Ellicottville Central School Senior Logan Fredrickson presented with championship banner





She is fast. She has her own banner hanging inside Ellicottville Central School's gymnasium to prove it.





Annual Penguin Paddle fundraiser goes virtual

Whether you're on the slopes, on the sand, or even on a backyard slide, there are all kinds of ways to participate in this year's Annual Penguin Paddle to benefit the Lounsbury Adaptive Ski Program (LASP)! That's right: This year's Penguin Paddle has gone virtual, and although it will be a bit different than the annual belly slide down Holiday Valley's Yodeler slope, it promises to be just as much fun!

In 1987, Bill Lounsbury, a ski patroller at Holiday Valley, lost his leg to cancer, but continued to ski using hand-held skis, inspiring all who knew him. When he passed away, many donations were made in his honor, and the money was used to start the LASP, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and chapter of Disabled Sports USA. The program's mission is to "deEMPHA-SIZE the disABILITY" and serves individuals between the ages of 5 and 75 of all physical and mental abilities, ranging from paralysis, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis to autism, Down's syndrome, cerebral palsy and spina bifida. The program consists of volunteer instructors who work with students in affordable, private lessons at Holiday Valley.

The annual Penguin Paddle is the program's biggest fundraiser each year and normally involves participants purchasing a garbage bag and wearing it as they stomach-slide down Yodeler. The annual event also includes a much-anticipated silent auction, raffle and food tent. Bill's daughter, Kara Lounsbury Elias is coordinating the online portion of the event, which is completely run by volunteers each year. "We all decided that with the local restrictions and Holiday Valley's guidelines that the Penguin Paddle had to become a virtual event this year," she explained. "Safety is important for the instructors and everyone who participates in the general program."

There are several significant differences between the virtual event and the in-person event that actually allow for more participation over a longer period of time. Elias explained, "One benefit of having the event virtually is that we have the opportunity to reach a much broader audience."

No matter where participants are located, they can register online at www.lounsburyadaptive.org and complete their belly slide anywhere they choose from now until Feb. 27th!

Elias added, "The idea is that people will do their own penguin slide at home or at a park and can be creative! It doesn't even have to be on snow! They could slide down a slide or on sand - wherever they happen to be!"

Once someone has completed their slide, he or she can post a photo on social media with the Penguin Paddle hashtags #LASP #penguinpaddle #penguinchallenge and tag @LounsburyAdaptive on Facebook or Instagram. Then, make a Penguin Paddle donation online or by mailing a check to Lounsbury Adaptive Ski Program, Holiday Valley Resort, PO Box 370, Ellicottville, NY 14731. The last step is to tag three others to challenge them to participate in the Penguin Paddle.

"We're trying to maintain the fun and interactive component, even though we can't be together," Elias said. "It's always been in person, rain or shine, and sometimes the weather is supportive and sometimes it's not. This year, it doesn't matter what the weather is!"

This year's raffle and silent auction will take place exclusively online (lounsburyadaptive. org), and the website is being updated daily as prize donations come in. Raffle tickets are available online and in-person at Holiday Valley or from any LASP instructor. The raffle ticket drawing will be held on Saturday, Feb. 27th at 3:00pm. Winners need not be present to win. Tickets are one for \$5 or five for \$20; prizes include a Holiday Valley Season's Pass, \$100 Gift Card to Lowe's Home Improvement, and High-Performance Skis from The City Garage Ski Shop, Ellicottville.

A Ski Town Staple: Checking in on Ellicottvile's local shops, upcoming events, promotions and giveaways

What makes a great ski town? A resort, of course. An array of restaurants and bars also helps. But one of the key - and sometimes overlooked - components of a thriving ski town are the ski and snowboard shops. Think about it. Not only do these shops provide locals and tourists alike things like skis, snowboards, boots, rental equipment, apparel and other on-hill necessities, but they also help fuel the stoke of just about every guest who enters through their doors. Shop staff provide valuable advice to people that is based on years and years of passion for skiing and snowboarding.

Ellicottville's funkiest ski shop has been operating since 1999, when Sean Lowes, a former ski rep, decided to stop his life on the road and open a ski shop with a unique personality. Lowes' focus was to cater to the free-ride, mogul ski scene as well as the nordic and tele skier. Today, the shop is a go-to option for people seeking top-of-the-line ski and outdoor equipment.

Trey Clauss, long-time manager at the Garage, said that despite the ongoing reality of trying to operate during a pandemic, things at the shop have been going very well.

"I'd say that our day-to-day traffic has remained about the same, just with the difference that people are generally a bit more to the point with their shopping experience," said Clauss. "[Guests are] coming into the store with a specific list of items they are looking for, which has made the shopping/selling go quicker and more matter-of-fact."

Given the fact that opportunities to do things in groups are limited this year, it certainly seems like people are recognizing that being outdoors gives them a great outlet from the realities of Zoom meetings, online schooling and all the other oddities that are taking place right now. In fact, Clauss believes that there is even a silver lining to all of this when it comes to the ski industry.

