This basket raffle, organized by Erin Cornelius, Brooke Szpaicher and Mila Clauss, was a great addition and will certainly be back next year.

This year's event could not have happened without our host, the Ellicottville Brewing Company, who again went above and beyond to support Bob's night! They are so generous to the Foundation, this year donating the proceeds from special beer and wine sales to the fund. Brew Master Dan Minner's tribute to Bob, "McCarthy Irish Red", was enjoyed to the delight of many in the crowd. Laura Kohler and Mike Rogers' expertise made staging this party easy and fun for the committee, while EBC's spacious new Beer Hall and their friendly staff were the perfect hosts.

It was obvious that many of our benefactors opened up their hearts and wallets to support The Bob McCarthy Foundation's Santa's Workshop & the Sheriff Santa program. The auction by far surpassed all prior ones, setting a new record of \$15,000! A very special donation of \$1,500 was made during the event by Trey Clauss on behalf of Sean Lowes and The City Garage. This was a result of their Film fundraiser held at The Depot this fall. Additionally, a number of generous people chose to donate directly to the Foundation. As these donations normally continue through the end of the year, we anticipate surpassing previous years' highs by over 25%. In the current economy, that is truly amazing.

### 40 YEARS OF BEAUTIFICATION

The Alley Katz Continue to 'Dress Up' Ellicottville, Even During the Winter Months

Ellicottville, the quaint ski town known for its hallmark views, doesn't just wake up looking this good. It takes so many here that work around the clock to achieve the aesthetic and experience we want visitors to take in. At the heart of this is a team of ladies who call themselves the Alley Katz, bringing life with their flower displays to the village since 1979.

It all started when a group of women took to cleaning the alleyway between the 1887 Building & The Banq Cocktail Lounge (formerly M&T Bank). In this initial clean-up they got rid of an entire dump truck of debris and garbage. "Someone commented on their resemblance to a bunch of cats digging through the trash, and the 'Alley Katz' were born," quoted from Lynn Timon's 1998 news article.

Each year 44 barrels of flowers and 50 hanging baskets are put out on display, along with hand planting the creek beds and flower beds by Katy's Cafe, the Historical Museum, clock tower, War Memorial and of course decorating the iconic gazebo. Over the years the gazebo has provided the backdrop for weddings, prom photos, family portraits and

The Alley Katz just changed over to winter decor from the fall setting that has become a must-see when 'leaf peeping'. The winter tree will be on display until Mardi Gras weekend when the AKs will be prepping for the new 2023 spring display. This will be the FIRST year with a spring display. To me this signifies that Ellicottville is officially a four-season destination.

In years past, the ladies would utilize a greenhouse to grow all of the baskets personally. Now, "Waterman's Nursery in Springville designs our beautiful baskets," Deb Yantomasi, leader of this awesome group tells me. "A small portion of our funding comes from the town and village, but we rely mainly on donations." The ladies meet every Tuesday Spring to Fall to plan, plant and maintain, and afterwards they head to Ellicottville Coffee Co. for their on-the-house cup-o-joe. "A big shout out to the DPW and Dave Dixon who water all the plants 5-6x per week to keep them looking good all summer long!"

This is a small group of 15-25 ladies whose average age hits in the 60s, which lead us into the next part of our conversation. "We need more volunteers who are going to learn about this great group and help continue it into the future," Deb proclaimed. She wants to be able to take the Alley Katz to the next level, providing things such as gardening classes, a community garden and more.

They plan to expand their gardening expertise, in 2023, to the Episcopal Church that makes up 1/4 of our historic four corners. The event will be held in the spring where Yantomasi hopes volunteers will show up with flowers from their own gardens or flowers of their choosing to plant. The Alley Katz will, of course, be on-hand, helping to design a beautiful garden made up of pieces of our community.



### A BRIGHTER CHRISTMAS FOR ALL

Gift Tree Program Sponsors Ninety-Six Area Families



OLEAN - Ninety-six area families will have a brighter Christmas this year thanks to Interfaith Caregivers Gift Tree program and support from the Carroll and Dolores Anstaett Gift Tree Fund at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation. The Carroll and Dolores Anstaett Gift Tree Fund was established by the late Carroll Anstett and his wife Dolores in 2004 to provide annual support to the Gift Tree program, which assists the less fortunate in the community by providing holiday gifts at Christmas.

