



### **BLESSINGS IN A BAG**

Ellicottville students assemble care packages to donate to the Genesis House

Now that the end of 2020 is nearly here, "genesis" - a new beginning - takes on an entirely different meaning, for we are all figuring out a new way of living, communicating, and even learning amidst a global pandemic. For Kristin Rocco, a special education teacher at Ellicottville Central School, COVID-19 has been the catalyst for a brand new learning experience for her students, one that also gives others in the greater community a fresh start.

"When COVID hit, it threw a wrench in many of our life skills activities that we do," Rocco explained. "I was struggling to figure out how we can provide authentic work and vocational skills for my students in a safe way while following all of the new COVID-19 mandates."

Rocco, who teaches the only self-contained middle/high school classroom in the district, incorporates service learning each year with her students. During a typical school year, her students work in the cafeteria in various capacities and run a coffee cart, in addition to their academic work. Last year's community service project involved collecting, organizing, and shelving donations for the Great Valley food pantry.

"Due to the restrictive nature of COVID-19, we can't do any of these things," Rocco explained. "It's hard for my students to understand why we're not doing the things that we usually did, but we talk about the fact that there are lots of precautions about COVID-19."

Although most of the district follows a hybrid learning model, Rocco's students come to school every day, and she was determined to find a meaningful service-learning project for them to participate in this year. Rocco said this year, she and her students have asked district faculty and staff for donations of hygiene products, such as shampoo, soap, and personal care items for "Blessing Bags" to donate to the Genesis House of Olean. The Genesis House provides safe, temporary housing for children, single adults and families, along with nutritious meals, opportunities for medical care, and connections to outside agencies.

"These bags can easily be handed out to clients to help provide what they need during their stay," Rocco said. "Putting the bags together has helped my students practice a lot of skills, such as sorting, reading labels, and many different executive functioning and vocational skills that we don't always recognize the importance of being practiced." Each bag has a tag that states what students should put inside. "They read them like a menu and fill them with what is needed and check the items off," Rocco added.

So far, Rocco has already dropped off 30 bags to the Genesis House, and she plans to continue the project with her students throughout the school year. "I'm so glad that we were able to do this," she said. "Overall, it's a great opportunity for my students to learn about giving back and talk about those who may be in a position of need this year. I'm really passionate about giving my students hands-on, meaningful activities. This is something that students in my program can carry with them into adulthood."

The response from the Genesis House has been enthusiastic! "The staff there is very thankful," Rocco noted. "I'm sure they've had an influx of need this year, and I'm sure they'll see that continue."

Rocco is accepting donations from the community for the blessing bags. While there are restrictions on visitors coming to the school, Rocco is happy to coordinate drop-offs for donations. Those who are interested in donating personal hygiene items can email her at krocco@ecsny.org.



### SANTA KLAHN'S

A local favorite returns, providing families with 'the perfect tree' experience

Welcome to December. Before the anxiety over completing the gift-list settles in, getting a hold of a Blue Spruce or a Balsam Fir is the first order of business. Fortunately, this holiday season, the infamous Santa Klahn's Christmas Tree Farm is welcoming back residents of Western New York following a two-year absence.

Santa Klahn's has served as the main destination for several generations of tree-getters. Located just a few minutes' drive from downtown Ellicottville, the farm stopped the process of planting Christmas trees a couple years back. Owners Reggie and Mary Klahn had decided to take a small break from the business, as their son and co-owner Jesse returned back to New York.

"We were certain we weren't going to keep planting, but Jesse came back and wanted to start planting again," Mary said. "We are glad to be back now and it feels great to open!"

After missing some of the past Christmas seasons, Santa Klahn's re-opened its doors to families and local residents on November 27th. Lines of parked cars formed outside the farm, as hundreds of trees began to be cut from their roots in preparation for the holiday. Upon its return to business, the farm is also offering a selection of handmade fir wreaths created by Jesse's wife, Morgan.

Santa Klahn's has played a main role in the community's holiday festivities for years on end. While its location and variety of Christmas trees attract several visitors to its farm, the magic of how it brings families together is perhaps its biggest draw. Parents, children and loved ones can enjoy the activity of cutting a Fraser Fir or Blue Spruce together, which is a lot more special than buying a tree off the shelf and grabbing the receipt on your way out. The Klahn family has created a space where finding and cutting the perfect Christmas tree is just as fun as decorating it.