"We have been noticing that there has been a bit of a reset for a lot of skiers that haven't purchased in more than 5 years," Clauss stated. "Skiers that haven't moved into a wider ski or lighter boots have been realizing what they have been missing out on! As far as overall numbers for the season, personally I think it will be a slight uptick from years past."

In terms of what the rest of the season has in store, The City Garage's annual Telestock collaboration with Holiday Valley is still on the books for Friday, February 26th. Pop into the shop for details.

A family owned business since 2000, MSG has evolved into a premier destination for people of all ages and skiing/snowboarding abilities. Additionally, MSG's ski racing prowess is known throughout the region, which has allowed racers from near and afar to seek out the expertise of the MSG staff in order to take their equipment and tuning to the next level.

According to Kimberly Reading, who co-owns MSG alongside her husband and local racing aficionado, Miguel Azcarate, the shop opened for the season with many of the same questions and concerns that all small business owners had when it came to operating during a national pandemic - especially one that was going to force Canadians to stay out of the States.

"We were anticipating a new normal," Reading said, "but knew it would be far from any 'normal' that we have experienced before."

But the MSG crew was prepared. They had spent the summer paying close attention to the outdoor industry in general, and what they saw had them feeling optimistic. People were looking for ways to safely get out of the house and to recreate. Reading and Azcarate knew that Ellicottville already had something special about it - an outdoor draw that people from all over naturally gravitated to.

"People are finding ways to get outdoors for fitness and relaxation even though coronavirus limits their options," said Reading. "Because of this, sales have been very strong. We saw a significant uptick in our seasonal rental program, which is the most affordable way for families to get into the sport. We have seen lots of people learning how to ski for the first time, along with people reprioritizing and returning to the sport after many years away as a way of staying busy and maintaining a little sense of normalcy."

A little sense of normalcy is something we are all seeking right now, and the crew at Mud Sweat n' Gears believes that hitting the slopes can provide that for people. They've seen a pent-up demand for skiing and snowboarding and have been amazed at the number of people that have come through their doors this winter.

CRCF ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

Stitt and Brundage named to Board; Skip Wilday to serve as President



CA BOCES launches new program to help students explore career options



OLEAN, NY - Cattaraugus-Allegany BOCES (CA BOCES) has announced a new program, with accompanying website, to help middle and high school students explore career options in technical fields – CTE Career Exploration.

The new program and website provide a comprehensive look at career exploration and, with support of their home school guidance counselor, will allow students to take an interest assessment, explore career clusters, and view a variety of videos pertaining to program options at CA BOCES CTE Centers in Belmont, Ellicottville, and Olean.

CA BOCES Career and Technical Education (CTE) Outreach Coordinator, Thomasine Graf, said that the program idea was a direct result of closures due to COVID-19. "In a normal year, students are able to visit our centers, speak to our instructors, and get a good feel for what each of our CTE programs looks like - COVID-19 changed that," she said. "CTE Career Exploration allows students to explore career options and confidently decide if they want to embark on a CTE education as a part of their high school experience without physically entering a center or classroom."

In addition to the career exploration assessments, students will also have access to a professional discussion board with local professionals in the career fields associated with their preferences. "We are so fortunate to have both CTE alumni and volunteers from local community organizations, in a variety of fields, ready and willing to speak with our youth," Graf said. "These conversations will be invaluable to students as they decide the potential paths they may want to pursue. We are grateful to both Dream It Do It and the Greater Olean Area Chamber of Commerce for collaborating with us in gathering our local professionals for this venture."

Launched last week for sophomores at local school districts, participation will begin in the near future. When in-person tours resume, the website will be used for a virtual experience for students unable to visit the CTE centers.

Even though she has won the State Championships before, she says the shock of winning doesn't change. Hands trembling as the excitement for another win rushes through her body is how she described the feeling. "I didn't know what to do with myself, and a smile could not leave my face!"

Logan suffered a knee injury this past fall which has unfortunately kept her out of the starting gate this season. Unsure if she will continue in competitive skiing while in college, she says that she most definitely will continue to click in for leisure skiing as soon as she can. Competing in Alpine Skiing has brought Logan the opportunity to travel and develop many unforgettable memories with her family and friends.

Last month, Ellicottville Central School surprised Logan with a large banner in honor of her victory in 2020, which can be seen hanging in the school's gymnasium. As she prepares to graduate this June, we wish Logan the best of luck in all her future endeavors.



Following a six-month closure, the Seneca-Iroquois National Museum re-opens its doors to visitors

Just two years ago, the Onöhsagwë:de' Cultural Center opened its doors at 82 W. Hetzel St. in Salamanca and quickly became one of the top destinations in the region. In 2019, the center, which houses the Seneca-Iroquois National Museum, welcomed over 40,000 visitors including local residents, school groups, and tourists from across the United States and Europe. At the start of 2020, the center was on pace for another busy year - that is, until spring when the COVID-19 pandemic forced the museum to close its doors for six months.

