's Artisan Market. The public is invited to stop in and cast their vote for the People's Choice Award now through Dec.

Each participating artist submitted one to three pieces of artwork under 12 inches by 12 inches, and some have already sold out. Artwork ranges from watercolor, gouache, oil painting, photography, pottery, jewelry, sculpture, stained glass, and more.

Jessica Boice, a new artisan member of TCAC and member of the Pennsylvania Water-color Society, has three pieces in the show: Go Fish, Windy Day, and Under My Cap. "My work 'Go Fish' is my first experience using 'Yupo' paper - a synthetic surface that does not absorb wet paint; the paint dries 'on top of' the surface," Boice explained. "It's very unlike traditional watercolor papers, and has a unique set of challenges. This finished work has additionally been treated with a coating of acrylic sealant to prevent the painting from the adverse effects of moisture." With the Allegheny National Forest at her doorstep, Boice is continually inspired by nature, specifically her interest in foraging, which has led her to discover much of her subject matter, including beautiful leaves, acorns, and fungi.

Wendy Bale, a multi-disciplinary nature artist who lives south of Jamestown, is primarily known for her paper sculpture and drawings. However, a recent opportunity to take a bas relief class had Bale working with clay again after many years, and the experience yielded three beautiful pieces which are in this year's show. Speaking of her class, Bale said, "I chose an armored darkling beetle for my subject and found it very rewarding. The actual insect is tiny, only 3/4 inch or so, and these pieces give the viewer a closer look, as if seeing it through a magnifying glass. Sculpting in clay is very different than making paper sculptures, but some of the three-dimensional skills crossed over and I felt at home with the process." Bale is excited for people to see these sculptures and has a large bag of plaster waiting to become more beetles!

# A Conversation with Ryan Cabrera

HULICK: We get two chances to see you when you play Seneca Niagara Casino

and then another show at Seneca Allegany Casino.

CABRERA: I love it! I'm excited to see Niagara Falls again.

HULICK: I usually ask the artists I interview if they have a Buffalo connection, but

you have a huge connection. **CABRERA:** Yes with John Rzeznik of the Goo Goo Dolls! He produced my first album. I heard stories when we were making that album... he would tell stories about his band coming up as a sort of punk rock band. It's crazy where they are

**HULICK:** You started out with the Dallas band Rubix Groove. **CABRERA:** (laughs) Yes... back in the day.

**HULICK:** Were you always into music as a career?

CABRERA: It wasn't like a childhood dream or anything. When I was around 15 I used to pretend I was in a band because the thought was that's how I was going to get the girls (laughs)... show up in a band and they think you're cool... even if I didn't play any instruments. (laughs) Then when I was 17 or 18 I saw the Dave Matthews Band play and then I thought... oh, I want to do that.

**HULICK:** You've had great success, including in your solo career. In fact, some of your songs have been part of some pretty big moments. Your song "I Will Remember You" was used during the closing montage series finale of "Will & Grace", and also used as the send-off of female contestants on the third season of "So You

CABRERA: Yes. The story about that song is that when I turned that into the record label they didn't like it. They said it shouldn't make the album, so it wasn't made a single. My publisher loved the song and he said that he was going to keep rolling with the song even though the label didn't want to put it on the album, and low and behold "Will and Grace" picked it up and then came "So You Think You Can Dance". It was also used in a Ford commercial on the "American Idol" finance and all of a guiddon it had life, and then the label was like. and all of a sudden it had life, and then the label was like... oh, we love that song.

**HULICK:** (laughs) Don't you love that when it happens... and somebody's so dead

set against it and you get the chance to prove them wrong?

CABRERA: (laughs) Yes! Absolutely! Especially in music... it happens all the time. You just gotta believe that if you think it's a great song then you gotta go for it.

**HULICK:** You write all your own music. How did the pandemic effect that? A lot of artists have told me that they looked at the lyrics differently because of all that

CABRERA: The pandemic happened right after I met my wife and we really just took that time to spend with each other... but I did get one great song out of it and that's my current single, "Worth It".

**HULICK:** You got married in April, so you're still in the honeymoon stage. CABRERA: Yes... we're about six months in... we're very happy.

**HULICK:** Who were your musical influences?

**CABRERA:** Mine were kind of all over the place, from Dave Matthews, Beatles, George Harrison, Sam Cook, Paul Simon... the classics.

HULICK: Let's talk Christmas. Since you are doing your Boy Band Christmas tour I think it would be something fun.

CABRERA: Yes, let's do it. I love Christmas. I have my tree up year-round.


**HULICK:** Do you have a family tradition?

CABRERA: Évery year my mom cooks a Colombian breakfast because that's what grandma used to do when we were kids. My dad's from Columbia. Growing up my mom learned all the recipes, so she cooks Arepas every year now that my grandma has passed. I can't wait for that breakfast! When I smell it that's when I get out of bed. (laughs)



Core Performance: Why Are My Joints Making Noise?

We've all been through it... wake up in the morning, stretch your arms and something, somewhere cracks. Sometimes it feels like you've relieved tension and other times it just hurts! So, should you be worried about this noise that makes people think they're falling apart?

Although it can be embarrassing at times, usually snapping joints is not something you should be worried about. But, if you have swelling and pain with the cracking, then there could be something wrong, and you really need to visit your doctor.

Why do your joints make noise? You'll notice as you get older that your joints start making more noise, but why? The answer is simple. Imagine a door, when it creaks it needs oiling, right? Our joints are similar in a way. We don't have oil between our joints; we have cartilage. As you get older, the cartilage between your joints starts to wear away. Don't fret, it's normal, and you should expect it. It's completely normal for your joints to pop, crack and creak. It's not anything to be concerned about unless you're in pain.

What is the sound? There's more than one reason for your cracking joints. Let's say you're working out, and you're doing the same exercise over and over again, like push-ups or squats. You could notice that one of your joints is making a snapping noise every time you bend your elbows or your knees. The noise is telling you that one of your muscles is tight, which is causing friction around your bone, or it could be one of your tendons rubbing over your bone. If and when you notice it, you need to stretch your body out to get your muscles to relax. 



check it out if they're going to rent with us.

**eNOW:** You boast one of the largest selections of goggles and helmets in the area. Can you give us a rundown of some of the brands you carry and what sets them apart?