As the trees at Santa Klahn's continue to be cut and driven off by families alike, the Klahn family is preparing for a busy December of visitors.

"We do this because we get to see everyone be happy; it's the most fun part about it," Mary said. "We are planning to expand on the fun by having Christmas 'cut-outs' and more activities in future seasons!"

The Santa Klahn farm houses a great variety of Christmas trees, and the reward for driving away with the best one is having the perfect living room centerpiece. Fir and Blue Spruce trees are arguably two of the most popular choices among tree-shoppers this season. While they both share characteristics, Blue Spruce trees offer a silver color tone, which commonly makes for a great addition to a winter-inspired living space. Both types can be found at Santa Klahn's, with Blue Spruce trees priced at \$5 per foot, and Fir trees priced at \$7 per foot. Morgan's original fir wreaths can also be purchased for \$20 each.

Despite the safety restrictions placed on some of this season's festivities, the Santa Klahn family hopes that the community it serves continues to enjoy Christmas.

"We want families to enjoy themselves here," Mary said. "We are hoping everyone celebrates the holiday safely and has fun doing so."

### 25 DAYS OF MINIS

Local painter Sean Huntington one of 45 artists participating in holiday gallery

The Christmas season is here, and so is your opportunity to find a special and unique gift for the art lover in your life. Welcome to "25 Days of Minis", an online gallery of affordable artworks from 45 talented artists. We reached out to one of this year's participants, Sean Huntington, to hear more about the initiative and what to expect.

"It started as a few friends who had met on the art festival circuit, where every year before Christmas we would share each other's works on facebook," says Huntington. "More recently it has been refined into this beautifully presented online show. 45 of us artists this year! It's great for your artistic development, it's a great affordable way to get new collectors interested, and it's very fun. Each artist releases a small original piece every day, and it's first come, first serve - which can be really exciting! Think advent calendar with fun art instead of disgustingly cheap chocolate. All the artwork in the show is under \$500, under 12x12 inches, and original."

"25 Days of Minis" is a great place to look for the perfect gift for that special someone, the eclectic folks, or to just support a small business and add some color and unique flavor to your own walls. In Sean's words, "Art enriches and enhances your life. Original art in your home makes such a statement, and it's a way to show your individuality."

Huntington's work is recognizable and well matched in the Ellicottville aesthetic. He specializes in beautiful woodland scenes featuring local evergreens, hardwoods and aspen in striking scenes that allude to the season – Monochromatic blues to evoke winter scenes, or bright Yellows and reds of our stunning fall flora. "My work is a mixture of my obsessive interest in nature and my inborn need to create art. The texture of lichens on tree bark, the way branches curve and mingle among one another, the repetition of line in a grove of aspen or spruce; these are some of the things that fill my mind and come out in my paintings. The woods are home to me, and in this sense my work is autobiographical."

Working in traditional and gouache watercolors, often on large canvases, he employs techniques to add great contrast to individual trees in his paintings. The brightly colored negative trees' shapes are first painted on as a latex resin in order to mask the area, similar to the batik cloth dying technique. After creating several layers of trees with watercolor and latex, the latex is peeled off to reveal the lighter colors beneath. His paintings are finished with a protective coating, and is framed in either copper or aluminum, harmonizing with the colors of the piece, yet giving it a bit of a modern and industrial feel that clashes with the natural content.

Raised in Derrick City, Pennsylvania near the Allegheny National Forest, Sean is inspired by what he grew up observing and appreciating. Being surrounded by woodlands in those early years gave Sean an intense interest in the natural world. When asked why he focuses on natural woodland scenes he replied, "My childhood was spent in the middle of acres of woodland under an 85-foot white oak tree. I spent every day in the woods and developed a deep love of biology that comes out in my work." He added in good humor, "Plus it was a small town, all the women that would have posed nude for me were related."

Nowadays when he's not traveling to one of the many art shows he presents at around the country, you can find him painting at his private studio in Olean.

To see one of his stunning larger pieces, all one has to do is go up to the 2nd floor of Holiday Valley's Main chalet. A brightly colored group of 3 canvases painted together of a grove of spruce in strong red, orange and yellows, it really pops and shows how his work could be a warm welcome to any home or business.







### Cooler Weather Workouts

With winter on our doorstep, daylight savings time turning day to night by 4:30pm, and the continuing effects of Covid-19, staying motivated to do anything more than curl up on the couch can be a real struggle. 