"That was a very challenging time," recalled Seneca-Iroquois National Museum Operations Manager Hayden Haynes. "Like everybody else, we had to focus our attention on what we could do online."

This was no easy task, for the museum has a strong reputation for its impressive exhibits, some of which are designed for in-person interactions. The museum begins with a walk through the Creation Story and cultural beliefs of the Seneca Nation, which leads to displays of traditionally crafted items, a walk through an authentic Seneca log cabin, and the story of lacrosse and its role in Seneca culture. Exhibits include the history of the Kinzua Dam, the role of women in Seneca culture, and a variety of artwork, beadwork, carvings and more

Shortly after closing the museum's doors, Haynes and his team got to work creating virtual introductions to the museum to share online at senecamuseum.org. "Last year was quite different without our school groups," Haynes noted. "We did a lot of Zoom meetings with schools instead, and we're still doing that this year. We put a lot of resources online, like videos, a link to a free book on the creation story, and information about our exhibits and archeology. Now that we've reopened, we've had several smaller groups - many homeschoolers - visit us in person."

Although the six-month closure presented many challenges, it also provided the opportunity for Haynes and museum staff to focus on the online store, which continues to play an important role in supporting the museum. Haynes explained, "Our online store opened in the fall of 2019, and back then, we only had a few dozen items, such as our in-house designed apparel and accessories. In 2020, basically we started pouring all of our energy into the online store, and it's been going well!"

Popular items available online and in store include original artwork, carvings, jewelry, pottery, beadwork and paddles from more than 20 Seneca artists. "Lately, our focus has been to highlight more organic foods, holistic medicines, and also promote the Hodinöhsö:ni' crafts," Haynes explained. "Woodwork, including the paddles, are great for stirring soups or syrups. We're also carrying locally roasted white corn and white corn flour from Gakwi:yo:h Farms, and their maple products, too."

Since reopening the museum in October, Haynes and his team have been developing new exhibits and looking forward to the annual festival, planned for June. Haynes said, "We're very happy to be open again and welcoming visitors. Not too many people got to see one of our new exhibits last year - the Snow Snake exhibit - but we're glad to share it now." (Snow Snake is a spear-throwing game played by the Seneca to keep their hunting skills sharp.)

The museum is open Monday through Friday from 10:00am-4:00pm. Due to reduced staffing, the museum doors are locked, so visitors are asked to call the posted phone numbers in order to gain entry. Temperatures are taken at the door, and all visitors are asked to complete the contact tracing sign-in sheet. Masks are required for the duration of the visit and safe social distancing should be practiced. Haynes encourages groups of five or more to call the museum in advance so that visits can be staggered, if necessary. To learn more about the SINM, call 716-945-1760 or visit senecamuseum.org.

Core Performance: How long should your workout last?

Just the other day, one of my clients asked me what I thought about the 7-minute workout. My knee jerk reaction was to talk about the merits of an effective and efficient workout since I never give much credence into too-good-to-be-true claims. However, it was The New York Times that was giving this workout a lot of buzz. Then it was Forbes writing about the workout, and then that buzz spread to Good Morning America. The 7-minute workout is real, and it works ... at least that is what mainstream media would like you to believe.

To be fair, the 7-minute workout has some very valid exercise science behind it and looks like a great way for many beginners/folks struggling to carve out time and motivation to get an efficient, full-body workout. It consists of 12 exercises such as jumping jacks, wall-sits, push-ups, dips, lunges and planks (just to name a few) that are to be completed in 30 seconds with 10 seconds to rest in between each exercise.

It's not this workout trend that I have an issue with, however, I read plenty of pros and cons about the 7-minute workout. What I take issue with is setting unrealistic expectations that trick people into believing a "minimum effective dose" can lead to maximum results. This phenomenon has plagued the fitness industry and fitness experts alike. There is no denying that exercise - in any dose - is good for your body. In fact, I have suggested that especially during these past several stressful months that carving out a routine of less than 30 minutes can still afford you many health benefits. But, do not confuse the part from the whole ... IF, it only took 7 minutes to get into great shape, the struggle to lose fat would be less of an issue and our obesity index would not be over 40%.

This brings me to another often asked question: What is the ideal amount of time to work out?

My answer: There is no such thing as an "ideal" amount of time that everyone's workout should take. There are too many factors at play that can change things significantly from each person's individual needs, experience level and goals to factors that we aren't even in control of. What you should be more concerned with is the integrity of the workout you are completing. It should be designed intelligently rather that filled with unnecessary fluff that will only be detrimental to forward progress. Also, do not waste time between sets with banter and social media posts, and at the same time do not rush through your workout just to get it done.

DON'T FIND TIME TO EXERCISE, TIME TO EXERCISE.

If you look hard enough, you will find research that proves or disproves time frames for workouts that may satisfy you, but at the end of the day all you need to do is focus on making sure your specific workout is designed properly for your specific needs and goals. As long as you do that, your workout will take exactly as long as they should.


a break and experiencing somewhere new.