Each year families that are served by the program are listed for "adoption" in the Olean Times Herald. Community members then shop for and purchase gifts for their adopted family. This year 92 families were listed for adoption. Four needy families were added later. This year's grant of \$1,803.69 allowed for the purchase of Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce (GOACC) gift certificates, which were then provided to the Gift Tree families most in need.

"These certificates were added to the gifts for the families most in need, largest families, and those with extreme circumstances," said Julie Hall, Interfaith Caregivers' executive director. "The flexibility of the [GOACC] certificates are so helpful for these families. They can be used for food, gas, or any other needs."

According to Julie Hall, the Gift Tree program also worked to lead collaboration among groups that provide holiday season assistance (such as the Salvation Army, the Santa Sheriff program and more) to increase the efficiency of each program. That work came at a critical time, as financial hardship has increased the demand for such programs. "Increased collaboration among gift-giving programs has definitely helped all of us to serve the most families possible in Cattaraugus County," she said. "By eliminating families

#### Cattaraugus County Sheriff's Dept. Purchases Toys for Local Children


OLEAN - Once again this year, school resource officers from the Cattaraugus County Sheriff's Department stuffed their shopping carts full of toys and clothes to bring Christmas to area families in need. This year the Santa Sheriff program served 17 families, representing a total of 54 area children. A \$4,819 grant from the Santa Sheriff Fund at the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation, established by the Cattaraugus County Sheriff's Department to support the administration of the program in 2012, provided funds to purchase gifts for the families.

For the last few years, the program has received most of its referrals through area school districts to school resource officers (SROs), according to Sgt. Tonya Dry. This allows the program to better serve the children who benefit, as the SROs are familiar with which children are most in need and have interactions with those children in school throughout the year. Sgt. Dry, who has served in a leadership role with the program since 2019, works closely with other area gift-giving programs and also takes referrals for additional families to ensure that needy area families are assisted during the holidays. Since 2012, the Santa Sheriff Fund at CRCF has made possible over \$80,650 in grants in support of the fund.

"The Santa Sheriff Program has been a steady source of support for area families in need for some time now," said CRCF Executive Director Karen Niemic Buchheit. "It touches your heart when you see the joy on the faces of sheriff deputies shopping for the perfect coat or the perfect toy for a child. It is even more meaningful knowing that joy is only greater when a child sees that on Christmas morning." 

### THE LITTLE BLUE RANCH

Great Valley Home Featured in Country Rustic Magazine's Winter Issue

Core Performance: Hydration During the Winter

I could write countless articles on why hydration/water is so important to our bodies. It helps flush out waste, regulates body temperature and aids your brain function. If you feel thirsty, you are already dehydrated. Other signs that you are dehydrated are feeling tired, dizzy or light-headed. Or you may experience a dry mouth, lips and tongue. Your urine may be a dark yellow with a strong odor. And, in extreme cases you may experience a rapid heartbeat/breathing, faint and have dry skin and sunken eyes.

Typically, we know to hydrate when we exercise and when it's hot outside. But did you know that hydration is just as important during the winter months? This is partly because the level of humidity in the air during the winter months tends to be much lower, resulting in much drier air as compared to other times of the year. In addition, the air in our homes is also drier due to home heating. These differences in air quality both inside and outside can increase our chances of becoming dehydrated.

It is important that we stay hydrated in winter because doing so helps keep our body temperature at a constant and normal level. When there isn't enough fluid in the body, this can cause the core temperature to drop to dangerous levels. Hypothermia can set in quicker if the body is dehydrated. Staying hydrated also helps our immune system fight off colds and the flu, which are more common in the winter.

Staying hydrated with water is the cheapest and best way to prevent dehydration. However, if you find yourself experiencing some of the many side effects of dehydration, you more than likely should add electrolytes to your hydration routine. But, have you ever wondered what are electrolytes? Electrolytes are a group of minerals including sodium, potassium, magnesium, chloride and zinc. Electrolytes are absolutely essential for the efficient functioning of our bodies. Without them we lose focus, feel tired, you may get muscle cramps, your organs won't be working their best and you become dehydrated. We need to get electrolytes in our daily diet, and we do for the most part. Adding a daily electrolytes supplement can take the guess work out of this.

However, if you're just drinking water and eating a balanced diet, it is very likely that you are getting enough. Adding electrolytes should only be considered if you are sweating more than usual or experiencing symptoms related to dehydration.



The bottom line: dehydration can sneak up on you quickly, especially during the colder months. Always keep a water bottle with you even during something as uneventful as driving. If you have any signs of dehydration during the winter months, it is important to seek medical attention immediately.
