Publisher's PICK EDNA'S AT THE TAMARACK CLUB

New Restaurant Honoring Local Legend Takes Over John Harvard's

When one door closes, another one opens, and in this case, quite literally. John Harvard's in the Tamarack Club at Holiday Valley Resort is no more, but that left the space for something new to begin. Edna's at the Tamarack Club (named after the local legend, Edna Northrup) is now open for business.

ellicottvilleNOW spoke with Holiday Valley Marketing Director, Dash Hegeman, about the newest edition to the Valley's dining scene. How did it come to be? What is it serving? Dash was more than ready to share the information with us.

eNOW: What sparked the change from John Harvard's to Edna's? And how did Edna's become the pick of choice?

HEGEMAN: The space was scheduled for some aesthetic and functional renovations. The goal was to make better use of the layout while also freshening up the look of the restaurant. Since that work was happening anyway, it brought about a discussion on the John Harvard's brand. Obviously the name had been part of Holiday Valley ever since the Tamarack Club opened and it had served Holiday Valley well during that time. That said, there was an opportunity to do something new with the dining experience brand and so some very thoughtful discussions were had about changing the name of the restaurant. Ultimately, the decision was made to not only change the name but to pay tribute to one of the founding members of Holiday Valley, Edna Northrup.

eNOW: What range of dishes will be served? Is this a more casual menu or is it going to be more upscale dishes?

HEGEMAN: There will be a nice mix. The goal is to incorporate a lot of local flavors and seasonal ingredients. So you'll see things like beef on weck, eggrolls and stone-fired Margherita pizza. But you'll also have more advanced dishes like a pesto-encrusted Australian seabass with a sweet tomato risotto. Overall, the menu should appeal to a variety of appetites and palates.

eNOW: What type of beverages will be offered? Will there be a full bar or wine/beer only?

HEGEMAN: Edna's at the Tamarack Club offers a full bar with 12 beers on tap, an assortment of wine options and some fantastic specialty cocktails.

eNOW: What is the main goal for the establishment? Will it be a place for strictly dining or will it also boast an entertainment venue as well?

HEGEMAN: The main purpose of the space is for dining. The bar still has TVs at it for people who want to stop by and watch a game while they have a drink.

eNOW: What else is in the future for Holiday Valley's eateries?

HEGEMAN: There is a new Head Chef on staff, Andrew Culver, who is very excited





about elevating the dining experience here at the resort. He was very involved in the new Edna's menu and has also been working diligently to make adjustments throughout the rest of the resort that will benefit our guests.

eNOW: Anything else you would like to add?

HEGEMAN: Edna's at the Tamarack Club is now more than just a place to enjoy a great meal and enjoy a fantastic view of the slopes while you eat. It's a part of Holiday Valley history. Edna Northrup was an amazing woman whose influence helped shape the foundation of Holiday Valley. Having the opportunity to highlight her story more and show guests of Holiday Valley what a pioneer she was when it came to skiing in Ellicottville is very exciting. We're talking about a woman who hiked the Appalachian Trail in its entirety, climbed Mt. Rainier at the youthful age of 68 and then at the age of 84 hiked to the Base Camp of Mt. Everest! Her energy and enthusiasm for being in the great outdoors was so inspiring and her passion for Holiday Valley was contagious. Personally, I'm thrilled with the rebrand. The artist who created the logo did a fantastic job of incorporating Edna's signature Tyrolean hat into the design. Jane Eshbaugh gave him a lot of insight into who Edna was and what she liked. He took those details and did a really nice job of creating a logo that is aesthetically clean and works well in the global setting of Holiday Valley.

The new restaurant concept is a fitting tribute to a woman who helped shape the resort into what it is today. Edna's at the Tamarack Club celebrates the long tradition of joyous camaraderie and warm friendships that arise out of sharing a love for skiing and the outdoors. This little glimpse has been absolutely mouth-watering, so head up to the Tamarack Club, open daily during the winter from 11:00am-11:00pm, for an amazing flavor adventure soon.





Core Performance: How to Avoid Holiday Weight Gain

The holidays can be a real challenging time of year for your waistline and fitness routines. You may wonder, "Is it possible to celebrate the season without packing on extra pounds?" The answer is YES!

Being health-conscious doesn't necessarily mean that you can't enjoy the holiday season and have a little bit of what you fancy. It simply means that you should continue to be vigilant and be prepared for the festivities.

There are many ways in which you can help to strike a balance between maintaining a healthy diet and joining in with the fun and festivities. For instance, start your day off with exercise. Exercising in the morning can help ensure better behavior all day long, according to a study published in the journal *Medicine and Science in Sports and Exercise*. Using brain scans, researchers found that when women worked out in the AM, they not only moved more the rest of the day, but they also responded less to pictures of tempting food compared with the days they didn't do a morning workout. The upshot: fewer cravings for high-fat fare.

Also, avoid banking calories. Cutting back all day so you can indulge at an event that night only sets you up for a pig-out. Why? You're freaking starving! "It's easy to get out of control when you're faced with high-calorie choices," says Tanya Zuckerbrot, RD, author of *The Miracle Carb Diet*. Be sure to eat healthy throughout the day, aiming for lots of fruits and veggies, whole grains, and lean protein.

Choose your alcoholic beverages carefully. Trust me when I tell you this IS a struggle, but it can be the difference between a handful of calories and a few hundred calories, which adds up significantly when multiplied by half a dozen cocktails (or a dozen?) throughout the evening. I have found if you alternate a glass of water and a drink, you can save yourself a lot of extra calories.

It's really tempting to throw on baggy sweaters and loose pants this time of year, but wearing form-fitting clothes can actually make you pay more attention to what you eat and whether your body changes from week to week. If the pants you put on last week feel a little tight this week, don't throw them in the back of your closet! Wear them anyway, and just pay more attention to your other healthy habits.

And lastly, be awesome the next day! Don't let one night ruin your next day. Just because



the holidays are a time to celebrate doesn't mean every day needs to be a celebration. Set aside one or two nights a week to really enjoy yourself, but stick to your usual routine the rest of the time.
